


Air conditioning summer schedule for Classroom, Laboratory, and Campus Center



Former Gov. John Waihe'e visits Center for Labor Education and Research

Former Gov. John Waihe'e III visited The Center for Labor Education and Research last Tuesday, meeting with Dr. William Puette, Dr. Leslie Lopez, and Chris Conybeare of the center. Waihe'e, who served as Hawai'i's governor from 1986 to 1994, received a tour of the center located in the James & Abigail Campbell Library as

well as its collection of materials.

During the visit, center staff and Waihe'e discussed the labor leaders, workers, and organizers who were responsible for the Hawai'i Democratic Revolution of 1954 and gain collective bargaining for public workers. Lopez said Waihe'e credited labor education as a central and historically significant component of democracy in Hawai'i and recalled labor leaders and union members taking classes on labor law, organizing, labor history, and other subjects at Ala Moana park.

UH West O'ahu ranks ninth best online bachelor's in respiratory therapy program

The University of Hawai'i–West O'ahu's Bachelor of Applied Science with a concentration in Respiratory Care program ranked ninth nationally, according to a list compiled by BestColleges.com. The website notes the classes are offered both on-site and through distance learning and that the program is specifically structure for graduates with an Associate in Science degree in Respiratory Care from Kapi'olani Community College. UH West O'ahu does not have an online degree in respiratory therapy, but it appears the program meets the criteria for the ranking. UH West O'ahu does not offer fully online-only degree programs--lower division coursework needs to be completed via in-person and online classes at UH West O'ahu and/or a partnering University of Hawai'i Community College.

Adobe Acrobat DC allows users to view, print, and annotate PDFs. Adobe Acrobat Pro DC. The ITS Site License Office is now providing licenses for Adobe Acrobat Pro DC to all University of Hawaii faculty and staff. A file that is large in size can be difficult to share with others. Adobe Acrobat DC provides a way to compress large PDFs. Using the Optimize PDF tool will help you create smaller and more manageable files. 


