

UH West O'ahu Spring 2018 Enrollment at 2,896

UH West O'ahu's <u>Spring 2019 census headcount</u> (for-credit students) totaled 2,896, according to a tally kept by the UH Institutional Research and Analysis Office. A year earlier the total was 2,944.

Dr. Gary Helfand Memorial Public Administration Scholarship established

Dr. Helfand dedicated his life and career to UH West O'ahu for more than 33 years and was an extraordinary scholar, colleague, caring friend, and an outstanding mentor. ACLU National Legal Director David Cole to speak March 5; all invited

UH West Oʻahu's Distinguished Visiting Scholars' Fund is pleased to be able to host ACLU National Legal Director and Georgetown Law Prof. David Cole for a free public talk on Tuesday, March 5, in the James & Abigail Campbell Library. Cole, who is a Dan and Maggie Inouye Chair at UH Mānoa, will speak on "Liberty's Defense: Lessons from the Legal Resistance." Cole is the author of a number of books, including *No Equal Justice: Race and Class in the American Criminal Justice System* and *Enemy Aliens: Double Standards and Constitutional Freedoms in the War on Terrorism.*

Cole, whose has argued numerous civil liberties cases before the U.S. Supreme Court, will draw on experience from the last two years, as well as previous periods, to address the critical elements necessary to preserve liberty in our democracy. The talk is scheduled for 12:30 p.m. to 1:50 p.m., March 5, on the second floor of the James & Abigail Campbell Library. It is free and open to the public.

The addition of the new Administration and Health Science building, a parking lot extension and other changes to campus have altered the campus landscape at UH West O'ahu. A new campus map has been created by





Halawai Polu is the web conferencing tool available in Laulima. The system is actually Laulima's integration of Big Blue Button. This tool can make it possible to conduct meetings online. There are many features in the tool

that can make communication easy. Halawai Polu makes it easy to share presentations with the upload feature. You can give a lecture in the tool and students can see and hear all the information you have to offer.

The system also allows instructors to create breakout rooms that would make it easier to manage smaller discussions in small groups. Breakout rooms will allow students to talk, chat, and share ideas with each other. 


