Cushnie Attends Management Program

Bob Cushnie, Assistant Manager, is at present attending the University of Hawaii Advanced Management Program at the Kamehameha Schools in Honolulu.

The program, which started on July 6, is an intensive six-week course for business executives.



The four main subjects in the program are taught by members of the faculty of the Harvard University Graduate School of Business Administration. Other sessions are conducted by members of the University of Hawaii faculty and prominent business leaders.

This program provides opportunities for general management training with individual participation.

Water Development

Progress is being made in development of water by the Construction Department.

Ewa has a threefold need for additional water resources. First, to irrigate additional areas; second, to provide more adequately for our present crops; and third, as a conservation measure. Water levels drop dangerously in certain of our wells and salt content rises under heavy pumping during dry years. Additional water sources would permit a reduction in pumping at these wells.

During the past year three locations have been found on the plantation with a combined, estimated potential of 40-million gallons of water per day. This is considered "caprock" water which is now flowing out to sea above the artesian caprock and its use should have no adverse effect on our valuable artesian resources. These three areas are in various stages of development.

Shown in photos are two developments which are expected to be completed in about six weeks depending on delivery of equipment.

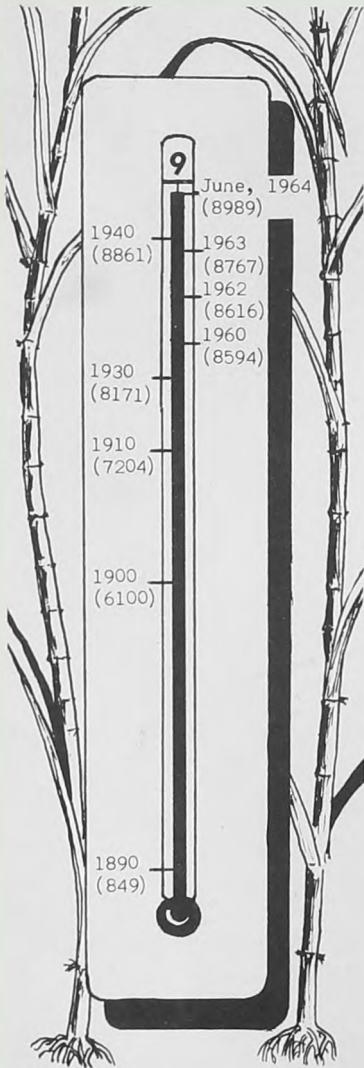

This service is for three and four year old children only. Parents who wish to have their children receive this service, should sign a consent form which is now available at the Industrial Relations Office and also at Ewa School.

There is no fee for this service.
