






## safeTALK suicide-alert helper training scheduled for Nov. 9, 16


Asphalt paving work (Phase 1) of the UH West Oahu Parking Lot Expansion project began Friday and is scheduled to end today, Nov. 5. The Phase 1 work includes paving encompasses a new compost pad (near Hale Kuahuokalā), speed bumps at the Student Organic Garden (Māla) curve, a new moped pad along the Campus Center Service Road, and the majority of the new parking lot. # Pre-tax payroll deduction for parking and bus passes to be eliminated

As of Jan. 1, 2019 the University of Hawai'i will no longer take out employee parking fees and bus pass payments as a pre-tax deduction. The change was mandated a result of the December 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. UH will continue to use payroll deduction for payment of parking and bus passes, but the amount of payments will be subject to individual payroll taxes.
