




Figure 2- Historical Fall Headcount and Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment





Figure 2b - KAPCC Historical Native Hawaiian Student Fall Headcount and Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment






Figure 5 - Where Hawaiian/Part Hawaiian Students Enroll (Fall Semester)







#### Figure 10 - Institutional Effectiveness Measure Overview Chart by Age Group






Figure 11-CCSSEE Spring Benchmark Scores Community College Survey of Student Engagement(CCSSE)Results
