HONOLULU ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Arrival — The S. S. MARIPOSA will be abeam Diamond Head at approximately 7:30 a.m. and at the dock at Pier 10 at approximately 10:00 a.m.

Breakfast — A Deluxe Continental Breakfast will be served on the Pool Terrace from 7:00 to 8:30 and breakfast in the Dining Room will be served from 8:15 to 10:00 on an open sitting basis.

Mariposa Lounge — Your headquarters for Honolulu will be the MARIPOSA Lounge located at the Halekulani Hotel where members of the Social Staff will be your hosts. They will assist you in every way possible and direct you to changing rooms should you wish to swim or sunbathe. The Lounge will be open from 10:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

It is not necessary to take ship's towels with you when you go to the Lounge as they will be available in the changing rooms at each Lounge.

Passengers utilizing the change rooms are advised that these rooms close at the same time as the Lounge and all clothing and other personal effects should be claimed before closing time.

Your "Cruise Identification Card" is all you require to avail yourself of the Shuttle Bus Service and the MARIPOSA Lounge.

SHUTTLE BUS SERVICE

Complimentary Shuttle Bus service is offered in Honolulu between the MARIPOSA and the Halekulani Hotel in Waikiki Beach with a stop at the Ala Moana Shopping Center. The bus will be marked with an identifying sign reading "S. S. MARIPOSA SHUTTLE BUS."

Following is the bus schedule:

Last bus from Waikiki arrives at Pier at approximately 6:00 p.m.

NOTICE: Bus schedule may vary according to traffic conditions.

The Shuttle Bus will also stop at the Ala Moana Shopping Center on the way to Waikiki at approximately 10 minutes after the hour and on the way back to the pier at approximately 20 minutes before the hour.

The Shuttle Bus will depart promptly at the above hours and passengers are urged to plan to be at the bus stop several minutes prior to the scheduled departure time in order not to miss the bus.

DEBARKING PASSENGERS' INFORMATION

Baggage — Please have all baggage, except those pieces you intend to hand carry, ready for your room steward prior to going to dinner tonight. This will expedite discharge to the dock and assure early delivery from the baggage area. All baggage will be placed under a sign matching the color of your claim checks.

Breakable Items — It is strongly recommended that debarking passengers carry all breakable items such as perfumes, bottled goods, and other fragile items and do not pack them in baggage sent ashore by the conveyer system.

Hawaiian Plant Quarantine — Passengers having seeds, plants, flowers, etc., which they plan to take ashore must have them inspected prior to leaving the ship. The inspector will be located in the Purser's Foyer on Main Deck.

Hawaii Information Booth — As an "Aloha" gesture to arriving passengers, the State of Hawaii maintains an information booth on the pier on arrival. This booth is conveniently located on the upper level, just beyond the baggage claims area and those in charge will be happy to assist you.

Mail and Telegrams delivered to the ship will be held at the Purser's Office until claimed. Unclaimed mail for debarking passengers will be forwarded to your address in Hawaii.

Lost and Found — Lost articles should be reported to the Purser's Office before you leave the ship. Articles found and not claimed will be sent to Davies Marine Agencies, 608 Fort Street, Honolulu, telephone 531-8531. Found articles will be held for 30 days only.

Staterooms — One final check of your stateroom prior to going ashore may save you the inconvenience of writing at a later date for anything left behind. Please leave stateroom keys in your room.

Swimming Pool — In accordance with United States Public Health Service regulations, the swimming pool will not be filled in port.

In Port Suggestions — We suggest you lock your doors when leaving your room while the vessel is in port. We strongly recommend you take advantage of our **COMPLIMENTARY SAFE DEPOSIT BOXES** for safekeeping of money, jewelry and other valuables.

Portholes must be kept closed at all times. Open portholes affect the air conditioning system.
