

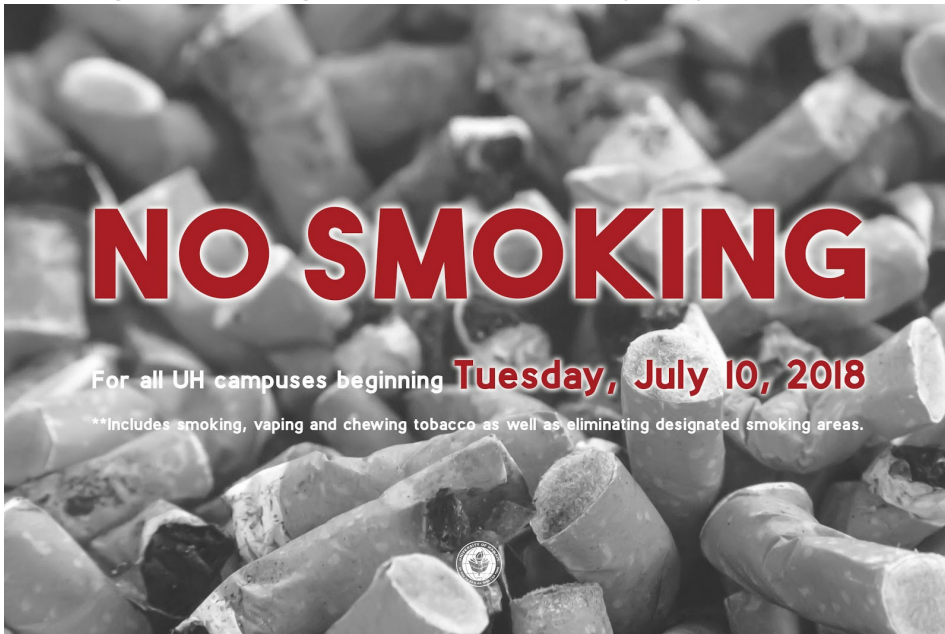

Smoking prohibition goes into effect Tuesday, July 10 at UH campuses



Starting tomorrow, Tuesday, July 10, a

new law will take effect that makes all University of Hawaii campuses and properties tobacco free. This includes smoking, vaping and chewing tobacco as well as eliminating designated smoking areas.

The University of Hawai'i System had supported the goal of the measure, which promotes positive health practices and protects UH students, employees and visitors from exposure to smoke and other potentially harmful substances caused by tobacco use. UH also has noted the action is similar to other programs at colleges and universities elsewhere and that studies have shown smoke-free campuses are an effective intervention for reducing smoking and tobacco use among students.

I-Ching, or Book of Changes, will be presented during a summer cultural education workshop for UH West O‘ahu staff scheduled for 11 a.m. to 2 p.m., Friday, July 20. The workshop in E243 is designed to introduce participants to the I-Ching, a text said to date back three thousand years that provides wisdom and insights. The book is said to provide answers to questions ranging from spiritual growth to leadership to medicine.

“At a minimum people will get exposed to one of the oldest and most respected books in the world that teaches us about simultaneity--when intention intersects with our material world and produces something positive,” wrote Dr. Manulani Aluli Meyer, Konohiki (Facilitator) of Kulana o Kapolei. Meyer, along with Janice Sunouchi, a human resources specialist, are organizing the workshop. “At a maximum they will understand something deep and profound about themselves and their personal and professional lives.”

Meyer and Sunouchi last summer organized a three-hour workshop and potluck meal focused around a tournament on Hanafuda Hawai‘i. The upcoming workshop will also include time for a potluck lunch, with participants being asked to bring their favorite Chinese dish.

The event is free with I-Ching books and packets of sticks needed for the workshop provided. The organizers believe the workshop will help people develop a deeper respect for Chinese heritage and also help improve relationships.
