

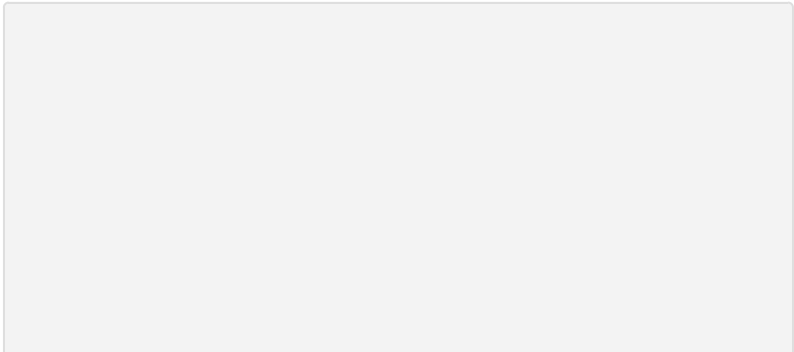

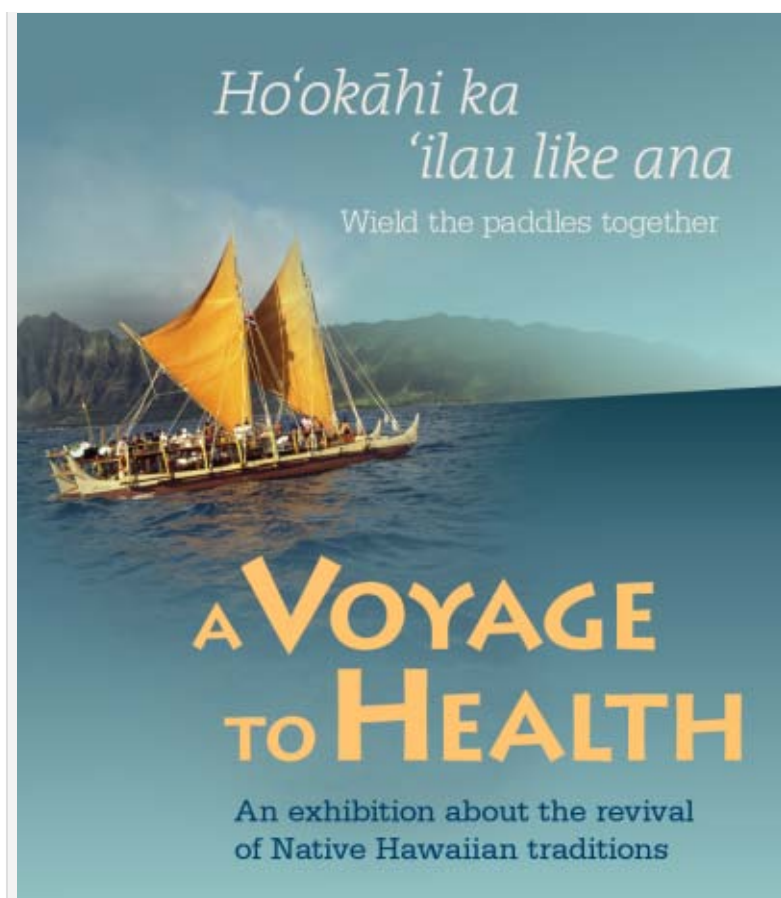
Special Event: A Voyage to Health

The History of Medicine Division of the National Library of Medicine is pleased to provide you with an exceptional traveling exhibition called “A Voyage To Health.”

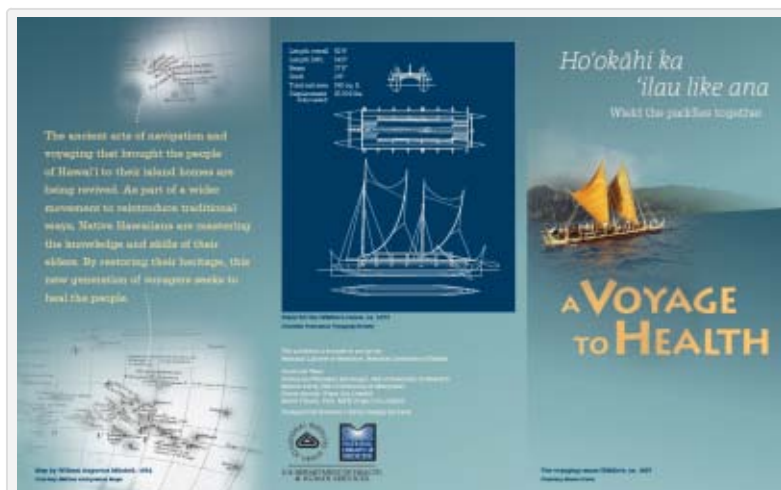

A Voyage To Health explores the recent revival of the ancient arts of navigation and voyaging that first brought the people of Hawai'i to their island homes. Much of the valuable knowledge of voyaging was lost as a consequence of the suppression of traditional ways. As part of a wider movement to reintroduce traditional ways, Native Hawaiians are mastering the knowledge and skills of their elders. By restoring their heritage, this new generation seeks to heal the people. A Voyage to Health explores this resurgence and its significance for health, well-being, and self-determination.

Special Event: Bone Marrow Drive

November 17, 2010

Register to find a match by getting your cheek swabbed—you can save a life this holiday season. If you are a match, donation can be done with one of two safe and quick low-risk procedures. 70% of donations do not require surgery and are similar to donating blood. PBSC (Plasma Blood Stem Cells) takes stem cells from the blood and not from your marrow. 30% of donations are through your marrow, where the donor is placed under anesthesia and does not feel any pain. Marrow is removed from the pelvic bone and replaces itself in 4-6 weeks.

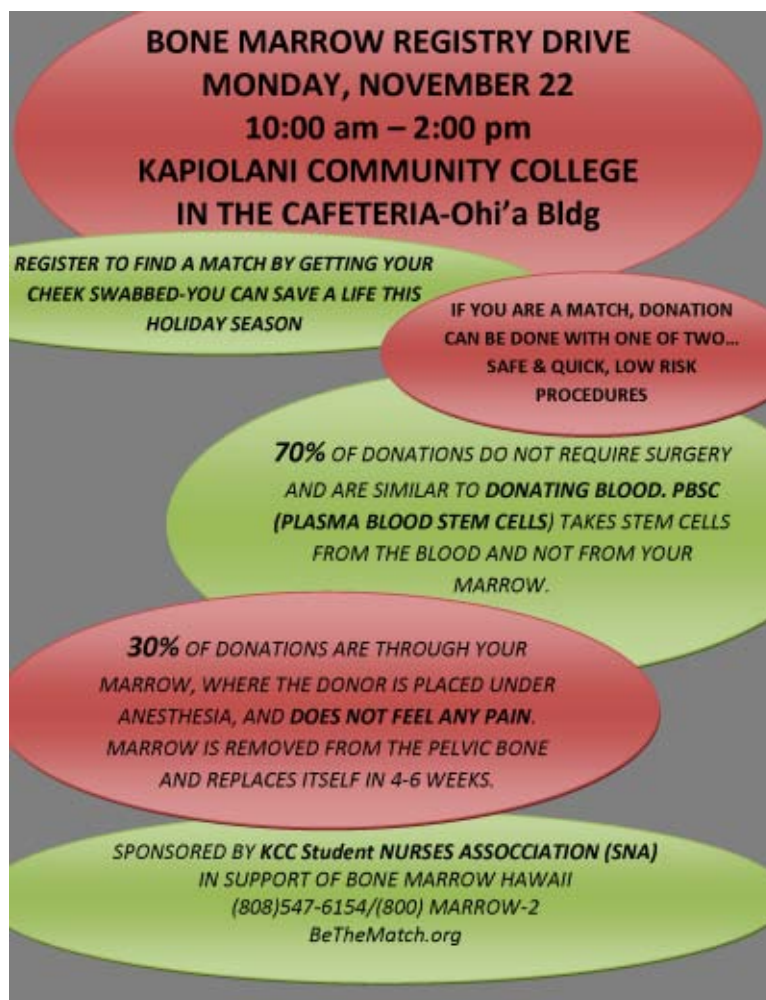

Cool Tools: Citations





October 6, 2010

What is a citation? Why is it important to use them? Which kind should you use? What tools are there to help?

Your instructors have told you that you must use correct MLA or APA documentation in your research papers. See the library's [MLA / APA Citations](#) page for links to some guides and tools: once you know which style you need to use, pick the guide you like best. Then find the instructions for the type of source you need to cite (for example, "book with unknown author" or "article retrieved from a library's subscription database"), and fill in the information from your source.

Remember, library staff can show you how to use the guides, but we can't do your citations for you! And when in doubt, always check with your instructor.
