



Admissions Team, faculty to visit Community Colleges for UH Transfer Day events

UH West O'ahu Director of Admissions Michelle Adorno Cohen, Admissions Officers Chris Waiamau and Amy Bumatai Fairhart, along with faculty members, will take part in UH Transfer Day events at UH Community Colleges beginning Feb. 5. The events are part of a larger Transfer Awareness Month that helps promote and facilitate students from UH's seven community college campuses continuing their education at UH System's three four-year campuses. 
The UH Board of Regents will meet on the UH West O'ahu campus for its Thursday, Jan. 31, meeting. The 15member board formulates policy and exclusive jurisdiction over the internal structure, management and operation of the university. The BOR is scheduled to vote on a proposal to reduce tuition rates to 2018-2019 levels to address college affordability issues because tuition at UH's four-year institutions has risen above many of its peers, especially for non-residents. The proposal freezes current undergraduate tuition rates through 2022-2023.




UH System's online bachelor's program to be discussed during Feb. 1 meeting

UH System last week announced it was launching an online AA degree program with five-week courses for select degrees. It also announced it plans to offer an online bachelor's degrees with classes in a five-week format at select UH campuses beginning in the Fall 2020. On Friday, Feb. 1, 2019, UH System Associate Vice President, Hae Okimoto, will visit UH West O'ahu from 2 to 3 p.m. in C-225 to discuss the UH Online system initiative. Faculty, lecturers, and staff are invited to learn about the program, offer their views and ask questions.

UH Online is targeted to working adults who have earned some college credits, where cohorts of students complete one class at a time through a 5-week accelerated model of course delivery. Learn more about UH Online, how UH West O'ahu can participate in this initiative, and about professional development opportunities during Summer 2019 to qualify to teach 5-week accelerated courses through UH Online.

Deadline for Distance Education course proposals for Summer or Fall 2019 is Feb. 8

The deadline for Distance Education course proposals (new and renewals) for Summer or Fall 2019 is 11:59 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 8, via Kuali. Check the Master General Education and Distance Education List for all approved DE courses. Courses that are approved for Online (OL) may be offered either 100% Online or Hybrid. However, a course that is approved for a hybrid mode of delivery (HYB), must reapply to be offered 100% Online.



Distance Education Tip of the Week - New Features of Assignments and Tests & Quizzes

The Laulima update to Sakai 12.5 has provided a few new features that might be helpful in your course creation. The Assignments Tool allows instructors to create, distribute, collect, and grade online assignments. Now, instructors can also provide the same feedback to several students by making the selections when grading. In the Tests & Quizzes Tool, users and groups can now be granted exceptions to due dates and durations using the Exceptions to Time Limit and Delivery Date option. This can be helpful for tailoring your course to the needs of your students. If you are interested in learning more about using other online tools, consider attending one of our weekly workshops. 
