Congratulations to UH West O'ahu Lecturer and Scientific Director of the Joint Pacific Accounting Command/Central Identification Lab at Pearl Harbor, Dr. Thomas Holland, on winning the T. Dale Stewart lifetime achievement in physical anthropology award. It is the highest award bestowed by the American Academy of Forensic Sciences. A lecturer at UH West O'ahu since 1999, Dr. Holland was instrumental in the development of the University's Certificate in Applied Forensic Anthropology. He is now on a hiatus from teaching while he pursues a degree from the UH Mānoa William S. Richardson School of Law.
