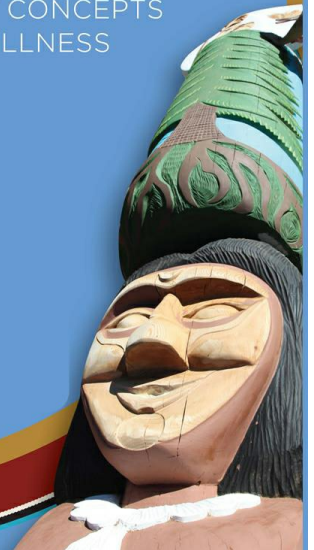

Study Skills

What kind of learner are you? Get tips on note-taking to retain information and learn study strategies.

Life Hacks for a 4.0 Year

This presentation combines quick tips on study skills and best practices in class with a sampling of advice from our Grammar Hammer, How to Write an "A" Paper, and Academic Ownership: Avoiding Plagiarism workshops. Join us for an overview of the best strategies you can use for a 4.0 year.

Literature Reviews

Join us as we walk students through finding peer-reviewed journal articles via research databases and using them to generate ideas regarding their respective topics based on previous research. Literature Reviews are assigned in virtually all Sociology classes.

Research Papers

This workshop will walk students through the library's research databases and constructing their own content analysis. Also includes instructions on using in-text citations and paraphrasing to avoid plagiarism.

Grammar Hammer

Grammar refers to more than just being articulate or making sense. It's also about separating third and first person points of view, and learning the difference between informal and formal tone. This workshop will give you the tools you need to speak and write in academic environments.

Formatting Workshops

(MLA, APA, Chicago, ASA, AAA)

These workshops cover documenting sources, in-text citations, and preparing references according to the citation formats used in different academic disciplines.

Mastering Math

Having a difficult time adjusting to the demands of college math? Attend this workshop for some calming math strategies.

Resumes

Learn to construct a presentable resume. This workshop provides tips on making a lasting impression and separating yourself from the pack.

Interviews

Participate in mock interviews. This workshop provides tips on making a lasting impression and separating yourself from the pack.

How to Write an "A" Paper

This workshop covers constructing a thesis, developing clear organization, and selecting appropriate evidence to persuade your reader.

Senior Project

Senior projects can be challenging if you're not prepared. This workshop teaches strategies on meeting deadlines, organizing writing, and making the most of your final presentation.

Stress & Time Management

Learn helpful strategies for coping with stress and anxiety and different ways to balance your work schedule and social life.

Multimedia Presentations

A PowerPoint or Prezi slideshow is a great visual aid, but can be a hindrance if not structured appropriately. Learn how to construct effective multimedia presentations.

Academic Ownership

Writers in academic environments are expected to follow specific practices when using information from outside sources. Learn strategies to avoid plagiarism and its consequences.

Exam Prep Skills

Midterms and finals don't have to be scary. Learn study strategies from experienced students.

Preparing for and Applying to Graduate School

This workshop provides information on the application process and offers tips for preparing a successful application.

Preparing for Graduate School Entrance Exams (GRE, LSAT, Praxis)

These workshops provide an introduction to the exam (e.g. what to expect in terms of format and scoring) as well as advice for further study.

Dress for Success

First impressions are key, whether you are giving a presentation or interviewing for a new job. This workshop will give you tips on how to dress for the job you aspire to have.
