

UH West O'ahu spring 2018 enrollment up from year previous

UH West O'ahu's enrollment grew by 6.6 percent when Spring 2018 counts are compared to a year earlier. Data kept by <u>UH System's Institution Research & Analysis Office</u> shows there were 2,944 enrolled this spring compared to 2,763 a year earlier as of the 26th instruction day of the semester. Fall semester numbers are traditionally used when citing a campus' enrollment. In Fall 2017 UH West O'ahu had an enrollment of 3,082.


HR on Campus sets Spring 2018 Semester schedule

One Billion Rising Scheduled for Feb. 14





UHWO's event will call attention to dating and domestic violence and the event in the campus courtyard will feature a talk by U.S. Navy Capt. Roy Nafarrete titled "Change the Culture," a Domestic Violence Survivor Panel, and the performance of a hula and One Billion Rising's signature "Break the Chain" dance. The last performance will be videotaped and posted online, as is the case with other sites <u>performing dances at One Billion Rising events</u> across the world. An oli and hula will be performed will be taped and performed in addition to the recording of the "Break the Chain" routine.


