Multi-Factor Authorization deadline this week; help available through workshops

The deadline for University of Hawai'i employees to set up [Multi-Factor Authorization](#) for their UH Account is this Friday, Nov. 30. Setting up the authentication process is a step in signing up for direct deposit (submitting financial institution and account number information) under a new system being implemented. UH West O'ahu's IT department has planned personalized workshops that begin today and run through Friday. These workshops will help participants set up and learn how to use the University's Multi-Factor Authentication service. Please check our web site westoahu.hawaii.edu/it/mfa for more information.

Human Resources and Information Technology have scheduled workshops to help people enroll in direct deposit through the Hawai'i Information Portal. The State is transitioning to a new payroll system and between Monday, Dec. 3, and Friday, Dec. 14, when all UH employees will need to log on to the Hawai'i Information Portal to enroll in direct deposit. If employees act during this window, the State will not have to issue UH employees paper paychecks starting on Jan. 4, 2019.

Enrollment in direct deposit through Hawai'i Information Portal is required even if the employee is currently signed up for direct deposit. Employees who enroll during the enrollment period will have their direct deposit transfer to HiPay seamlessly. Lā Kū'oko'a to be observed on Wednesday with events at Campus Center Plaza

Lā Kū'oko'a, considered Hawai'i's Independence Day, will be observed on UH West O'ahu's campus on Wednesday, Nov. 28 with events, including a raising of the Hawaiian flag. The events begin at 9 a.m. at Campus Center Plaza and will run through 1 p.m.

Per Scholar Noenoe K. Silva, Lā Kū'oko'a marks the day, Nov. 28, 1843, that the Ali'i Timoteo Ha'alilio succeeded in obtaining the signatures of the authorities of Great Britain and France on a treaty recognizing Hawai'i as a sovereign nation.



Hawai'i Foodbank Thanksgiving mini-drive nets 85 pounds of food, \$325 in donations

Some 85 pounds of canned and boxed goods and rice along with \$325 was raised during a Thanksgiving donation drive for the Hawai'i Foodbank. The drive at the Pueo Fitness Center was initiated outside the regular University of Hawai'i Foodbank drive that takes place annually and was spearheaded by the Sports Fanatics registered independent student organization, and its president, Sharmaine Kahele-Madali. Ryan Perreira, UH West O'ahu Intramural Sports Coordinator, said the campaign was aimed at helping the foodbank at a time of year when it faces its greatest need.



Disney Moana ‘Ōlelo Hawai‘i set to be distributed to schools across Hawai‘i

The ‘ōlelo-Hawai‘i version of Walt Disney Animation Studios’ Moana will be distributed to schools across the state as the culminating act of a year-long production that strives to encourage students to learn the Hawaiian language. The movie stars Auli‘i Cravalho, UH Mānoa student Christopher Kaipulaumakaniolono Baker as Maui, Wai‘anae’s Nicole Scherzinger as Sina, Kelikokauaikekai Hoe as Ali‘i Tui, Kalehuapuake‘ula Kawa‘a as Puna Tala, Kamakakehau Fernandez as Tamatoa, and 24 locally-cast ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i-speaking actors and singers.

The University of Hawai‘i’s Academy for Creative Media System funded and coordinated the re-recording of Moana. Members from across the University of Hawai‘i system collaborated on the project: Dr. Puakea Nogelmeier, professor of Hawaiian Language and Executive Director of Awaiaulu, a nonprofit organization for Hawaiian-language translation training, oversaw a team of Awaiaulu’s translators; Haili‘ōpua Baker, Professor of Hawaiian Theatre at UH-Mānoa’s Theatre department served as acting director; and Ethnomusicologist Aaron J. Salā served as music director. The film was re-recorded at Honolulu Community College’s MELE Studio and engineered by Jon Ross. Collections specialist and producer for UH West O‘ahu’s ‘Ulu‘ulu, Hawai‘i’s moving image archive Heather Giugni and Sharla Hanaoka, Director of Creative Media at UHWO, served as producers of the Hawaiian language-version of Moana, in cooperation with Rick Dempsey, SVP Creative, for Disney Character Voices International.


