\$50,000 donated to UH West O'ahu International Program



The Center for Labor Education and Research at UH West O'ahu is being recognized with a Preservation Award for its role in the saving of the Isami Enomoto Labor Murals. It will receive the honor during a May 23 awards presentation. The center, along with Docomomo US-Hawai'i, and Bank of Hawai'i, will be recognized for the effort to preserve the murals, which for decades hung in a Bank of Hawai'i branch on Kapahulu Avenue. The award honors the group for restoration, relocation and re-installation of the murals, which now hang outside of the CLEAR offices in the James & Abigail Campbell Library.

Transit project to close portion of Kualakai Parkway sidewalk, shoulder lane



Starting Monday, April 16, a contractor on the rail project will be working on Kualakai Parkway to install a new temporary driveway for the Road B/Temporary Park and Ride project (see attached for work area). The work will result in a sidewalk and shoulder closure from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. No travel lanes will be affected. Pedestrians and bicyclists will be rerouted. The work is expected to take a week or less.
