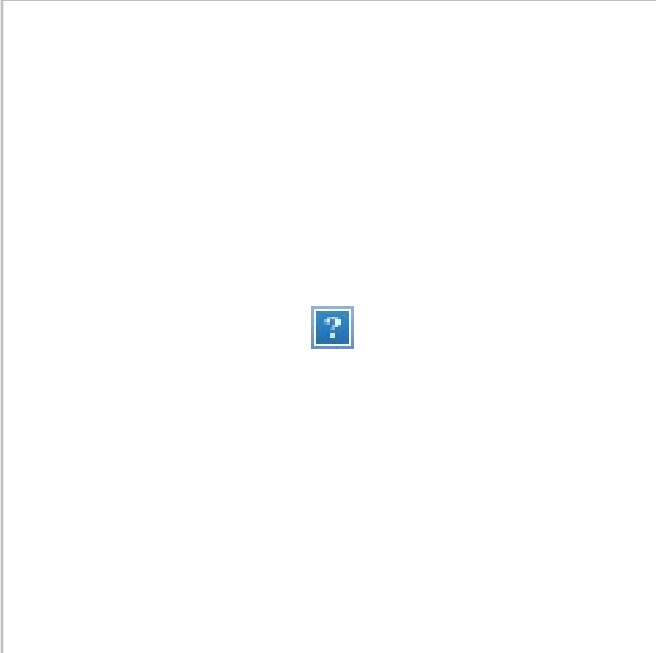

Distance Learning tip of the week

A big part of using Lulima is figuring out how you want to communicate class information to your students. Lulima provides a wide selection of tools that can be used to help you teach your class. The Lessons tool can be helpful if your teaching style prefers having information all in one place. This tool allows you to create sections of text, links, media, assignments or other content on a webpage.

The tool also creates a direct link to that page in your course site tool bar. There are certain tools that can be added directly into your Lesson, while for others, you can add clickable URLs. Lessons also has the ability to create subpages, which can be used to provide a more detailed information about a topic.
