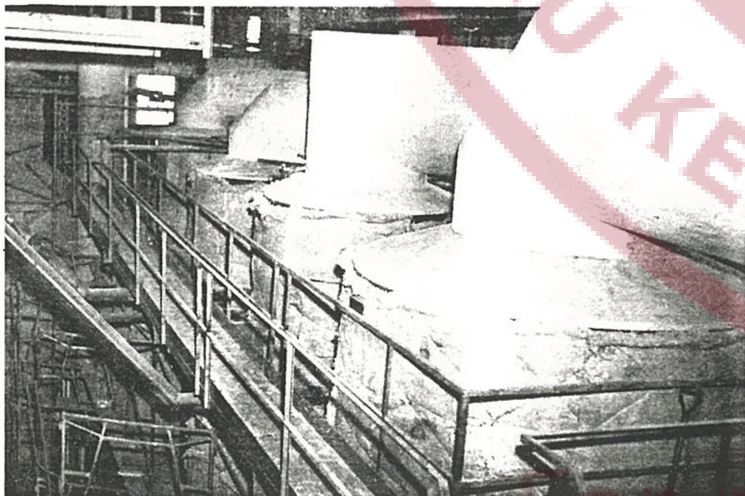
All residents of Fernandez Village are strongly urged to attend this meeting.

## Ewa Community Church News

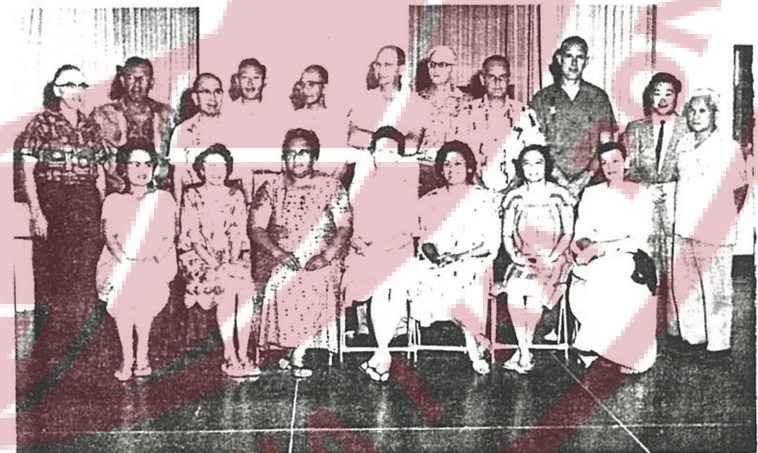
Mr. Frank Gay was elected Moderator for the year 1963 at the annual meeting of the Ewa Community Church held last Sunday night at the Parish Hall.
