### UHWO Library hosts *Go for Broke* national exhibit commemorating Japanese American soldiers in World War II

From March 31 to April 11, the UH West O'ahu Library will host *Go for Broke: Japanese American Soldiers Fighting on Two Fronts*, an exhibit that tells the story of Japanese American soldiers during World War II. *Go for Broke* features photographs, oral history excerpts, and facsimiles of historic documents about the 100th, 442nd and 522nd units, and Military Intelligence Service. The exhibit explains the impact of the Nisei (second generation Japanese American) soldiers' war record on the postwar civil rights of Japanese Americans. *Go for Broke* was curated by Eric Saul whose Japanese American exhibits have been featured at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. and the Japanese American National Museum in Los Angeles. The exhibit is sponsored by the Nisei Veterans Legacy Center. Chancellor Freitas will untie a maile lei at the opening of the exhibit on Monday, March 31 at 10:30 a.m. followed by a brief overview with Curator Eric Saul.

### Nominate an outstanding faculty member for the Laulima Innovation Award

#### Eligibility

- Any faculty or instructor who uses online instructional tools in an innovative way
- The course can be online or hybrid
- The course uses at least three Laulima tools
- The course is offered at UH West O'ahu
- Faculty or instructor has not been recipient of the Laulima Technology Award within the last five years.

UH West O'ahu faculty, staff and students may nominate an instructor via a 250-word (minimum) written statement explaining why and how the course makes excellent use of technology. Faculty may self-nominate. The word definitions and translations are provided by *Puke Wehewehe*, the Hawaiian Dictionary. ‘Ōlelo no‘eau come from *‘Ōlelo No‘eau Hawaiian Proverbs and Poetical Sayings* written by Mary **Kawena** Puku‘i. The ‘ike (knowledge) shared through the literal translations and **kaona** (double meaning) are meant to provide you with a deeper understanding of our po‘e (people) and values.

### **Hua** ‘Ōlelo (word)

Aloha, aloha **pumehana**, ‘ena aloha, ho‘oheno and also **oha**, make‘e, ha‘eha‘e, **mahamaha** mean affection.

### ‘Ōlelo No‘eau (proverb)

"Aloha **mai** no, aloha **aku**; o **ka huhū ka mea e ola** ‘ole **ai**." (113)

When love is given, love should be returned; anger is the thing that gives no life.
