Fidel Saragena, who was born in Argao, Cebu, Philippines arrived in Ewa with his wife, Petronilla, on December 6, 1924. Two days later he went to work in the Pump Division as Pump Operator and has been with that division continuously until his retirement - a show of steadfastness that lasted 43 years and 5 months.

Manager in Con Con Race

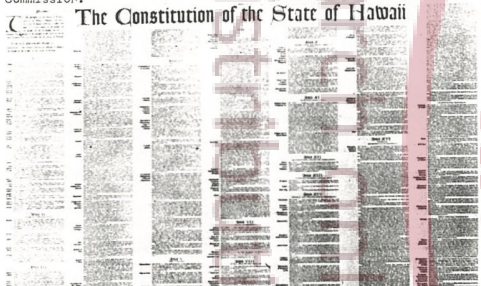

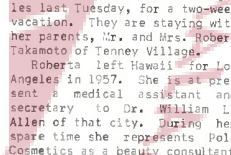
Aloha! Roberta & Hiro 4-H Fair Tomorrow

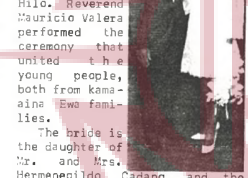
