UHWO awarded \$14.2 million Title III grant

UH West O'ahu was awarded a total of \$14.2 million in Title III grant funding from the U.S. Department of Education for the construction of Native Hawaiian health and wellness facilities and the further development of Native Hawaiian student support services. The University will receive \$10 million for the PIKO Renovation Project - construction of health and wellness and programs that integrate Native Hawaiian values of well-being. \$4.2 million will be granted over a five-year period for the development of a Pueo Scholars Program including comprehensive student support services aimed to increase the retention and graduation rates of the University's Native Hawaiian students. UHWO receives Kamehameha Schools grant for sustainable community food system research and program development

For the second straight year, UH West O'ahu has received a generous grant from Kamehameha Schools' 'Āina-Based Education Department to support research and program development for a proposed academic concentration in Sustainable Community Food Systems (SCFS). To date, Kamehameha Schools has donated nearly \$285,000 to UHWO in support of the SCFS academic program development, UHWO Organic Campus Garden development, and the first comprehensive assessment of the O'ahu food system by Dr. Albie Miles and colleagues. MA'O Organic Farms, the social enterprise organic farm in Wai'anae, is a key community partner and instrumental in the development of the SCFS program. 
