- July 26 is the last day to withdraw with no refund and no “W” grade;
- August 11 is the last day of instruction;
- August 15 is the deadline for instructors to submit grades; and,
- August 16 is the day when grades are available on MyUH.

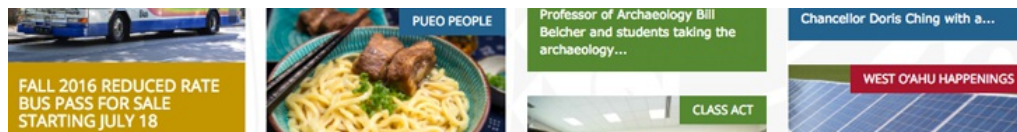
