The Future of American Politics, Feb. 22

Dr. Corey Robin, author of *The Reactionary Mind* — "the book that predicted Trump" (*New Yorker*) — and *Fear: The History of a Political Idea*, is the speaker for "The Future of American Politics" talk at UH West Oʻahu on Wednesday, Feb. 22, from 2 to 3:20 p.m. in C225. Students, faculty, and staff are encouraged to attend.

Dr. Robin's work has been published in the *London Review of Books, Harper's, The New York Times, The Nation,* and the *American Political Science Review.* He has appeared regularly on NPR and MSNBC and is regarded as one of the most cogent scholars of American conservatism. He is currently working on a book about Clarence Thomas, and he maintains an active blog at Crooked Timber and *Jacobin*.

The event is supported by the UH West O'ahu Office of the Chancellor and the Distinguished Visiting Scholar Fund, and is organized in conjunction with the "Chancellor's Thought-Leader Series" at UH Mānoa.

DE Tip of the Week - EndNote

This month we have been learning about different types of free bibliographic software. Another option to help your organize your reference material is EndNote. This software is not free but Information Technology Services (ITS) has a established a site license for the UH System. So you can purchase an individual license for \$35.00 that will allow you to use the system for the duration of the UH Fiscal Year. One of the big features of EndNote is that it works with unusual or complex citation styles. This program is also preferred for citing unusual document types or in situations where you have created your own document type. If you are interested in the program
