


Information Technology hosting best practices workshop for accessible documents

UH West O'ahu will host Dr. Tom Conway of the Center for Disability Studies for a workshop showcasing best practices on generating accessible Microsoft Word and PDF documents. The first-come, first-serve workshop is scheduled for two sessions on Wednesday, Aug. 15 in B155. The first session is from 9:30-11:30 a.m. and the second from 12:30-2:30 p.m. It is part of the IT Department's Tech Open House that runs from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The University of Hawai'i is committed to ensuring that campus computing and information resources are accessible to disabled students, faculty and staff. Accessibility of these services has been a longstanding requirement under federal law, including Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; web accessibility standards are newer, but part of UH's accessibility obligations and commitment.

Charting a Native Hawaiian Postsecondary Journey: Findings from the UH Comprehensive Title III Evaluation

Faculty and staff are highly encouraged to stop by the System-wide Title III Evaluation presentation from 1 to 4 p.m., Thursday, Aug. 23 at the Nāulu Center. In 2015, the UH system was awarded a supplemental grant under Title III to conduct a system-wide evaluation of Title III programs. All interested faculty and staff are invited to attend and hear the impact of Title III at UH West O'ahu.

In this presentation, the evaluation team will highlight findings and "Aha!" moments from the comprehensive review, which includes reviews of program reports, focus groups, and interviews with stakeholders on each campus, student and faculty/staff survey, and analyses of student administrative, and academic records. The program starts at 1 p.m. with an open campus meeting; 2 p.m. Title III Program Staff Meeting. All interested faculty and staff are invited to attend this presentation that shares the impact of Title III at UH West O'ahu.

The U.S. federal Title III program provides financial support to minority-serving institutions to strengthen their capacities to promote success among minority students. For over 20 years, the 10- campus University of Hawai'i (UH) system has leveraged Title III funding to improve Native Hawaiian representation on campuses, persistence, and successful achievement of

desired goals.

SALT art exhibition on Aug. 25 will benefit UHWO Compliance Hui

Artists Leni Acosta Knight, Ruben Aira Jr., and William Zwick, will have a group exhibition of new and existing artwork at SALT at our Kaka'ako on Saturday, Aug. 25 that will benefit UH West O'ahu.. The event is dedicated to empowering the victims of domestic and sexual abuse to have a "voice" and to help in the awareness and prevention of violence of any kind. SALT is a one-block area hosting merchants and restaurants and is bounded by Auahi, Coral, and Keawe streets and Ala Moana.

The show will also feature works of clothing designer, Michelle Thompson of Gypsea Mafia, jewelry designer Jessie Hodge of Simply Anela Creations and contemporary artist Jasmine Mikaela Knight. Along with the visual artists, slam poets, Jenn Collotta and Anna Davide and various performing artists will perform live from 5:30 to 8 p.m. Portion of sale proceeds will be donated to UH West O'ahu Compliance Hui to strengthen campus awareness and education about domestic and sexual violence.

Distance Learning tip of the week - Here's a Laulima tool

Assignments, Tests, and Surveys is a Laulima tool that can be used to create online assessments for your course. Individual assessments can be created to support a specific need. The tool can also be used to create question pools that can contribute to multiple assessments. For example, a user might create individual question pools for each section of the class and at the end of the semester use multiple pools to generate a final exam. 


