Sustainability Summit a success

The University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu hosted a successful first <u>Hawai'i Sustainability in Higher Education Summit</u> on April 11 and 12. The two-day conference, for policy planning and program sharing about sustainability initiatives in the 10 campus University of Hawai'i System and other Hawai'i colleges, was a sold-out event with more than 200 attendees and seven business sponsors. A draft University of Hawai'i Sustainability Policy was developed and is being revised based on participant input from the Summit. Guest speakers included Leith Sharp, chair of the Sustainable Futures Academy and Harvard sustainability Instructor; Kamuela Enos, social enterprise director at MA'O Organic Farms; Matthew St. Clair, sustainability manager at the University of California Office of the President; M.R.C. Greenwood, University of Hawai'i System president; John Morton, UH Vice President for Community Colleges; Gene I. Awakuni, UHWO chancellor; and Jeffrey Acido, UH student regent. More than 40 presenters from across the state also shared operational, academic, student, and community outreach programs and projects from individual campuses.
