General rules for recording WEMI relations in MARC bibliographic format RDA prescribes three methods for recording related works, expressions, manifestations, and items in MARC bibliographic format:

 record in the bibliographic record for the resource you are cataloging an identifier for the related work, expression, manifestation or item. (24.4.1)

Examples: URN for related resource, ISBN for related manifestation, International Standard Work Number for related work

- 2. record in the bibliographic record for the resource you are cataloging an authorized access point representing the related work or expression (24.4.2)
- 3. record a structured or unstructured description of the related work, expression, manifestation, or item (24.4.3).

In MARC bibliographic records, <u>unstructured descriptions</u> generally take the form of 5XX notes written in free text.

In MARC bibliographic records, <u>structured descriptions</u> generally take the form of a citation structured by ISBD display conventions and recorded either

in a MARC "linking entry" field (e.g., 765 or 775 or 776), or a 5XX note field, or both.

In many cases, the related resource of interest is a work or expression, and not any particular manifestation of it; in those cases, an *authorized access point* for the related work or expression may be recorded. (See below for examples of how to reference related works or expressions in MARC bibliographic format.)

In other cases, the cataloger wishes to reference a particular manifestation in which the related work or expression is embodied (for example, the related expression is a translation of a particular edition of a published book). In those cases, the cataloger can use linking entries (MARC Fields 76X-78X) to reference the related work or expression in the bibliographic record for the resource being cataloged. (See below for examples of how to reference a particular manifestation of a related work or expression in MARC bibliographic format.)

Manifestation-to-manifestation relationships can also be expressed using linking entries (MARC Fields 76X-78X) to reference the related manifestation in the bibliographic record for the resource being cataloged. (See below for examples of how to reference a related manifestation in MARC bibliographic format.)

Recording an *authorized access point (AAP)* representing the related work or expression

(AAP for compilation is 100 + 240; 240 is constructed per the rules in 6.2.2.10.3 (Alternative); AAP for first work in compilation (first 700 field) is required per LC/PCC-PS for that rule and LC/PCC PS 25.1; AAPs for second and third work are optional (use cataloger's judgment); second indicator "2" in 700 field means "Contains:" so no Appendix J relationship designator should be added; the three 700 fields here are examples of the "analytical authorized access points" mentioned in LC/PCC-PS 25.1; the 740s are uncontrolled forms of the authorized access points and they are useful many OPACs do not index 700 \$t for title browsing or searching, but they generally do index the 740 field for title browsing or searching.)

(AAP for abridgement is 100 + 245\$a; per LC/PCC PS 6.27.3 it is not necessary to distinguish related expressions from each other by adding distinguishing attributes to the AAP for either expression except with music resources, sacred scriptures, translations, and language editions, so that's why no 240 is added here; the reference to the related expression is made here in the form of a structured note in a linking field (775=Other edition) that describes the manifestation in which the related expression is embodied; the structured description can begin with a relationship designator from Appendix J (as it does here) or with another phrase if another phrase is more clear.)

(AAP for revision is 100 + 240; 240 is required here because the preferred title for the work is not the same as the 245\$a title (RDA 6.27.1.9 and the LC/PCC-PS for 6.27.1.9); as explained below the example directly above this one, it is not

necessary to add attributes to the 240 to distinguish this expression from the original edition; the reference to the related expression is made here in the form of a structured note in a linking field (775=Other edition) that describes the manifestation in which the related expression is embodied; the structured description can begin with a relationship designator from Appendix J (as it does here) or with another phrase if another phrase is more clear.)
