### UH West O'ahu climbs in rankings on U.S. News and World Reports Best Colleges list

UH West O'ahu climbed one spot to number four in Top Public Colleges West in the recently released <u>U.S. News & World Report Best Colleges rankings</u>. It remained at No. 21 in Best Regional Colleges (West). It was also included on the list of Top Performers on Social Mobility, coming in at No. 17. Social Mobility is a new ranking that is based on enrollment and graduating a high proportion of students who were awarded Pell Grants.

#### More great news! UH West O'ahu sees a 36 percent increase in extramural funding in 2019!

UH West O'ahu enjoyed a 36 percent increase in extramural funding for this past fiscal year. Extramural funding is external investments from governmental agencies, industries and non-profit organizations that support research and training activities by university faculty and staff. UH received \$8.2 million in FY2019.

Overall, UH attracted \$421.8 million in extramural funding in fiscal year 2019 (FY2019), topping \$400 million for the first time in four years (a 9.2 percent increase from last year)..

Of note, UH West Oʻahu, which received \$2.5 million from the National Science Foundation's Tribal Colleges and Universities Program for its Pūkoʻa Kani ʻĀina project, led by Dr. Kamuela Yong and Dr. Megan Ross. The project will enhance STEM education and create a STEM ecosystem at UH West Oʻahu by providing a STEM pipeline from high schools, community colleges and from its own campus to careers and post baccalaureate education.


#### **AUW Basket Winners, Baking Contest Winners**

## **Service Learning Designation for Courses**

Service learning is incorporated into a course through projects that serve the student learning outcomes, community partner goals, and community needs. Projects are designed collaboratively between faculty and community partners, such as non-profit organizations or government agencies. Projects typically ask students to connect course content to community-based projects. This gives students opportunities to engage in experiential learning in real world contexts and develop civic and community engagement skills, while serving community partner, and societal needs.

At UH West O'ahu, the service learning (SL) course designation is designed to encourage faculty to offer high quality service learning experiences in their courses, and for students to be able to identify courses they can take that offer service learning at registration. The service learning component of the courses is intended to ground the students' learning in important real-world problem solving and civic engagement and is directly linked to UHWO's Institutional Learning Outcome 5 on community engagement which states that students must: Demonstrate engagement with campus life, the broader community or service to others through the use of co-curricular resources, participation in extra-curricular activities or service learning.

We are pleased to announce that as of this Fall semester we are accepting submissions for a service learning (SL) course designation. You may recall that the service-learning designation was approved by faculty senate at the end of Spring 2018.

The Kuali system has been built so that you will be able to submit SL designation applications through the system. Applications will look much like applications for other general education designations such as OC or WI.

We are accepting proposals on a rolling basis, up until February 8th, 2020 for Fall 2020. We plan to present more information about how to include service learning in your classes for interested faculty (both new and tenured) in the near future and in various venues.
