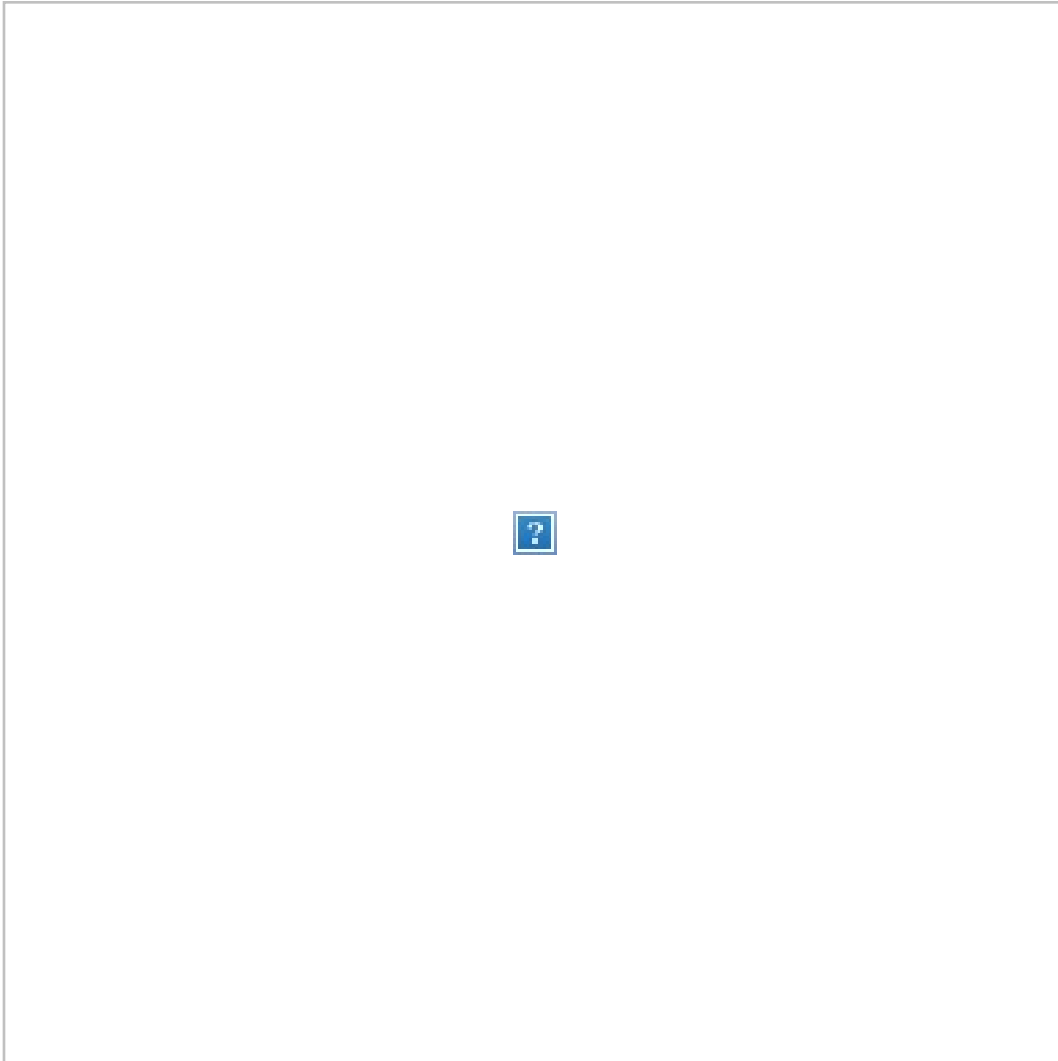

Lā Kū'oko'a to be honored Tuesday, Nov. 28, with raising of Hawaiian Flag



UHWO will be honoring Lā Kū'oko'a - considered Hawai'i's Independence Day - by raising the [Hawaiian Flag at 9 a.m. on Nov. 28](#). Gather around the flagpoles at the entrance of campus to participate in a short protocol. It marks the day that Great Britain and France signed treaties recognizing the Kingdom of Hawai'i as a sovereign nation.

- Clean up

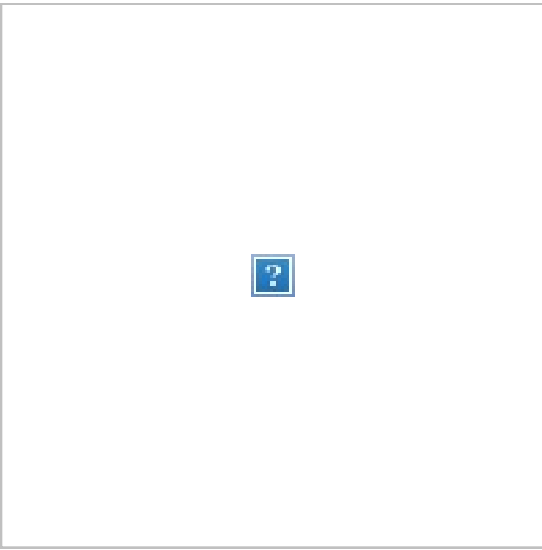

ACM production of Hawaiian-language version of Moana moving ahead

The making of a Hawaiian-language version of Moana has netted 143 would-be voice actors hoping to be cast as one of the 32 parts in the movie. About 12 dozen people responded to a casting call for fluent Hawaiian-language speakers and singers by a Nov. 17 deadline. The actors had to submit a photo, and a link to a Vimeo or YouTube video of them signing/chanting in Hawaiian along with contact information.

The production of a Hawaiian version of Moana is being managed by the Creative Media program at the UH West O'ahu, with faculty members from across the University of Hawai'i system being brought in to collaborate on behalf of the project. The Annie Award-winning star of Walt Disney Animation Studios *Moana*, Native Hawaiian Auli'i Cravalho, is reprising her role as the title character of the hit feature in Hawaiian.

Distance Learning tip of the week

Camtasia is a video-editing program that can help you create and edit recordings. Camtasia allows users to capture screen recordings, import other media files and even add music, transitions and annotations. This program also allows animations like thought bubbles which can be used to draw attention to a point. The animations can be scaled and moved within the recording. Camtasia also allows users to add effects like speeding up clips, adjusting color, and adding interactive hotspots or link that viewers can click visit websites. You can request to have this program installed on your UHWO computer by submitting an IT Request here: <https://ithelp.uhwo.hawaii.edu/portal>
