Shawn Ford Awarded SEED Grant for ELL Summer Writing Workshop



Shawn Ford (Languages, Linguistics and Literature) will be a Diversity and Equity Initiative Award in the amount of \$1,350 for his Summer Writing Workshop for English Language Learners (ELL) project.

During the summer of 2012, the [English for Speakers of Other Languages \(ESOL\) Program](#) faculty will provide three-week intensive writing workshops for 45 English language learners (ELL) from partnering high schools, including Farrington, Kaimuki and McKinley high schools. The target population is sophomores and juniors who need intensive writing instruction, and career and academic advising to prepare for college.

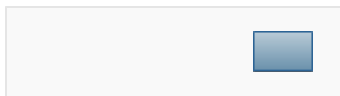
Freeman Foundation to Fund Faculty Institute on Japan

Ford's project addresses the ethnicity/race area of diversity, and fulfills the outreach & recruitment initiative.

This award is Ford's second successful application to the University of Hawaii SEED Office grant program. The first award was in 2008 for a similar project entitled Higher Education Access and Teacher Training for Immigrant Students.

The College's Office for Institutional Effectiveness, in addition to supporting the Accreditation Self Evaluation, is engaged in 3 national studies focused on: 1) STEM Innovation and Integration; 2) HUD Funded University Partnerships; and 3) National Postsecondary Student Aid. OFIE values national research and integrates it into campus planning for improvement. OFIE also contributes to best practice research on student engagement, learning, and achievement.

Dr. Joseph Overton Awarded Henry Luce Foundation Grant



Dr. Joe Overton, Director of the Office of International Affairs, has been awarded a \$200,000 two year grant from the Henry Luce Foundation to take six faculty this summer to Malaysia, Singapore and Indonesia to research "The Chinese Diaspora in Southeast Asia." The 6 participants will come from educational institutions which are members of the Association of Regional Centers for Asian Studies (ARCAS) of which KCC is a founding member. Participants are not expected to be specialists on either the topic or the 3 Southeast Asian nations. However, they will be expected to infuse the knowledge gained into their courses.
