## ALOHA, NOT GOODBYE

Choshiro Kato, Ewa's Sheet-metal Worker Leaderman cut away the tools of his craft for the last time on Tuesday morning this week. This day closed a chapter in his life that spanned exactly fifty years and three days with the plantation.

Except for the first four years at Ewa, Kato San has worked continuously in the mechanical shops. He became a first-smith in 1939 and was promoted to Sheetmetal Worker Leaderman in October, 1939.

Of special significance was the fact that his retirement date, June 1, also marked the day his eldest son Richard, was promoted Cost Accountant in the plantation's Accounting Department.

## Safety Spells Sense

**YOU AND YOUR CAR**  
-- what everyone should know to enjoy their freedom to go!  
How long does it take to bring your car to a complete stop?  
1. PERCEPTION TIME--You must recognize the need. That's why alcohol or fatigue usually slows stopping time.  
2. PHYSICAL REACTION TIME--You must take action. I.e., apply brakes.  
3. MECHANICAL STOPPING TIME--Your car must come to a stop. Brake action and tire grip on road must bring car to a stop.

ON A DRY ROAD:

Speed	Average Stopping Distance
30 MPH	6 car lengths - 106 feet
40 "	9 " " - 160 "
50 "	13 " " - 228 "
60 "	17 " " - 314 "

(Stopping distance depends on road conditions - rain, sand, oil, etc.)

## Ewa School Holds Awards Assembly

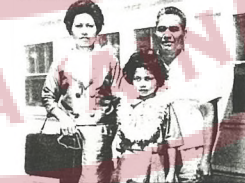
