### Distance Learning tip of the week

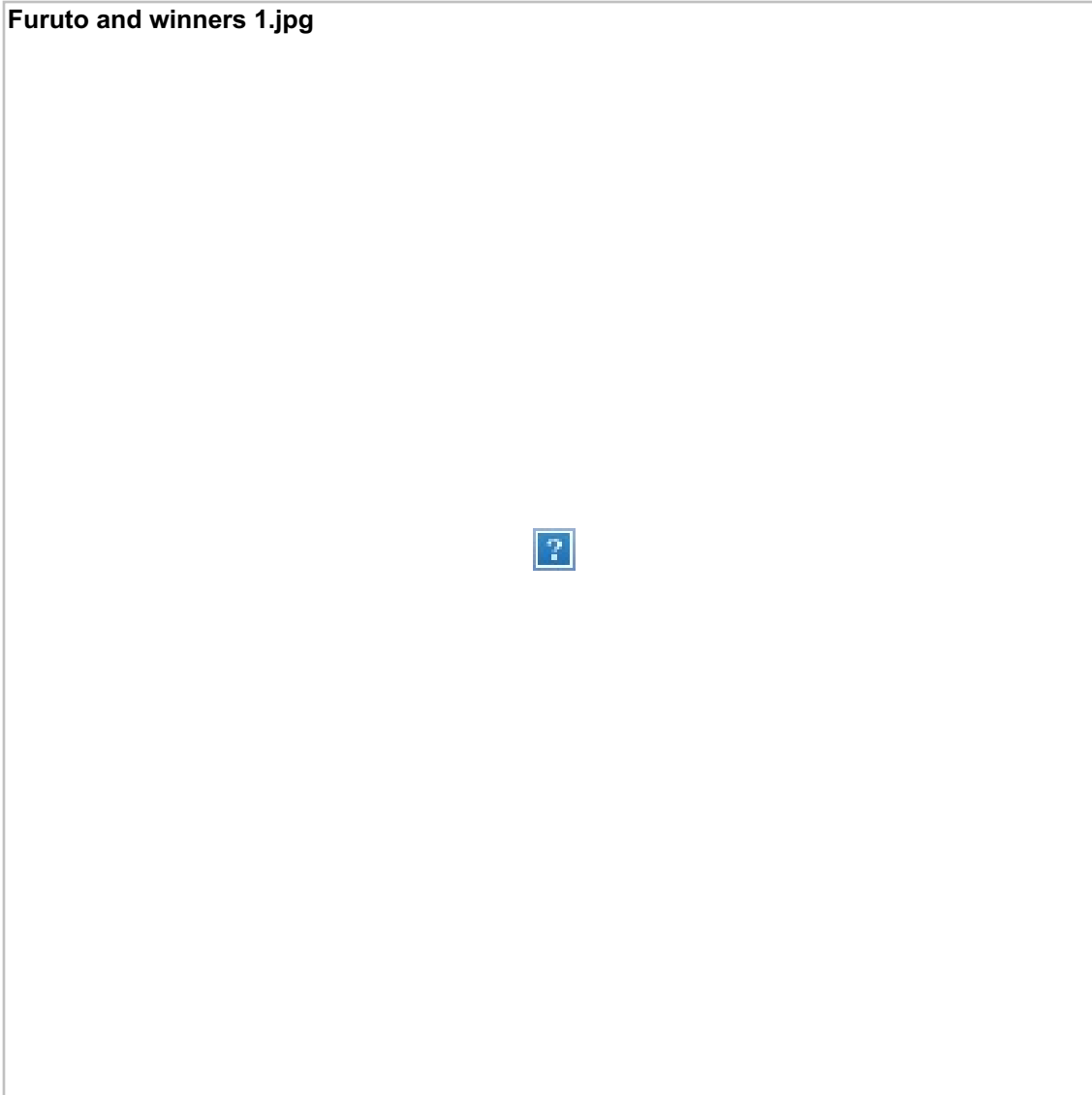
