This spring, UHWO will offer a Bachelor of Education degree with concentrations in [Middle-Level \(grades 6-8\)](#) and [Secondary \(grades 6-12\)](#) English and Social Studies. Teacher candidates will participate in more than 200 hours of field-based coursework, culminating in a 15-week, full-time professional student teaching semester. English or Social Studies classroom teachers mentor candidates who will be placed in Central and Leeward O'ahu schools. MA'O Organic Farms' Director of Social Enterprise Kamuela Enos will discuss "The Restoration of Ancestral Abundance" as part of the first UH West O'ahu Sustainability Speaker Series event on Wednesday, Nov. 13 from 11 a.m. - noon in the Campus Center Multipurpose Room C208. Enos will discuss how ancestral practices provide a codex for modern iterations because these practices took place in great isolation, utilized renewable energy and were based on having deep relationships. The event is free and open to the public.

UH West O'ahu will host a [presentation by Distinguished Visiting Scholar from Finland, Dr. Pasi Sahlberg](#) on Nov. 14 at 7 p.m. in the Campus Center Multipurpose Room C208. The internationally renowned education expert will speak on "Finnish Lessons for Hawai'i" and discuss how the story of education reform in Finland might inspire new policy and practice in Hawai'i. Dr. Sahlberg is director of the Centre for International Mobility and Cooperation in Helsinki, Finland, and a visiting professor at Harvard University's Graduate School of Education. His presentation is free and open to the public.
