Qualification for Program Entry & Selection Criteria

Qualification is based on a BEST QUALIFIED, FIRST ACCEPTED rating system for (a) grades of completed prerequisites, (b) grades of completed support courses, and (c) Admissions Assessment (A^2) scores. Selection is based on <u>total</u> qualifying scores in rank order from the highest until admission quota is reached.

Applications are located online in the Radiologic Technology Toolbox located on the KCC website. Selection is based on <u>total</u> qualifying scores in rank order from the highest until admission quota is reached. Students must qualify by the application deadline.

Students on probation, suspension or having a GPA below 2.0 at KCC are not eligible to apply. Priority selection is given to Hawai'i State residents; nonresidents will be considered after all qualified residents have been accommodated per Board of Regents Policy 5.211. A grade of "C" or higher must be maintained in all program requirements to continue in the programs. Transfer credit from accredited institutions requires KCC Department and registrar approval.

The Radiologic Technology program is using an online Admissions Assessment (A²) from an independent third party (Evolve) as a part of the admissions procedure. All applicants to the program must achieve minimum scores in five content areas (Reading Comprehension, Vocabulary and General Knowledge, Grammar, Math, and Anatomy & Physiology) to qualify for admission. The applicant will be awarded points based on their cumulative score on the A2.
