Classrooms, lab rooms telephones installed

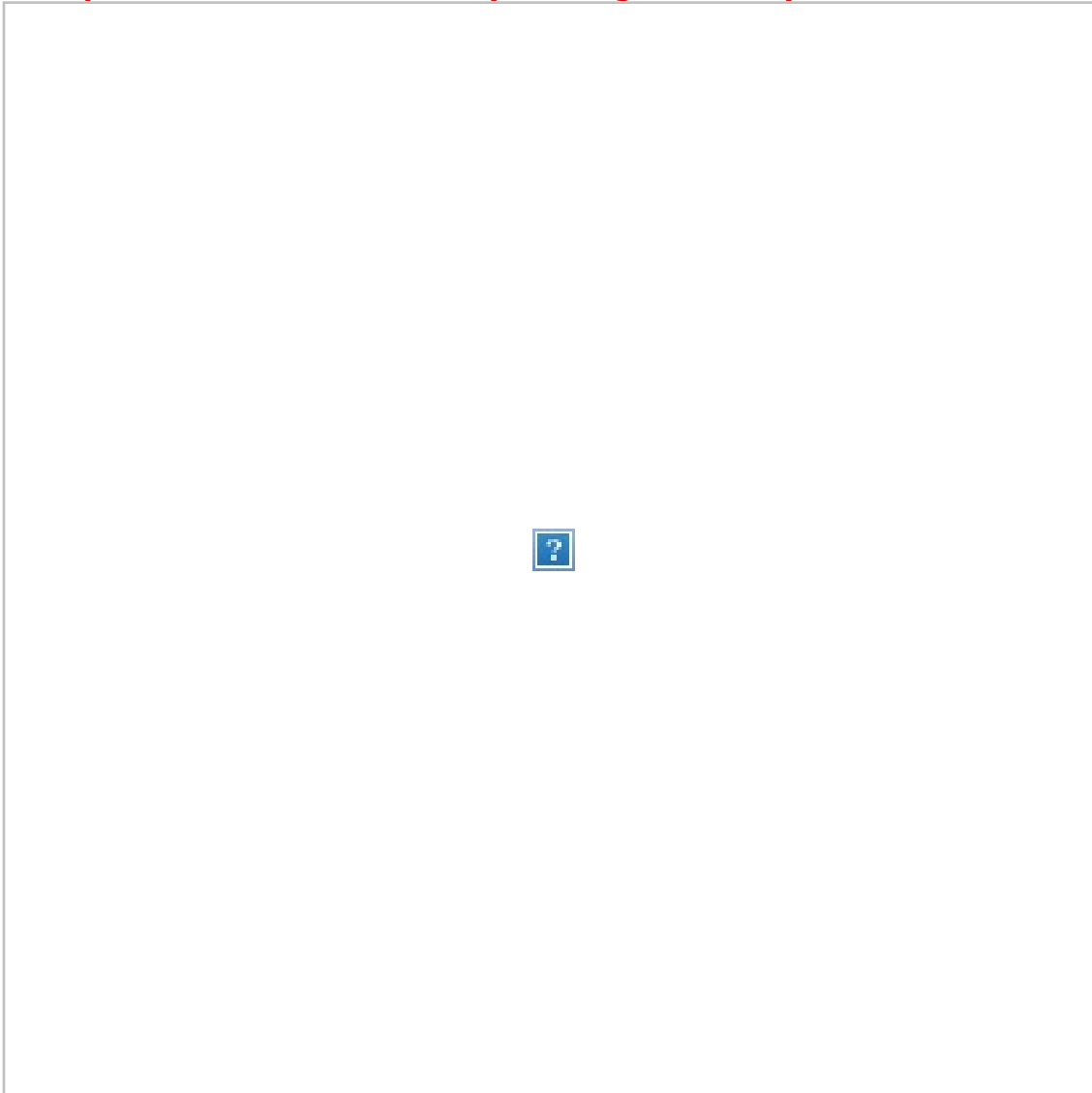

UHWO awarded \$2.7 million GEAR UP grant to help students

UH West O'ahu's recent award of a \$2.7 million federal GEAR UP partnership grant was one of the highlights in University of Hawai'i System President David Lassner's [November presentation to the Board of Regents](#).

Lassner noted the grant will help the University of Hawai'i system focus on what has been an underserved area of the state, and called attention to the grant being preceded by another GEAR UP grant that helped students prepare and succeed in postsecondary education. "This has been remarkably successful, producing valedictorians in high schools and getting students into college over the past seven years and that evidence of success is what helped us get the next grant," Lassner said.

UH supplemental budget request includes funding for UHWO growth

[UH System's FY2018-2019 supplement budget request](#) includes funding for the possible move of the dental hygiene program from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa to UHWO, and money for the hiring of more staff to handle increasing instructional and infrastructure needs as the campus grows.

The budget asks for 10 more positions in Academic Affairs and six more in Student Affairs, as well as seven more security, janitor, general laborer and manager positions. The capital improvement budget request includes funding for the possible shift of UH Mānoa's dental hygiene program to UHWO in keeping with BOR-approved Integrated Academic and Facilities Plan.

The supplemental budget request is submitted to the Hawai'i Legislature for its consideration. Every two years, the executive proposes a biennium budget and in the subsequent year proposes a supplemental budget.

UHWO Business Administration lecturer part of panel discussion

Distance Learning tip of the week

Snagit is a screen capture software that will allow you to create images and videos from your laptop screen. You can use this tool to create screenshots and short screen recordings that might be helpful in explaining an idea or process to your students or colleagues when over conversing online. Snagit allows you to edit screenshots by adding captions and arrows to help direct attention or explain information to your audience. You can request to have this program installed on your UHWO computer by submitting an IT Request here:
