






been selected for the President's Emerging Leaders Program for the 2018-2019 year.

HART rail station work continues and will result in the following disruptions this week with lane closures on Keahumoa Parkway at Kualaka'i Parkway. A single northbound and southbound lane of Keahumoa Parkway will be closed between Kualaka'i Parkway and Maunakapu Street. This closure is 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. On work days, drivers may also encounter intermittent stoppage of traffic to allow for safe crane activity above the intersection. The stoppages are expected to occur in intervals of five minutes or less.

9:30 - 12:30 p.m. Professional Development Round-Robin


12:30 3:30 p.m. Lunch, Music, and Games (please see below)


