
UHWO's Heather Giugni, collections specialist and producer for 'Ulu'ulu, Hawai'i's moving image archive, and Sharla Hanaoka, director of Creative Media at UHWO, are producers of the Hawaiian language-version of Moana, in cooperation with Rick Dempsey, SVP Creative, for Disney Character Voices International. It is anticipated the finished product will be distributed via the Hawai'i Department of Education to schools across the state. The production will feature Native Hawaiian actress Auli'i Cravalho, who will reprise her role as the titular character. News of the project was released last week, with UH West O'ahu distributing an English-language press release version, and for the first time, a Hawaiian-language version. Executive Policy EP8.200 Policy on Contracts and Signing Authority is intended to make uniform for the University (1) standard contractual provisions, (2) approvals and signing authority required to enter written contracts which the President has delegated authority from the Board of Regents to execute, and (3) the identification of and direction for "priority" or high risk / high volume contracts that warrant additional scrutiny and Review. Nathan Aweau coming to UH West O'ahu for Ho'okani Kulanui




