






Flagpole repairs scheduled for today, Dec. 31 - please be alert in area


Library, Dining Hall, No'eau Center, and the bookstore reopen this week

Come to the groundbreaking for Academy for Creative Media Building, Jan. 11

Students, faculty, and staff are invited to the ground breaking for the Academy for Creative Media building on Friday, Jan. 11, starting at 10 a.m. Light refreshments will be provided. As contracted for, the new facility will be a 42,000 square foot facility consisting of production spaces that include a two-story sound stage for filming, 100 seat screening room, Foley stage for sound reproduction, editing suites, sound mixing suites, mill shop to create film sets and equipment cages. The new structure will be located roughly northeast of the Administration and Health Science building and is planned to open in 2020.

Exterior sealing of new building begins, please heed safety/detour signs

The UH West O'ahu Planning and Facilities office is asking people to respect all construction barricades and all posted safety/detour signs posted around the new Administration and Health Science building, which is being sprayed with an exterior sealer. The work began last week and is expected to be completed in mid-February. Crews are using a snorkel lift to apply two coats of the clear sealer to the building's concrete masonry exterior. The sealant will add additional water repellency protection and also provides graffiti resistance.

The work is scheduled from Wednesdays to Sundays between the hours of 6:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Planning and Facilities is asking patience, cooperation and understanding because of the inconveniences inherent to construction (noise, dust, odors and debris) that will be generated with this project. Distance Education tip of the Week - Learning from students


Creating video introductions is a way to create community and a sense of place in an online class. You can encourage your students to create a 90 second video where they share their names, their interests, and other information that might relate to the course. Students can use tools like <u>Animoto</u>, <u>Slide.ly</u>, <u>Haiku Deck</u>, <u>Prezi</u>, <u>Jing</u>, <u>PowerPoint</u>, <u>Keynote</u>, and <u>iMovie</u>. Being able to see and hear a little about the lives of their classmates can go a long way towards helping students feel like they are part of a classroom community, which can be very helpful in developing a safe learning environment in the online space.
