so inviting him to give him a check of respectability which the reports of the commission on subversive activities charged he was not entitled to wear when they discussed his activities. By inviting this man, we put him in the position to use his appearance here before an official territorial body as a proof of acceptability to offset the Communist identification by the commission on subversive activities.

"This is a matter of principle," Mr. Epstein's appearance here at our invitation implies our toleration of his Communist beliefs and of his Communist activities, as well as our acceptance of an identified Communist as our advisor.

"We believe that a Communist is the enemy to all good Americans. The Communists are giving aid and comfort to their writings—have been at war with the non-Communist world since before the Russian revolution. By asking an identified Communist to appear before us, we are giving aid and comfort to our mortal enemy."

"I would have no objection to the appearance of Johnstone before the UPW who has not been identified as a Communist. If we wish to hear from the UPW, let them send a person whose record is not tainted with Communist activities."

"It might be argued that, as commissioners, we are forced to deal with Communists during our regular meetings. This, however, is not by our choice. At the Kauai conference, this body went on record recommending that legislation be enacted to require all persons who appear before the civil service commissions to represent employees and all persons who represent employees in grievance matters be required to take the same loyalty oath as the employees themselves. Appearance of an identified Communist on our program is our own choice, and I believe that this is a serious matter and should be brought to the attention of the program committee immediately for their consideration."

"I would be willing to appear before the program committee and present the documentation contained in the 1953 and 1953 reports of the commission on subversive activities."

Johnstone also had documents prepared on Hoffman and Stephen S. Murin, other UPW leaders in Hawaii. Maui Commissioner T. S. Shinn and Lionel Dupont both denied to The Maui

News that they had anything to do with the make-up of the program, that the commission chairman, Shippey Takemoto (a member of the ILWU and one of the "Reluctant 37" before the National House of Representatives Committee investigating Communist front activities a few years ago), had made up the program himself. Takemoto also sat as conference chairman during the three-day confab.

A letter was then read from Epstein, received here the night before the confab, saying he would be unable to attend the conference and designating Hoffman as his substitute on the panel.

Hoffman asked to appear before the program committee to present his side. Kim moved that the meeting of the program committee be postponed until after the commissioners and personnel directors.

The program committee with R. T. Taniguchi (Hilo), chairman, Peter Chu (Terr.), Mark Y. Murakami (CAC), Shinn, and Wakamoto (Kauai), and Fred Paulos (Hilo) went into immediate session.

Hoffman broke in during the program make-up discussion to accuse Johnstone of "lying to evade the issue, by stating he was ruled out of order."

Johnstone presented his charges against Hoffman, based on material in the issue of a Honolulu newspaper of February 25, 1954, which made reference to official files in Washington which alleged he had attended Communist meetings as early as 1931 and had been active in various youth groups of the Communists in Baltimore, and that during 1942 Hoffman was one of the original members of the "Yanks Are Not Coming Committee" which was formed prior to Germany's attack on Russia, and numerous other Communist activities.

Hoffman accused Johnstone of being a "McCarthyite" and trying to use dictators' tactics in trying to determine who should represent the UPW. Although he described the newspaper charges as "hogwash," he said some "years ago."

During several years as secretary of the Baltimore Industrial Council as CIO representative, I had to attend lots of meetings," Hoffman said. "It is true that before I was drafted into the army some of the groups I represented were for peace, as many others were. Johnstone does not mention that

I served in the war in the Philippines. His only purpose is to smear. It is also true that I signed a petition to get Majors and Palakiko out of jail. I am not responsible for what the Daily Worker says any more than I am for what the Star-Bulletin prints. The territorial subversive activities committee has not investigated me as a Communist. I have not been on the panel as I have enough. I respectfully request that I be allowed to remain on the panel as I have something constructive to offer. Any attempt to keep me off is partisan, political and unpatriotic."

Paulos told Hoffman that if he was willing to go under oath and answer certain questions he would ask him, he might change my viewpoint otherwise, I will not sit with an accused member of the Communist Party," said Paulos.

Hoffman made no reply to Paulos' request. The program committee then moved to refer the question of seating Hoffman over to the conference for action, without recommendations.

When the matter was brought before the conference in the afternoon session Thursday, Murakami said, "This is a delicate subject and many would rather have a vote on the matter taken in secret."

He moved for a secret vote and was seconded by Wakamoto of Kauai.

Shinn moved to table the motion and was seconded by Paulos. In the confusion, Fernandez opposed the secret ballot and moved for a roll call vote.

Takemoto called for a raise of hands on Shinn's motion to table which lost 10 to 6. The raise of hands vote on a secret ballot carried 10 to 7. Johnstone requested that the evidence he had presented before the program committee against Hoffman be read to the conference.

"I think this conference should avoid any controversy that would break it up," Kum replied. "I'm not interested in controversy and do not want further discussion."

Johnstone pressed his point no further discussion and was seconded by Kenneth Matsuo of Maui. This vote carried 10 to 6. Voting against the motion for no further discussion were Chu, Shinn, Paulos, Alkana and Johnstone.

Kum replied, "I'm not interested in controversy, when the vote was taken, that no specific names be used such as Hoffman's, but that the ques-

tion be resolved into a vote on whether the entire panel should be seated. Confusion reigned as the Kum forces sent their raucous tactics into high gear.

Murakami finally moved that Max Hoffman be included among the panel members in place of Epstein and received a second from his fellow commissioner, Ross. The secret ballot passed 11 to 8.

Being consistent, Paulos then asked that he be excused from attending the meeting during the panel discussion. It was reported later that among those voting against the seating of Hoffman were Fernandez, Chu and Johnstone, and Territorial Director Akina; Commissioners Paulos, Taniguchi and Director George C. Hewitt of Hilo, and Commissioner Shinn of Maui.

Bystanders at the session in-

terpreted the action taken on the seating of Hoffman as a demonstration of the political power wielded by the UPW, which has assumed a blood cousin relationship with the ILWU.

Suehiro Is New County Counsellor

Rehabilitation Office In Wailuku To Aid Handicapped

Richard Y. Suehiro, Maui County's first vocational rehabilitation counselor, left Kula for the Mainland in November, 1953, arrived on the Valley Isle last week to take over this vital post in the Territorial department of public instruction set-up. Since the departure of Kuba, L. D. Rowlands, who holds a similar post on the Big Island, has also been serving the Valley Isle on a part-time basis.

Suehiro graduated from the University of Hawaii in 1949, and received his master's degree in 1951 from the graduate school, division of social service, at the University of Hawaii. A veteran of World War II, he served with the 11th Airborne Division in Europe.

Prized for his Maui appointment, he was a case worker for six weeks with the Territorial Department of Public Welfare on Oahu. Suehiro's wife, Maude, and son, James, 2-years-old, have joined him on the Valley Isle. He is a native of Hawaii.

At the present time the rehabilitation office on Maui is working with approximately 75 persons on Maui, Molokai, and Lanai.

The division works with physically or mentally disabled persons 16-years of age or older who have a job handicap because of disability. They place these people in employment where they can do as well or better than a normal person by selective placement after a training and screening period. They can be fully or partially self supporting.

The office provides surgery, artificial limbs, wheel chairs and other aids and sees that

the handicapped get the proper schooling, including assistance for the hand of hearing.

Suehiro, accompanied by Rowlands and Miss Rose Mary Hayes, case work supervisors for the Division of Rehabilitation, came to Maui a week ago Monday and was introduced to workers of local social agencies and business representatives at a meeting held for the purpose of outlining the work and functions of the service.

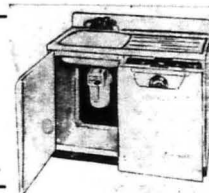

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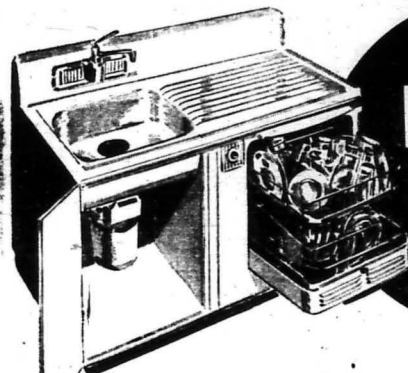

Florida Mangoes In Hawaii

Varieties Imported By Mauian Bearing Fruit at Kihai

The Hayden mango has been for some time the most popular of the imported varieties. Attempts have been made recently to find other varieties, however, since the Hayden demonstrates erratic bearing habits. Mango enthusiasts have found several which are to be highly recommended.

Early in 1946, Alexander Yee, of Wailuku, imported five different Florida varieties and planted them at Kihai. Among those imported are several commercial varieties recommended by Floridians, including Kent, Zill, Edwards, Simmonds, and Carrie.

The Zill and Simmonds varieties began bearing in 1950, and the others the following year. All have proved themselves better bearers than the Hayden. Carrie and Edwards, however, although their flavor was found to be excellent, were eliminated because of poor skin color. The remaining varieties have fairly good coloring and are being maintained. Taste and texture are uniformly distinctive among the several.

Kent is the largest of the group, with fruits averaging about 1 1/2 pounds in weight. This variety looks like the Hayden, with sides slightly more compressed. Skin is dark crimson in the sunlight. It is a late variety, and comes into season about the end of July.

Zill is the smallest of the group, with fruits averaging from 6 to 10 ounces in weight. Form is ovate, like the pear, with sides slightly compressed. Skin is light to dark crimson over most of the fruit. The seed can be separated from the pulp readily when ripe, and the halves may be eaten with a spoon. It is an early variety.

Solo Papaya Is Subject For HAES Bulletin

Dr. Richard A. Hamilton, horticultural research expert on papaya and other fruit production at the Hawaii Agricultural Experiment Station of the College of Agriculture at the University of Hawaii is the author of the recently published HAES Technical Bulletin No. 20 on the breeding, growth, and fruiting of solo papaya.

The bulletin is called "A Quantitative Study of Growth and Fruiting in Inbred and Crossbred Progenies from Two Solo Papaya Strains." Dr. Hamilton began this work in 1950. It includes studies on plant sex, heredity, vigor, and inbreeding.

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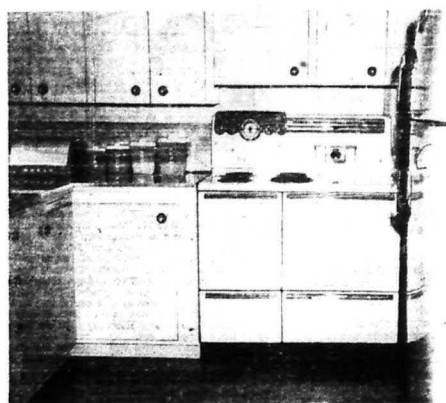
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
