In September 2019, the University of Hawai'i launched a partnership with Landed (landed.com) to help support employees in managing one of the biggest challenges outside of work: finding affordable housing within a reasonable commuting distance to our campuses. Landed will host a homebuying informational event 4 to 5 p.m. today, March 2, in A225. Refreshments will be provided and partners are welcome to attend. RSVP at http://go.hawaii.edu/MXA.

Landed has helped four UH employees successfully purchase homes across Hawai'i so far and has helped connect several hundred employees with homebuying education resources. There are more that are in the process of making purchases.

You may know Landed for its down payment program. Landed has recently expanded to offer more free services, including building a supportive homebuying team to help you navigate all of your homebuying options,

competitive offer reviews and homebuyer educational materials, and guidance to help at any stage of the homebuying journey.

Landed's down payment program invests alongside employees in education to help them reach a 20 percent down payment. Landed's funds, up to \$120,000 per household, come in the form of an equity investment, meaning that homebuyers share in a portion of the gain (or loss, if any) of the value of the home once the partnership is ended - typically by sale or refinance.

This program is available immediately and open to all UH employees - faculty, staff, and administrators - who have worked in education for at least two years. You do not need to be a first-time homebuyer to participate.
