November 1	Spring 2005 application deadline for Running Start and Early Admission Program applicants.
November 15	Last day to submit spring applications. Applications submitted after this date must be approved by a manager in KISC (see below). Decisions are based on extenuating circumstances and availability of classes. (The deadline for Running Start and Early Admission Program applicants is November 1.)
November-December	Orientation sessions and registration for <u>Group A</u> (new, incoming students). Orientation information will be mailed to you when you are accepted. You are encouraged to attend an orientation session for advising and help in selecting courses.
December 1	Begin online registration for <u>Group B</u> (currently enrolled students and returning students who applied by November 15). Register on or after the assigned date and time in the appointment schedule in this booklet.
December 9	In-person registration for <u>Group C</u> (spring 2005 Running Start students).
December 9	Begin online registration for <u>Group F</u> (all students not included in groups A-E).
December 10	Tuition and payment deadline. Online tuition and fee payments must be received by 10:59 p.m. on December 10. (<i>Important: Online services are not available from 11:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m. daily.</i>) After December 11, tuition and fee payments are due on the day classes are added.
December 13	Begin in-person registration for <u>Groups A, B and F</u>.
December 24	Christmas Holiday
December 31	New Year's Holiday
January 3	Faculty report for duty.
January 6	General Faculty/Staff Meeting
January 7	Begin in-person registration for <u>Group D</u> (spring 2005 Early Admission students).
January 7	Last day to register, add, or withdraw from classes in-person without the \$5 change of registration fee. The fee is waived for adds or withdrawals submitted <u>online</u> .
January 10	Begin in-person registration for <u>Group E</u> (faculty/staff with waivers).

January 10	First day of instruction. Students registering for spring 2005 classes at any University of Hawai'i institution for the first time on or after this date will be charged a \$30 late registration fee.
January 14	Last day to register or to add and change full-semester classes. After this date, special permission from the instructor and dean or department chair is required.
January 14	Last day to withdraw from full-semester classes with 100% tuition refund.
January 17	Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday
January 30	Last day to withdraw from full-semester classes with 50% tuition refund.
January 30	Last day to withdraw from full-semester classes without a "W." A full-semester class will not appear on your transcript if you withdraw by this date. After this date, a "W" will appear on your transcript.
February 18	Last day to apply and register for credit by examination.
February 21	Presidents' Day Holiday
March 15	Last day to apply for spring graduation for AA, AS, and CA degrees. A nonrefundable fee of \$15 per diploma is payable at the time of application.
March 18	Last day to withdraw from full-semester classes, to change to credit/no credit grade option, and to request audit grade option. Complete withdrawals and grade option changes must be done in person. Not all classes are eligible for the credit/no credit option, and the change must be approved by a counselor.
March 18	Last day to remove incomplete grades for fall 2004.
March 21-25	Spring Recess
March 25	Kuhio Day and Good Friday Holiday
May 4	Last day of instruction.
May 5	Study Period
MAY 6-12	Final Examination Period
May 12	Commencement
May 18	Grades due (deadline is subject to change). End of spring semester.

NOTE: **SPECIAL TERM CLASSES** have different deadlines. They do not follow the regular 16-week semester format. They have their own add, withdrawal, and refund schedules. FIVE-STEP APPLICATION AND REGISTRATION PROCESS

STEP 1: APPLYING TO KAPI'OLANI COMMUNITY COLLEGE

AM I ELIGIBLE TO ENROLL?

Yes, you are eligible if you

- Are 18 years of age or older, or
- Have earned a high school diploma or equivalency

Note: If you're an international student or if you're applying to the Health or Legal Education Programs, there are additional requirements. For international student information, see <http://www.kcc.hawaii.edu/admission/intl.htm>; for selective admissions program information, see <http://www.kcc.hawaii.edu/admission/asap.htm>.

DO I NEED TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FORM?

Yes, you must submit an application form if you were not enrolled at any of the UH system campuses in fall 2004.

Yes, you must submit an application form if you are or were an Early Admission or Running Start student:

- Early Admission Students: High school students admitted under the Early Admission program must apply for admission each semester. The System Application Form and the Application for Early Admission should be submitted by the November 1, 2004, deadline for the spring 2005 semester.
- Running Start Students: High school students admitted under the Running Start Program must apply for admission each semester. The System Application Form and the Running Start Enrollment Form should be submitted by the November 1, 2004, deadline for the spring 2005 semester.

No, you don't need to submit an application form if you were enrolled at any campus in the UH system in fall 2004. All continuing students from the following UH campuses should not submit an application for spring 2005: University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu, University of Hawai'i at Hilo, University of Hawai'i Outreach College, Hawai'i Community College, Honolulu Community College, Kapi'olani Community College, Kaua'i Community College, Leeward Community College, Maui Community College, and Windward Community College. The entire UH system is on a single database. Thus, you are able to register for classes on any campus at which you have

been accepted without submitting additional applications. Before registering, however, review the eligibility requirements for each class and the academic calendar for the campus offering the class, paying special attention to appropriate individual campus deadlines.

WHERE CAN I GET AN APPLICATION FORM?

Copies of the UH System Application Form can be downloaded or picked up. Online, it is available at www.hawaii.edu/admissions. Download and print the form. It can also be picked up at the following locations:

- Kekaulike Information and Service Center (KISC) in 'Ilima Building, room 102 on the Kapi'olani CC campus.
- Any other UH system campus: UH Mānoa, UH West O'ahu, UH Hilo, UH Outreach College, Hawai'i CC, Honolulu CC, Kaua'i CC, Leeward CC, Maui CC, Windward CC.

WHEN IS THE APPLICATION DEADLINE?

The spring 2005 deadline is November 15, 2004. After the deadline, applications will be considered on a space-available basis and acceptance must be approved by a manager in KISC. For information on applying after the deadline, call 734.9555 or go to 'Ilima 102.

IS KAPI'OLANI CC APPROVED FOR VETERANS' EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS?

Yes, the Kapi'olani campus is approved for veterans. If you are eligible for veteran's educational benefits, visit the KISC for information and forms before registering for classes.

ARE THERE SPECIAL ACCOMMODATIONS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES?

WHAT ARE THE HEALTH CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW, RETURNING, AND TRANSFER STUDENTS?

Tuberculosis (TB) Clearance: All new, returning, and transfer students must provide documentation of TB clearance.

Without it, you will not be allowed to register. (Clearance is not required for continuing UH system students.) The following are acceptable documentation:

- * State of Hawai'i TB Clearance Certificate or other medical documentation not more than a year old clearly stating that the skin test or chest X-ray was negative, OR
- * Previous enrollment at Kapi'olani CC, or documentation of enrollment at another Hawai'i college AND State of Hawai'i TB Clearance Certificate or other medical documentation of clearance (may be more than a year old).

Measles Clearance: Measles (rubeola) clearance documentation is required for all new, out-of-system transfer, and returning students who were born after 1956 and who did not attend a high school within the State of Hawai'i. The documentation should be submitted to KISC before your date of registration.

STEP 2: PREPARING FOR REGISTRATION

WHAT CAN PREVENT ME FROM REGISTERING?

You may not be permitted to register if you have any unresolved obligation to the University of Hawai'i system. This includes but is not limited to financial, academic, and health clearance obligations that have not been met. If you

have a hold on your registration, contact the office that placed the hold. Once cleared, you will be allowed to register. You may also be prevented from registering at a specific campus if you have been dismissed from that campus.

WHICH CLASSES SHOULD I TAKE?

Review the Kapi'olani Community College Catalog, which lists program requirements and course descriptions. It is available at the Kapi'olani CC Bookstore, located below the cafeteria in 'Ohi'a 116. It is also available online at www.kcc.hawaii.edu.

See the Kapi'olani CC counselors or faculty advisors for pre-registration program information and assistance. You will receive a program planning sheet, learn how to select appropriate courses, and learn how to transfer to another college or work toward a degree or certificate. Although counselors and advisors are also available during the registration period, you should make it a point to see them before you begin the registration process. If your placement test scores placed you in a math or English class below the 100-level, you may also see the Holomua counselors.

Attend a program-advising session. These sessions are for new as well as continuing, transfer, or returning students. From the table below, select the major that best meets your interests or degree goals. For example, if you are a Liberal Arts major but intend to earn a Nursing degree, contact the Nursing advisors.

DO I MEET COURSE REQUIREMENTS?

Carefully review the courses you intend to take before registering to make sure that you have satisfied all course requirements. All prerequisites, co-requisites, English and math placement test requirements, and/or special approvals will be enforced during the registration process.

- * If you have taken the COMPASS placement test at another UH community college within 2 years of the first day of instruction for the semester, you may be asked to provide documentation of test results for classes with COMPASS requirements.
- * If you have not completed college coursework in English or math, have not taken the COMPASS placement test, or have COMPASS test scores that are two or more years old, you need to take the COMPASS test. (See COMPASS placement test information below.)
- * If you are enrolled in a fall term class that serves as a prerequisite, you may register for the higher-level course for the subsequent spring semester. However, if you fail to satisfactorily complete the prerequisite, you must immediately withdraw from the higher-level course before the subsequent semester begins.
- * On the first day of class, instructors may require proof that you have met the prerequisites. If you have not, they may ask you to withdraw from the class. Furthermore, the college reserves the right to disenroll students from English and math classes if they do not meet the prerequisites.
- * To register for classes requiring "Instructor Approval," you must contact the instructor and obtain his/her approval before registering.

WHAT ARE THE PREREQUISITES FOR ENGLISH CLASSES?

One of the following is required for enrollment in any English, ESL, or ESOL language (writing, reading, speaking) course:

- * Satisfactory COMPASS placement test scores less than 2 years old. (See COMPASS placement test information below.)
- * Completion of the prerequisite course with a grade of C or higher, a recommendation from the instructor of the prerequisite course, or a grade of D in a course equivalent to the desired course taken at another postsecondary institution.

All Writing Intensive (WI) classes require completion of ENG 100, ESL 100, ESL 160 or an equivalent course with a grade of C or higher.

Students who have taken the prerequisite course at a school outside the University of Hawai'i system must be prepared to show one of the following at the time of registration:

- * From the other school—a grade report or personal copy of an academic transcript, showing completion of the equivalent course (with a D or higher), along with a catalog course description.
- * A copy of an official Kap'olani CC transcript evaluation (or English placement approval), showing completion of the prerequisite course.

WHAT ARE THE PREREQUISITES FOR MATH CLASSES?

One of the following is required for enrollment in any Kap'olani CC math course:

- * Satisfactory COMPASS placement test scores less than 2 years old. (See COMPASS placement test information below.)
- * Completion of the prerequisite course with a grade of C or higher, or a grade of D in a course equivalent to the desired course taken at another postsecondary institution.

Students who have taken the placement test or prerequisite course at another school must be prepared to show one of the following at the time of registration:

- * A current placement test recommendation from another UH community college.
- * A grade report or personal copy of an academic transcript from another school showing completion of the prerequisite course (C or higher), along with a catalog course description if the course was taken outside of Hawai'i. The catalog course description must include the courses sequenced before and after the course to be reviewed.
- * A copy of an official Kap'olani CC transcript evaluation (or math placement approval), showing the completion of the prerequisite course.

WHAT IS THE COMPASS ENGLISH OR MATH PLACEMENT TEST, AND HOW DO I TAKE IT?

English or math placement testing is required for students who have not completed previous college coursework in these subjects. Computerized testing is available on a walk-in basis to all current Kap'olani CC students and students accepted for future terms. Results are available immediately after the

test is completed. The approximate duration of the test is 1.5 to 3.0 hours. A photo I.D. and verification of your Social Security Number are required. Call 808.734.9144 for information on testing dates and times, or go to the testing center in 'Iliahi 127.

CAN I RETAKE A PLACEMENT TEST?

- The results of a placement test are valid for two years.
- You may retake a placement test after 120 days.
- You cannot retake an English, math, or language placement test while enrolled in the class for which the test was first taken.
- You cannot retake an English, math, or language placement test if you received a grade of A, B, C, D, CR, or P in the class for which the test was first taken. However, you have the option to repeat a course in which you received a grade of D.
- You may retake the placement test if you received a grade of F, NC, NP, or W in the English, math, or language course for which the test was first taken. However, you must wait until the test results are more than two years old and no longer valid.

WHAT ARE THE PREREQUISITES FOR FOREIGN OR HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE CLASSES?

Language placement testing is required for all students planning to enroll in a foreign or Hawaiian language course beyond the 101-level but have not completed the college-level prerequisite course. Testing is also required for students with previous knowledge or experience in the language they plan to study.

The test may also be taken by students seeking a waiver of the AA-degree foreign language requirement on the basis of proficiency in the language.

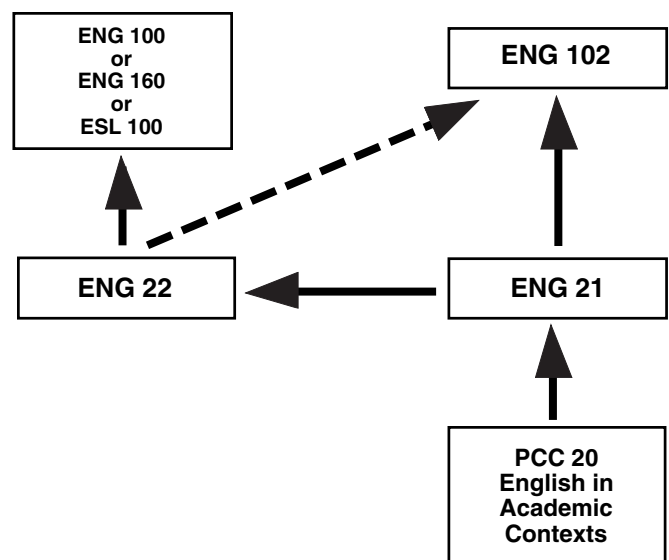

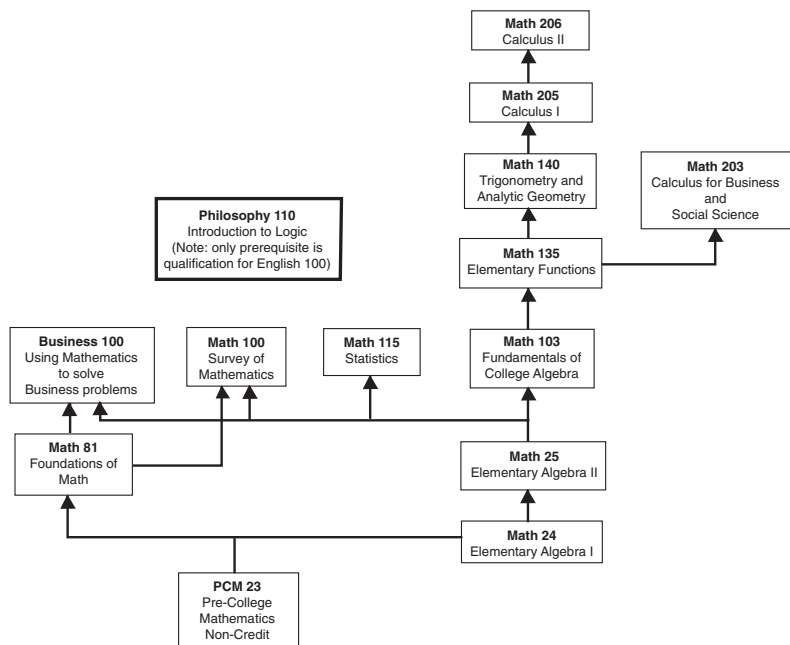
Testing time is about 45 minutes. A photo I.D. and verification of your Social Security Number are required. Call 808.734-9144 for information on testing dates and times, or go to the testing center in 'Iliahi 127.

SEQUENCE OF ENGLISH COURSES

Your initial English course will be determined by your scores on the COMPASS assessment. COMPASS tests both your reading and your writing skills. Placement in ENG 100 requires a COMPASS Reading Test score above 77 and a COMPASS Writing Test score above 73.

If you have satisfactorily completed an English course at Kapi'olani Community College or another University of Hawai'i Community College, you may continue to the next level on the flowchart.





SEQUENCE OF MATH COURSES

Your initial MATH course will be determined by your scores on the COMPASS assessment. After you have satisfactorily completed a mathematics course at Kapi'olani Community College or another University of Hawai'i Community College, you may continue to the next level on the flowchart. If you earn a "D" or "F" grade in a math course you must repeat the course and earn a grade of "C" or higher if you want to continue to the next level math course. A scientific calculator is required in all math courses except those indicated with an asterisk (*).

* A graphing calculator (TI - 83 preferred) is required for these courses. Some MATH 103 sections may require a graphing calculator.

WHAT ARE THE ALTERNATIVES TO THE STANDARD LETTER GRADE?

Audit Option. To enroll as an auditor, you must obtain the instructor's or department chair's approval on the Change of Registration Form. Auditors may switch to credit status after registration with the instructor's approval. Students taking the class for credit may also switch to audit. The deadline to make this change is March 18, and it must be done in person. Auditors pay regular tuition and fees. Note: Audited classes will not be graded or counted in determining a student's part- or full-time status.

Credit-by-Exam Option. See the policy in the Kapi'olani CC Catalog. Contact the appropriate department chair for further information and the application form. Application and registration for this option must be completed within the first six weeks of the semester. (Within the first two weeks for special term classes.) The deadline to register for credit-by-exam for full-semester classes is February 18, and the registration must be done in person. Standard course tuition and fees will apply. These credits are not counted in determining a student's part- or full-time status. Credit-by-exam is not an option for courses in which a person is currently enrolled as a regular student.

Credit/No-Credit Option. Students choosing this option will receive a "CR" grade for work deserving a letter grade of "C" or higher. They will receive an "NC" for work below the "C" level. "CR" and "NC" grades are not included in the computation of grade point averages. Standard course tuition and fees will apply. The CR/NC option can be specified at the time of registration, or it can be processed (in person only) as a switch from grade to CR/NC during the withdrawal period. Although a counselor's approval is not required for this option, it is highly recommended. CR/NC is not an option for courses that are part of a student's general education and major requirements. (Some courses in these categories, however, have mandatory credit/no-credit grading. Refer to the Kapi'olani Community College Catalog.) Before selecting this option, students expecting to transfer to a four-year college should study that institution's policy regarding CR/NC grades.

STEP 3: REGISTERING ONLINE OR IN PERSON

WHEN AND HOW DO I REGISTER?

IF YOU ARE A . . .

- * Continuing or returning Kapi'olani CC student: You have the option to register online or in person. Registration information will be mailed to you. You may register online on your own computer or in any of the open computer labs (see below for list of open labs).
- * Continuing student from another UH system campus: You may register for Kapi'olani CC classes without submitting a new admissions application. Follow the registration instructions issued to you by your home institution. Because Kapi'olani CC may have additional campus-specific registration information, be sure to attend a program advising session or contact a counselor.
- * Transfer student from a non-UH system campus, who is not currently enrolled at Kapi'olani CC or any other UH campus, and you've applied to and been accepted by Kapi'olani CC for the spring 2005 semester: You may register online beginning December 1 (see the chart for online registration appointments) or in person, following the in-person registration instructions.
- * New student, attending college for the first time (including those who attended college as former Running Start or Early Admission students): You will receive course and registration information at the New Student Orientation-Advising Session. Dates and times for these sessions will be sent to you. They will cover how to select courses based on your COMPASS Placement Test scores. They will also cover the use of advising and registration worksheets as well as procedures for online registration.
- * Student in the Running Start program for spring 2005: You may register in person on December 9. Orientation and registration information will be mailed to you.
- * Student in the Early Admission program for spring 2005: You may register online or in person beginning January 7. (A \$30 late registration fee will be assessed if you register January 10-14.)
- * Faculty or Staff member with tuition waiver: Register in person January 10-14.

HOW DO I REGISTER?

Here's a quick overview. More detailed explanations are given below.

- * Using the Schedule of Classes, identify the classes you wish to take.
- * Make sure that you meet the requirements for the courses you've selected.
- * Complete a registration worksheet, including the campus and the Course Reference Numbers (CRN). See the example below.
- * Select alternate classes, in case your first choices are not available, and add them to the worksheet.
- * If you need help, see an advisor or counselor well in advance of your registration time.
- * To see if the classes you've selected are open or closed, go to <http://www.hawaii.edu/myuh/listing.htm#5>

Classes are closed when enrollment limits are reached. If a class is closed, see or contact the course instructor for approval to override the limit. Instructors are not required to respond to or honor your request. They usually have good reasons for refusing overloads.

Special instructions for Holomua classes (PCM 23; MATH 24, 25 AND 81; PCC 20; ENG 21, 22 and 102; LSK 97G): Late registration is not recommended, and course overloads are generally not permitted. Requests for overloads due to extenuating circumstances should be directed to the department chair, Jill Abbott, in 'Iliahi 231B, phone 734.9450.

INFORMATION FOR ONLINE AND IN-PERSON REGISTRATION

WHAT ABOUT LATE REGISTRATION?

If you are not able to register during the regular registration periods, you may do so during the late registration periods listed below. A late registration fee (\$30) will be charged for any Spring 2005 registration on or after January 10 (even for special term classes that do not begin until later in the semester).

NOTE: SPECIAL TERM CLASSES have different deadlines. They do not follow the regular 16-week semester format. They have their own add, withdrawal, and refund schedules. Go to <http://www.kcc.hawaii.edu/register/images/partofterm.pdf> or contact KISC for schedules. (The \$30 late registration fee will be assessed for registration on or after January 10, 2005, for any spring 2005 class, including special term classes that begin later in the semester.)

IF I REGISTER LATE FOR A CLASS, WILL I NEED TO MAKE UP THE MISSED WORK?

Yes. You are responsible for obtaining information about the classes you've missed and for making up work and assignments as required by the instructor or as specified in the class syllabus or schedule.

WILL I GET A RECEIPT AND CLASS SCHEDULE?

If you register online, you have the option to print your class schedule and payment receipt from the webpage.

If you register in person and pay in full, you will be given a copy of your class schedule and payment receipt.

Be sure to verify that the classes and campuses are listed correctly. Keep the schedule and statement with you at all times.

Duplicate copies are available from the KISC Cashier's Office for a \$2 fee.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CLASS IS CANCELED?

When classes are canceled, the college will make every effort to notify you by mail. Notices will also be posted at the scheduled meeting place for the canceled classes.

You will be able to replace a canceled class without being charged the \$5 processing fee. This procedure must be done in person. Inform the registration clerk that the class was canceled. If you don't replace a canceled class, you will receive a 100% tuition refund.

STEP 4: ADDING AND WITHDRAWING FROM CLASSES (Change of Registration)

CAN I WITHDRAW FROM OR ADD CLASSES AFTER I'VE REGISTERED?

Yes. You may make changes to your schedule after your initial registration, but be sure to observe the deadlines on the calendar at the front of this booklet. Beginning January 10, a \$5 fee will be assessed for each registration transaction made in person; however, there will be no charge for the same transactions completed online.

WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES OF WITHDRAWING FROM CLASSES?

Withdrawals from full-semester classes processed by January 30 will not appear on your transcript. Special-term classes have different deadlines, and these are available from the instructor or at Kekaulike Information and Service Center.

Withdrawals from full-semester classes processed between January 31 and March 18 will appear on your transcript as a "W." Different dates apply for special-term classes.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I STOP ATTENDING CLASSES BUT DON'T OFFICIALLY WITHDRAW?

You will receive a failing grade if you do not officially withdraw from a class that you don't attend. All withdrawals must be completed by the official deadline. If you have a valid reason for temporarily missing a class, inform the instructor or department chair.

WHAT ARE THE DEADLINES FOR WITHDRAWING FROM OR ADDING CLASSES?

Refer to the calendar at the front of this booklet for the add and withdrawal deadlines for full-term classes. Deadlines for withdrawal from special term classes may be obtained from KISC.

CAN I WITHDRAW FROM CLASSES AFTER THE DEADLINE?

Yes, but only if the circumstances prompting withdrawal are beyond your control. Contact KISC for more information.

HOW DO I ADD OR WITHDRAW FROM CLASSES ONLINE?

1. Go to <http://myuhportal.hawaii.edu> and follow the login instructions.
2. Select "Registration."
3. Select "Add or Drop a Class."
4. Confirm that you have withdrawn from the class by clicking on "My Class Schedule."
5. Print and review your new schedule.

NOTE: Online withdrawals from your last class at your home institution are prohibited. If Kapi'olani Community College is your home institution (the college from which you are seeking a degree or certificate or receiving financial aid), you must come, in person, to Kekaulike Information and Service Center in 'Ilima 102 to withdraw from your last class (or all of your classes).

HOW DO I COMPLETELY WITHDRAW FROM ALL MY CLASSES AT KCC?

This process must be done in person by the dates indicated in the calendar for full-term classes. Dates for special term classes are available at KISC. If you're a Title IV fund-financial aid-recipient, see the Return of Title IV Funds Policy in the appendix.

EXPLANATION OF REGISTRATION FEES IN TABLE ABOVE

Student Publication and Activity Fee: All full- or part-time students will be assessed a student publications fee of \$10 per semester. Full-time students will also be charged a student activities fee of \$20 per semester; part-time students will be assessed \$2 per credit up to \$20.

Late Registration Fee: Students who first register for spring 2005 classes on or after January 10, 2005 will be charged a late registration fee of \$30 (even if registering for special term classes that begin later in the semester).

Change of Registration Fee: Students making in-person changes to their class schedule (including changing grade modes) on or after the first day of instruction will be assessed a \$5 fee. Failure to pay this fee will result in a hold on future changes, registrations, and transcripts. Online registration changes will not incur this fee.

DO I NEED TO BE AWARE OF OTHER FEES?

Graduation Fee: A nonrefundable fee of \$15 for each diploma is payable at the time you apply for a degree or Certificate of Achievement. If you are denied graduation, the fee may be applied to a subsequent graduation application. Proof of payment is required.

Returned Check Fee: Returned checks are subject to a \$15 service fee per check plus interest. Students will have ten working days after receiving notification to clear their financial obligation. The college will place a financial hold on the students' records until the obligations are removed.

Parking Citation Fee: Students receiving parking citations should pay their fines immediately to avoid a financial obligation. Payments should be made at the KISC Cashier's Office.

Transcript Fee: For hard copies of academic transcripts, the fee for each copy is \$3. For transfers within the University of Hawai'i system, transcripts are not required. All 10-campus are on a single database and are able to secure advising transcripts online. However, at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, only the undergraduate and graduate division admissions office will accept the online transcripts. Admission to special schools, such as law, nursing, and medical, requires hardcopy transcripts. There is a \$10 fee for all transcripts processed on a "rush" basis. Allow 2 business days for a "rush" transcript, and 5-7 days for regular processing.

Nonresident Admission Application Fee: An application fee of \$25 is charged to non-Hawai'i residents who apply for entrance to the University of Hawai'i system.

Duplicate Class Schedule and Statement Fee: There is a \$2 charge for duplicate statements from the KISC Cashier.

HOW CAN I PAY MY TUITION AND FEES?

Tuition and fees must be paid IN FULL by the deadlines on the payment schedule below. No deferments or partial payments will be accepted.

- (A) You can pay your tuition and fees online using MasterCard® or Visa®. Online services are not available 11:00 p.m. - 2:00 a.m. daily.
- (B) Payment can also be made in person at the Cashier's Office in the KISC with MasterCard(r) or Visa(r), in cash (US dollars only), or with check or money order (payable to Kapi'olani Community College).

WHAT STEPS SHOULD I TAKE IF I HAVE A TUITION WAIVER?

If you have a tuition waiver, be prepared to provide a confirmation letter or form at the cashier's window. Conditions for the different types of waivers vary:

Institutional Tuition Waiver: Students receiving tuition waivers from Kapi'olani CC will have their tuition, but not fees, waived by the Financial Aid Office. Students who obtain waivers after they paid their tuition will receive a refund 6-8 weeks after classes begin.

Faculty and Staff Waiver: University of Hawai'i faculty and staff attending Kapi'olani CC on a tuition waiver will register in person at KISC during the late registration period beginning January 10. They must present an approved waiver at that time.

Other Waivers: Students with DVR, VA, Alu Like, and other waivers must present a confirmation letter or purchase order at the time of registration. Patrons may mail the documents to KISC Cashier's Office (4303 Diamond Head Road, 'Ilima 102, Honolulu, HI 96816) prior to registration. The student's identification number, name, etc. must be on the document.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I HAVE A FINANCIAL AID AWARD?

Most financial aid awards will be credited directly to your student account 10 days prior to the first day of instruction. Refer to the "Financial Aid Award Letter Literature" document that was included with the original award letter. The registration process must be completed before the funds can be released into your account.

If the financial aid funds credited to your account are in excess of your tuition and fee charges, a refund check will be mailed to you within 14 days. To ensure that the check is mailed to the correct address, review your mailing information on MyUH (<http://myuhportal.hawaii.edu/cp/home/login/>). Update the address if it is incorrect.

Per federal regulations, federal financial aid awards can only be applied to tuition and fees that are assessed by your home institution. If you are enrolled in courses at a campus other than your home institution, you must pay for these classes separately by cash, check, or credit card. The balance of your awards will be refunded to you.

WHAT ARE THE DEADLINES FOR TUITION AND FEE PAYMENTS?

The deadline for payment of tuition and fees depends on when you register for (or add) classes:

If you register (during the period)...	payment of tuition and fees is due...

Between December 11, 2004- January 9, 2005	The same day you register
On or after January 10, 2005 (late registration)	The same day you register

IMPORTANT: THE FOLLOWING POLICY APPLIES TO ALL STUDENTS:

WHAT HAPPENS IF I FAIL TO MEET MY PAYMENT DEADLINE FOR TUITION AND FEES?

Failure to pay tuition and fees in full by the deadline may result in disenrollment from all Kapi'olani CC classes for the

semester. To be reinstated, you must re-register and pay in full on the day you register. Registration will be based on courses available at that time, and applicable late fees will be assessed.

However, once instruction begins for spring 2005 (January 10), you will not be automatically disenrolled. Thus, if you do not intend to complete a course, you must officially withdraw from it. If you do not, a financial obligation will be placed on your record and you will receive a failing grade for the course.

If you fail to settle your financial obligations (for example, tuition and fees, parking citations, library fines, locker fees, laboratory breakage charges, transcript fees, loans past due) you may be denied grade records, transcripts, diplomas, refunds, and future registration.

WHAT IS KAPI'OLANI CC'S POLICY ON REFUNDS?

Tuition Refund for Full-Semester and Special-Term Classes:
If a student withdraws from one or more full-semester or special-term classes, tuition is refunded according to a designated formula. All refunds are calculated as of the date the withdrawal is received in person or online.

Last day to drop classes for 100% tuition refund	January 14*
Last day to drop classes for 50% tuition refund	January 30*
PCC 20 and PCM 23 100% refund deadline	January 9*

***These dates apply to full semester classes only. Special-term classes (shorter than a full semester) have separate schedules.** See <http://www.kcc.hawaii.edu/register/images/partofterm.pdf> or contact KISC for registration, withdrawal and tuition refund deadlines for special-term classes.

Student Activity and Publication Fees Refund:

- Complete withdrawal within the first two weeks of instruction: 100% refund
- Complete withdrawal after the first two weeks of instruction: No refund
- Refunds of less than one dollar will not be made.

NOTE: Student Activity and Publication fees will be refunded only if you completely withdraw from ALL University of Hawai'i classes—not just the Kapi'olani CC classes—for the semester.

Refunds for PCC and PCM Class Fees: Full refunds will not be made once classes begin. The last day for a full refund is January 9. Partial refunds may be allowed in cases where it is determined that the student was not appropriately placed or for extenuating medical emergencies that result in the student being unable to attend the class during the first week of the semester. Students should contact Department Chair Jill Abbott at 734.9450 and provide necessary written documentation. The Chair's decision is final. The deadline for such appeals is January 14. No exceptions will be made after this date.

Refunds for Canceled Classes: If a class is canceled, students will be automatically dropped from the class and credited 100% of their tuition for the class. Student Activity fee refund amounts will vary depending on the student's total credit load.

Financial Aid Repayment and Refunds:

- Students who change their registration from the enrollment status on which their award was made may be required to repay all or part of the financial aid. A recalculation of awards based on federal guidelines will be done to determine if repayment is necessary. Financial aid overaward repayments will be made in accordance with federal guidelines.
- Students who completely withdraw from school, see "Return of Title IV Funds Policy" in the Appendix.

Credit Balance Refunds: Students showing a credit balance in their KCC accounts will be refunded after the end of the refund period. A check will be mailed to the address on file in the business office. Refunds for payments made by charge cards will be credited to the charge card account. Once Kapi'olani Community College releases the charge credit to the bank, it is not responsible for the bank's method of processing the charge credit. This process takes 4-6 weeks. Outstanding financial obligations will further delay the processing of refunds.

OTHER QUESTIONS

HOW DO I FIND OUT WHAT MY GRADES ARE FOR THE SEMESTER?

Final grades are available through <http://myuhportal.hawaii.edu> about one week after the final examination period ends. No final grades will be mailed to you automatically. If you would like a copy of your semester grades, you must make this request in person at KISC and pay a \$2 fee per copy. Phone 808.734.9555 or email kapinfo@hawaii.edu for more information.

HOW DO I GET A TRANSCRIPT?

For hard copies of academic transcripts, complete and submit the "Transcript Request Form" to KISC. The form may be obtained from KISC or downloaded from <http://www.kcc.hawaii.edu/support/forms/index.htm> (click the PDF icon next to Transcript Request Form). The fee for each copy is \$3 (processing time 5-7 business days). There is a \$10 fee for all transcripts processed on a "RUSH" basis (processing time 2 business days).

DO I NEED TRANSCRIPTS TO TRANSFER TO OTHER CAMPUSES IN THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I SYSTEM?

Generally, students do not need to request that their transcripts be sent to another campus within the University of Hawai'i system for transfer purposes (admission, transcript evaluation). All 10 campuses are on a single database and staff members are able to secure advising transcripts online. (However, at the University of Hawai'i at M_noa, only the undergraduate Admissions & Records Office and the Graduate Division Admissions Office will accept the online transcripts. Admission to special schools, such as Law, Nursing and Medicine, require hard copy transcripts.)

HOW WILL I RECEIVE OFFICIAL NOTICES FROM KAPI'OLANI COMMUNITY COLLEGE ABOUT REGISTRATION INFORMATION AND DEADLINES, AND CLASS-RELATED MESSAGES FROM FACULTY, STAFF AND STUDENTS?

Official notices and class-related messages will be sent via email to your hawaii.edu address. To create an email account, go to www.kcc.hawaii.edu and click on the link to MyUH Online (the University of Hawai'i system online student portal). Then click on * **Get a UH username!** and follow the directions to set up your account.

DOES KAPI'OLANI CC OFFER FINANCIAL AID?

Yes. Financial assistance in the form of scholarships, grants, and loans is available to qualified students. Applications and information are available at the Kekaulike Information and Service Center and at www.kcc.hawaii.edu. Refer to the KCC General Catalog for a complete description of the Financial Aid Program and policies.

WHERE CAN I PURCHASE TEXTBOOKS AND SUPPLIES?

Go to the **Kapi'olani Community College Bookstore**. It is located on the ground floor of the 'Ohi'a building, room 116 (below the cafeteria). For the hours of operation, see the schedule below. You are urged to buy your textbooks during the first two weeks of the semester. The Bookstore does not guarantee that all books will be available throughout the term.

- The Bookstore is also on the Web at <http://www.bookstore.hawaii.edu>. Ordering books online is a convenient way to avoid waiting in long lines at the Bookstore. Books will be mailed to you via UPS, or you may pick them up on campus.
- Airmail costs will be added for books ordered from publishers through the Bookstore after the dates indicated below.
- The Bookstore will accept MasterCard® or Visa® charge cards from customers who have their signature on the back of the card. The Bookstore will not accept parents' charge cards if the authorized signature is not the student's.

APPENDIX

STUDENT REGULATIONS

STUDENT CONDUCT CODE

Conduct expected of students at Kapi'olani Community College is defined in the University of Hawai'i Board of Regents' Statement on Rights and Responsibilities of the University of Hawai'i Community Student Conduct Code. Kapi'olani Community College has a Code of Student Conduct that defines expected conduct for students and specifies those acts subject to University sanctions.

Student Conduct Committee: Students should become familiar with the Code of Student Conduct. As UH/ Kapi'olani Community College students, their conduct is subject to the policies and regulations of the University and its duly constituted bodies. Disciplinary authority is exercised through the Student Conduct Committee. The committee follows procedures for hearing allegations of misconduct. Copies of the Student Conduct Code are available at the Office of the Dean of Student Services, 'Ilima 205.

Academic Dishonesty, Cheating, and Plagiarism: Academic dishonesty cannot be condoned by the University. Dishonesty includes cheating and plagiarism; it is a violation of the Student Conduct Code and may result in expulsion from the University.

Cheating includes but is not limited to giving unauthorized help during an examination, obtaining unauthorized information about an examination before it is administered, using inappropriate sources of information during an examination, altering the record of any grades, altering answers after an examination has been submitted, falsifying any official UH record, and misrepresenting the facts in order to obtain exemptions from course requirements.

Plagiarism includes but is not limited to submitting any document, to satisfy an academic requirement, that has been copied in whole or part from another individual's work without identifying that individual; neglecting to identify as a quotation a documented idea that has not been assimilated into the student's language and style, or paraphrasing a passage so closely that the reader is misled as to the source; submitting the same written or oral material in more than one course without obtaining authorization from the instructors involved; or dry-labbing, which includes (a) obtaining and using experimental data from other students without the express consent of the instructor, (b) utilizing experimental data and laboratory write-ups from other sections of the course or from previous terms during which

the course was conducted, and (c) fabricating data to fit the expected results.

Disruptive Behavior: Kapi'olani Community College defines disruptive behavior as speech or action that (1) is disrespectful, offensive, and/or threatening; (2) interferes with the learning activities of other students; (3) impedes the delivery of college services; and/or (4) has a negative impact in any learning environment—including department and staff offices, the library, the Computing Center, the Learning Assistance Centers, labs, clinical sites, service-learning sites, etc. Disruptive behavior includes physically or verbally harassing, threatening, or abusing or acting abusively toward an instructor, staff member, or student in any activity authorized by the College.

Disciplinary actions that the College may impose include a formal warning, probation, suspension, and dismissal. An instructor referring a student for disciplinary action does so under the provisions of the Student Conduct Code. The code stipulates that the Chancellor may impose disciplinary sanctions upon a student only after a Student Conduct Committee hearing has taken place. However, disruptive students may be subject to immediate disciplinary action in an emergency situation. In such cases, the Chancellor may impose the sanction of suspension prior to a hearing. For further information, please refer to the Student Conduct Code available at the Office of the Dean of Student Services, 'Ilima 205.

Lethal Weapons: Firearms, spear guns, and bows and arrows are prohibited on campus except with specific prior permission of the Chancellor.

Smoking: In accordance with the state's No Smoking Act, Act 108, SLH 1976 and Act 245, SLH 1987, and University Policy, smoking is prohibited in all of the classrooms, laboratories, conference rooms, and other covered structures of the College.

Illicit Drugs and Alcohol: This official notice, by the University of Hawai'i Office of the President, is issued pursuant to the requirements of the federal Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1989 and the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988.

In conformance with the existing law, University faculty, staff, and students are not permitted to manufacture, distribute, possess, use, dispense, or be under the influence of illegal drugs and/or alcohol as prohibited by state and federal law, at University-sponsored or approved events or on University property or in buildings used by the University for education, research, or recreational programs. Consistent with its mission, the University will cooperate with law enforcement agencies responsible for enforcing laws related to

the use of illegal drugs and alcohol. Students found in violation of these laws shall be subject to the provisions of the Student Conduct Code. Faculty and staff found in violation of these laws are subject to disciplinary action as provided in collective bargaining agreements, University policy, and other applicable state laws and rules.

The University recognizes that substance abuse is a complex problem that is not easily resolved solely by personal effort and may require professional assistance and/or treatment. Students, faculty, and staff members with substance abuse problems are encouraged to take advantage of available diagnostic, referral, counseling, and prevention services. The University will not excuse misconduct by employees and students whose judgment is impaired due to substance abuse. The purchase, possession, or consumption of alcoholic beverages is regulated by state law. Students are expected to know and abide by these laws and University rules and regulations governing the use and consumption of alcoholic beverages on campus. For further information, students are referred to Board of Regents policy, executive policies, and campus guidelines regulating the use and consumption of alcoholic beverages on campus.

Students are not permitted to be under the influence of, possess, manufacture, distribute, or sell illicit drugs, as prohibited by state law, at University-sponsored events, on University property, or in buildings used by the University for its educational or recreational programs. Reasonable suspicion of possession or use of illegal drugs and substances on campus may subject the students involved to investigation.

Sanctions that may be imposed on violators of the alcohol and drug related sections of the Student Conduct Code include disciplinary warning, probation, suspension, expulsion, or rescission of grades or degree. Copies of the full text of the code and the Hawai'i Penal Code are available in the Office of the Dean of Student Services, 'Ilima 205.

College-sponsored activities on campus that involve either the serving or selling of alcoholic beverages must be in compliance with applicable College/University policies and state law.

Copies of policies governing the possession, consumption, serving, and sale of alcoholic beverages on the University of Hawai'i Kapi'olani Community College campus are available in the Office of the Dean of Student Services, 'Ilima 205.

POLICY ON SEXUAL HARASSMENT

It is the policy of the College to provide a safe and comfortable learning and working environment for students and employees. Sexual harassment is a form of discrimination that can undermine the foundation of trust and mutual respect that must prevail if the University is to fulfill its educational mission. Sexual harassment will not be tolerated in any part of the University's programs and activities. Sanctions will be imposed on members of the University community who violate this policy. Disciplinary actions against employees will be subject to the collective bargaining agreements. For more information, please contact the Office of the Dean of Student Services or the Personnel Officer.

SEXUAL ASSAULT POLICY

In conjunction with the University of Hawai'i Community Colleges' commitment to ensuring a safe and secure environment of learning for all students and staff, Kapi'olani Community College recognizes the serious issues concerning sexual assault on the members of the campus community.

The College will not tolerate acts of sexual assault and has established a policy that specifies those acts subject to University sanctions. In addition, the College offers information on programs designed to inform students and employees about the prevention of crime and sex offenses.

As required by the Higher Education Amendments of 1992, the College has a Sexual Assault Policy that explains the College's Sexual Assault Prevention Program presented to promote awareness of rape, acquaintance rape, and other sex offenses and the procedures for reporting offenses. GRIEVANCES

The process of addressing allegations of misconduct or acts of discrimination is described in the procedures for Handling Impermissible Behavior and the Academic Grievance Procedures and in CCCM No. 2210 UH Community College Procedure and Guidelines Relating to Complaints of Discrimination. Copies are available at the Student Services Office, 'Ilima 205.

Concerned students may first attempt to resolve the grievance on an informal level with the faculty member. Should the grievance not be resolved at this level, they then ask the appropriate department chair to review the case. If a satisfactory solution is not reached, appeal to the Office of Dean of Instruction may be made. If satisfactory solution is still not reached, students have the right to request a hearing before the Academic Grievance Committee, a body of faculty and students. The decisions of the Academic Grievance Committee are final within the University.

THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT

Pursuant to Section 99.6 of the rules and regulations governing the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (hereinafter the Act), students in attendance at the University of Hawai'i Kapi'olani Community College are hereby notified of the following: It is the policy of Kapi'olani Community College to subscribe to the requirements of Section 438 of the General Education Provision Act, Title IV, of Public Law 90-247, as amended, and to the rules and regulations governing the Act, which protect the privacy rights of students. The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords students certain rights with respect to their education records. They are:

1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the University receives a request for access.

Students should submit to the registrar, dean, or other appropriate official, written requests that identify the record(s) they wish to inspect. The University official will make arrangements for access and notify them of the time and place for the inspection. If the records are not maintained by the University official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall direct students to the appropriate party.

2. The right to request an amendment to education records that a student believes are inaccurate or misleading.

Students may ask the College to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the official responsible for the record, clearly

identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the University decides not to amend the record as requested, it will notify students of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing. At that time, additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the students.

3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

An exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the University in an administrative, supervisory, academic or research, or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the College has contracted (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent); a person serving on the Board of Trustees; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting other school officials in performing their tasks. School officials have a legitimate educational interest if they need to review a record to fulfill a professional responsibility.

4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the University to comply with the requirements of FERPA. 5. Institutional policy and procedures required under FERPA have been published as Administrative Procedure A7.022 Procedures Relating to Protection of the Education Rights and Privacy of Students. Copies of Administrative Procedure A7.022 may be obtained from the Office of Dean of Students, 'Ilima 205, Kapi'olani Community College.
6. Directory Information: Certain personally identifiable information is considered by the University to be directory information and, in response to public inquiry, may be disclosed without prior consent-unless students inform the University that they do not want the information disclosed.

- a. Name of student
- b. Local address, ZIP code, and email address maintained in the campus locator printout
- c. Local telephone number maintained in the campus locator printout

- d. Major field of study
- e. Educational level
- f. Facts of participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- g. Weight and height of members of athletic teams
- h. Dates of attendance
- i. Most recent educational institution attended
- j. Degrees and awards received
- k. Email address
- l. Enrollment status (full time and part time)

Students have the right to request that all of the above items not be designated Directory Information. Should they wish to exercise this right, they must, in person and in writing, not earlier than the first day of instruction nor later than 14 calendar days from the first day of instruction for the academic term or semester, or the fourth day of a Summer Session, make this request for nondisclosure. Requests should be submitted to KISC in 'Ilima 102, and are in effect at all University of Hawai'i campuses until rescinded in writing by the student.

7. A parent or spouse of a student is advised that information contained in educational records, except as may be determined to be Directory Information, will not be disclosed to him/her without the prior written consent of the son, daughter, or spouse.

UNIVERSITY POLICY ON NONDISCRIMINATION AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

RESIDENCY REGULATIONS FOR TUITION PURPOSES (condensed)

Students who do not qualify as bona fide residents of the State of Hawai'i, according to the University of Hawai'i rules and regulations in effect at the time they register, must pay the nonresident tuition. An official determination of residency status will be made prior to enrollment. Applicants may be required to verify residency status. Once classified as a nonresident, a student continues to be so classified during his/her term at the college until he/she can present satisfactory evidence to the residency officer that proves otherwise.

Some of the more pertinent University residency regulations follow. For additional information or interpretation, contact the residency officer in the Admission Office. The complete rules and regulations are available at KISC in 'Ilima 102.

DEFINITION OF HAWAI'I RESIDENCY

A student is deemed a resident of the State of Hawai'i for tuition purposes if the student (19* or older) or the student (under 19*) and his/her parents or legal guardian have:

- (1) Demonstrated intent to permanently reside in Hawai'i (see below for indicia);
- (2) Been physically present in Hawai'i for 12 consecutive months prior to the first day of instruction, and subsequent to the demonstration of intent to make Hawai'i their legal residency; and
- (3) The student, whether adult or minor, has not been claimed as a dependent for tax purposes for at least 12 consecutive months prior to the first day of instruction by his/her parents or legal guardians who are not legal residents of Hawai'i.

To demonstrate the intent to make Hawai'i your legal residency, the following indicia apply:

- A. Filing Hawai'i resident personal income tax return.
- B. Voting/registering to vote in the State of Hawai'i.

Other indicia, such as permanent employment and ownership or continuous leasing of a dwelling in Hawai'i, may apply, but no single act is sufficient to establish residency in the State of Hawai'i.

Other legal factors involved in making a residency determination include:

- A. The 12 months of continuous residence in Hawai'i shall begin on the date upon which the first overt action (see indicia) is taken to make Hawai'i the permanent residence. Residence will be lost if it is interrupted during the 12 months immediately preceding the first day of instruction.

- B. Residency in Hawai'i and residency in another place cannot be held simultaneously.
- C. Presence in Hawai'i primarily to attend an institution of higher learning does not create resident status.
- D. The residency of unmarried students who are minors follows that of the parents or of the legal guardian. Marriage emancipates a minor.
- E. The residency of a married person may follow that of the spouse.
- F. Resident status, once acquired, will be lost by future voluntary action of the resident inconsistent with such status. However, Hawai'i residency will not be lost solely because of absence from the state while a member of the United States Armed Forces, while engaged in navigation, or while a student at any institution of learning.

*The age of majority is 18 years. However, a person between the ages of 18 and 19, unless emancipated, cannot claim residency solely on the basis of himself/herself because he/she does not have the minimum 12 months residency which commences on his/her 18th birthday. Therefore, the applicant must claim a portion of the required 12 months on the basis of his/her parent or legal guardian.

STATUTORY EXEMPTIONS: Nonresidents may be allowed to pay resident tuition if they qualify as one of the following:

- A. United States military personnel and their authorized dependents (as defined by the Armed Services) during the period such personnel are stationed in Hawai'i on active duty.
- B. Full-time employees of the University of Hawai'i and their spouses and legal dependents (as defined under Internal Revenue Service rules).
- C. East-West Center student grantees pursuing baccalaureate or advanced degrees.
- D. Hawaiians, descendants of the aboriginal peoples that inhabited the Hawaiian Islands and exercised sovereignty in the Hawaiian Islands in 1778.
- E. Persons who are legal residents of any Pacific island or Asian district, commonwealth, territory, or insular jurisdiction, state, or nation which does not provide public institutions of higher learning. These currently include the following: American Samoa, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, Cook Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Futuna, Kiribati, Nauru, New Caledonia, Niue, Republic of Belau, Republic of the Marshall Islands, Solomon Islands, Tokelau, Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu, Wallis.

MISREPRESENTATION

A student or prospective student who provides incorrect information on any form or document intended for use in determination of residency status for tuition purposes will be subject to the requirements and/or disciplinary measures provided for in the rules and regulations governing residency status.

APPEAL PROCESS

Residency decisions may be appealed by contacting the residency officer (in KISC) for information on how to initiate an appeal.

PROCEDURES FOR OFFICIALLY WITHDRAWING FROM SCHOOL

1. Students who are completely withdrawing from all of their Kapi'olani Community College classes, and whose home institution is Kapi'olani CC, must complete the appropriate form which can be obtained from KISC. Students who do not officially withdraw from school may receive failing grades for all courses.
2. Students receiving financial aid must notify the Financial Aid Office of their intent to withdraw.
3. Students must return the completed form to KISC. It is only at this point that the student will be officially withdrawn from all classes at Kapi'olani Community College.

RETURN OF TITLE IV FUNDS POLICY

The Higher Education Amendment of 1998 required schools to implement the Return of Title IV Funds policy when a Title IV funds recipient completely withdraws from school. A Title IV recipient is defined as a student who has received Title IV funds (excluding Federal Work Study funds) OR has met the conditions that entitle the student to a late disbursement.

The Amendment makes clear that Title IV funds are awarded to students with the assumption that he/she will attend school for the entire enrollment/payment period. If a student receiving the above-mentioned assistance completely withdraws from school or ceases to attend classes up through the 60% point of the semester (as calculated by calendar days), the Financial Aid Office is required to calculate the amount of funds the student earned prior to his/her withdrawal and calculate the amount that was unearned and must, therefore, be returned to reimburse the appropriate Title IV programs. After the 60% point, the student is deemed to have earned 100% of the Title IV funds.

The withdrawal date is used to determine the point in time that the student withdrew or ceased to attend so that the percentage of the enrollment/payment period completed can be determined. A student's withdrawal date will vary depending on the type of withdrawal. If a student officially withdraws, the date the institution would use would be the day the student started the withdrawal process or notifies the school of the intent to withdraw, whichever is earlier.

However, the school may choose to use an earlier last date of attendance at an academically related activity as the student's withdrawal date. If a student does not notify the institution that he/she has withdrawn, the date that the student withdrew would be the date the institution became aware that the student ceased to attend classes. The percentage of Title IV aid earned is equal to the percentage of the enrollment/payment period the student completed.

In cases in which funds must be returned, the school will charge the student's account to repay the respective Title IV programs. As a result, any tuition refunds due to the student will first be returned to reimburse the Title IV programs. Students who utilized a tuition waiver will be billed for the amount that the school must return to the Title IV programs. In addition, the student may be required to directly repay a portion of the Title IV funds that were received. In such cases, the Financial Aid Office will send the student a repayment promissory note which details the amount that must be repaid, the federal aid program that must be repaid, and the date on which the repayment is due. Any repayment outstanding or unpaid will be referred to the U.S. Department of Education for collection and legal disposition. Furthermore, a financial obligation will be placed on the student's account by the institution, which will prohibit the student from registering in future semesters, receiving academic transcripts, or receiving any additional federal aid funds.

In some cases, a student may be eligible to receive a "post-withdrawal" disbursement after the student completely withdraws from school when the amount of aid earned is less than the amount of aid disbursed. In such cases, the Financial Aid Office will notify the student of the "post-withdrawal" disbursement via an award letter. The award letter must be returned to the Financial Aid Office within fourteen (14) days or the "post-withdrawal" disbursement will be cancelled.

HIGHER EDUCATION TAX CREDITS

The Lifetime Learning and Hope Scholarship tax credits are a part of the Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997, which allows eligible taxpayers to claim a tax credit against their federal income tax for qualified educational expenses.

The Hope Scholarship Tax Credit provides for a credit of up to \$1,500 for each eligible student's qualified educational expenses paid in a given tax year. The Hope Credit amount is 100% of the first \$1000 plus 50% of the next \$1000 paid for each eligible student's qualified educational expenses. The maximum amount of Hope Credit that can be claimed is \$1500 for each eligible student, or the amount of the tax liability, whichever is less. This credit may be claimed for only the first two years of postsecondary education.

The Lifetime Learning Tax Credit is for students not eligible for the Hope Credit. This credit provides for a tax credit of up to \$1,000 for tuition and expenses. This credit may be claimed for as many years as qualified education expenses are paid.

CAMPUS SAFETY AND SECURITY

This information is provided in compliance with the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 and Higher Education Amendments of 1992.

A. Campus Security

Kapi'olani is firmly committed to providing a safe and secure campus environment. Policies and procedures are designed to ensure that every possible precautionary measure is taken to protect persons and property. However, you need to be aware that preventive efforts on your part can effectively reduce the chances of being a victim. The information in this section is a part of our effort to promote awareness of the current programs that exist at the campus to provide for your safety and well-being. The campus Security Department, under the administration of the Director of Administrative Services, is responsible for providing around-the-clock security services for the campus. The Security Office is located in Olopuia Room 103. Security officers are on duty 24 hours a day, year round.

B. Security Services Provided

Campus security officers conduct vehicle and foot patrols on campus. They are charged with the enforcement of federal, state, and local laws and University rules and regulations. They perform a full range of public safety services dealing with incident reports resulting from campus investigations of, medical and fire emergencies; traffic accidents; enforcement of laws regulating the use of alcohol, drugs and weapons; and

all other situations requiring campus security assistance. Campus security officers do not have police powers and are not authorized to carry firearms.

Any campus incident requiring an arrest is referred to the Honolulu Police Department. Campus security officers are trained in areas such as emergency first-aid, CPR, report writing, investigative skills, and crowd control.

Campus security maintains a close working relationship with all law enforcement agencies and, whenever appropriate, meetings are held with these external agencies and crime-related reports and statistics are exchanged.

C. Access to Campus Facilities

Most campus facilities are open to students, faculty, staff, and the public during the day and evening hours when classes are in session. During times when the College is officially closed, buildings are locked and access is limited to faculty, staff, and authorized students only. The general public may attend cultural and recreational events on campus, but their access is limited to the facilities in which these events are held.

D. Reporting of Crimes and Emergencies

Crimes and other emergencies on campus can be reported directly to the campus Security Office by dialing "9900" from any College telephone on campus. During normal business hours, on-campus callers may also contact Security through the campus operator by dialing "0". The operator will communicate the emergency to security. To reach the College Security Office from off-campus telephones, please dial 734-9900. As KapCC supplements its Security Department with a private guard service, the KapCC Security number (734-9900 or ext. 9900) is often forwardd to Freeman Guards Inc. If you call the KapCC Security number and hear a recording from Freeman Guards Inc, press "0" immediately to bypass the automated menu. Students, faculty, and staff are encouraged to report all suspicious activities and/or persons observed on campus. Such calls should be made promptly to improve Security's ability to apprehend suspects and/or prevent potential crimes. Upon receipt of a call, security officers are dispatched immediately to the site of the emergency. All incidents are investigated, and a report is filed by the investigating officer.

E. Crime Prevention Programs

The College's crime prevention program is based upon the dual concept of eliminating or minimizing opportunities for crime while encouraging students and employees to assume responsibility for their own safety and the safety of others by taking common-sense precautions. The following is a listing of the College's crime prevention programs:

Escort Service. Campus security provides transportation or a walking escort from dusk to dawn for anyone walking alone

on campus at night. By dialing 9900 (from an on-campus phone), an escort can be summoned to your location.

Crime Prevention Information. Information on safety and security is provided to the campus community through crime alerts, posters, brochures, employee bulletins, and the student newspaper. Presentations on safety issues are also made to the campus.

Facilities and Grounds Surveys. All potential safety and security hazards observed by our officers on patrol are promptly reported to the appropriate department for corrective action.

F. Sexual Offense

Any member of Kapi'olani's community who commits a sexual offense is subject to criminal prosecution and disciplinary procedures. Under University disciplinary procedures, a variety of sanctions may be imposed including suspension, dismissal or loss of employment. By law, all University disciplinary procedures provide due-process protection for the accuser and the accused. At the conclusion of the mandated hearings related to sexual offense, both the accuser and the accused shall be informed of the decision and sanction.

Any student or employee who is sexually assaulted should report the incident to either the Sex Abuse Treatment Center (hotline: 973-8337), Campus Security (734-9900), the Honolulu Police Department, or any campus counseling office regardless of whether the individual plans to press charges. A victim's physical and emotional well being is a paramount concern. However, it is important to consider preserving physical evidence to assist in apprehending and prosecuting any attacker. Information on a victim's option to notify proper law enforcement authorities and to have the assistance of the counseling office in notifying these authorities will be provided.

Students who are victims of a sexual offense will be assisted in continuing their studies by changing their academic or living arrangements if those changes are requested by the victim and are reasonable. Information on programs designed to inform students and employees about the prevention of crime and sex offenses as well as practices to encourage students and employees to be responsible for their own security and the security of others is available from any campus counseling office.

G. Alcoholic Beverages

The purchase, possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages is regulated by state law. No one under the age of twenty-one may legally purchase, possess or consume alcoholic beverages. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is forbidden in all public and common areas. All other service

or consumption of alcoholic beverages on campus requires the approval of the Chancellor. Students and employees found to be in violation may be subject to the provisions of state law, University policy, and the Student Conduct Code.

H. Illegal Drugs

As prohibited by state and federal law, College students and employees are not permitted to be under the influence of, possess, manufacture, distribute or sell illicit drugs at College sponsored or approved events, on College property or in buildings used by the College for its educational and recreational programs. Students and employees found to be in violation are subject to arrest. Conviction may result in probation, fines, and imprisonment. Students are also subject to disciplinary action under the Student Conduct Code.

I. Weapons

The possession or use of dangerous or deadly weapons on College premises is strictly prohibited. Dangerous weapons include but are not limited to firearms, ammunition, spear guns, explosives, explosive fuels, billy clubs, pepper spray, and dangerous substances. Any person found to be in violation may be subject to the provisions of state law, University policy, and the Student Conduct Code.

J. Safety Precautions

- Travel/park in lighted areas; travel in pairs if possible; be aware of your surroundings; use the escort service.
- Report any suspicious persons or activities; report all incidents no matter how minor; report losses immediately.
- Be sure to lock/secure window and doors in your room or office; lock cars and bikes; store valuables in the trunk of your car.
- Never loan keys to anyone. Keys may be lost, stolen or duplicated.
- Don't leave belongings/valuables unattended. Mark or engrave your belongings.
- Familiarize yourself with the locations of phones and the security office.

PARKING RULES AND REGULATIONS

Spring Semester 2005

General Information

Parking at KCC is available on a first come, first served basis, free of charge. No permit is required for students and visitors parking in Lots B, C, D and E. Permits are required for students and visitors parking in Lot A, Monday through Friday from 6 AM- 4 PM. Because parking is limited, no one is guaranteed a parking space.

Restricted Zones

Possession of a valid parking permit does not allow anyone to park illegally, even if there are no parking spaces available. Stalls marked with the following designations are restricted and require an appropriate permit:
 Commercial Vehicle Parking
 Handicapped Parking
 Loading Zone
 Permit Issued by Auxiliary Services Required
 Restricted Parking, Permit Required

Additional Parking

Additional parking is available behind Diamond Head Theatre.

Parking Permit Required for Lot A

Beginning January 10, 2005, the first day of instruction for the spring semester, permits will be required to park in Lot A, Monday through Friday from 6 AM- 4 PM. No permits will be required during the summer session.

Student Parking Permits for Lot A

Students enrolled in credit classes may apply for a parking permit for Lot A. They are issued on a first come, first served basis. The number is limited; thus, there is no guarantee that they will be available for all applicants. Students enrolled in non-credit classes may request a temporary parking permit for Lot A at Olopuia 103 or through their instructor.

How to Apply for a Lot A Permit

For students in credit classes, spring 2005 permits for Lot A will be available beginning December 1, 2004. They will be available at Olopuia 103, Monday through Friday from 6:30 AM- 4:30 PM. Students must (1) complete an application, (2) present verification of payment of tuition for the fall 2004 semester — a hard copy of online payment or a hard copy of payment from the cashier in 'Ilima 102, (3) present a current no fault insurance card, (4) be clear of unpaid campus traffic citations, and (5) come in person to receive their permits.

Staff and Faculty Parking

Staff permits have been available since July 1, 2004. Staff and faculty may apply for a permit to park in stalls reserved for staff. They must (1) complete an application, (2) obtain their department chairperson's or unit head's approval, (3) present a current no fault insurance card, (4) be clear of unpaid campus traffic citations, and (5) pick up their permits in person at Olopuia 103. Staff permits are valid for one year from September 1, 2004 through August 31, 2005.

Transfer of Permits

Permits may not be sold or transferred. They are not transferable from one vehicle to another unless authorized by Auxiliary Services.

Display of Permits

Permits must be fully visible. They must be displayed inside the vehicle, on the windshield, on the lower left (driver's side) corner. Static cling permits must adhere to the windshield. Vehicles with permits that are not fully visible or displayed incorrectly will be ticketed.

Lost Permits

Lost permits must be reported immediately. A replacement must be obtained and installed prior to parking. Vehicles without a valid replacement will be cited. Security will not honor a business card or a note displayed on a vehicle. The vehicle will be cited.

Visitor Parking

Visitors may park in any unrestricted (unmarked) stall in Lots B, C, D and E. No permit is necessary. Visitors parking in Lot A or in restricted (marked) stalls must have a permit. Staff or faculty may request a permit for their visitors by calling ext. 9157.

Enforcement of Parking Regulations

All parking regulations are in effect year round. All drivers must abide by the applicable rules and regulations if they wish to drive and park on campus. The regulations, including maps, are posted on campus bulletin boards. Parking is permitted only in areas marked and specified for parking. Towing signs are posted in the parking lots. Vehicles will be ticketed and subject to towing if they are parked (1) in any way that obstructs traffic; (2) in a restricted stall without a permit; (3) on the grass, dirt or other landscaped areas; (4) blocking a fire hydrant, driveway or crosswalk; (5) totally or within any portion of a red curb. If in doubt about where to park, call Campus Security at 734-9900 prior to parking.

Payment of Traffic Citations

Payment should be made at the KISC Cashier's Office within seven (7) days of the violation.

How to Appeal a Citation

An appeal may be filed within 30 days with the Director of Administrative Services in 'Ilima 211, after payment of the fine. Failure to pay citations may result in a financial obligation against the registered owner of the vehicle. An applicant for a parking permit must be clear of all outstanding citations.

Motorcycles, Mopeds and Bicycles

Motorcycles, mopeds, and bicycles must be parked in authorized zones only. They are not permitted on the campus malls.

Parking for the Disabled

All persons with disabilities with a current State Department of Transportation Disabled Persons Parking Permit issued by the City and County of Honolulu are allowed to park in spaces designated for the disabled. Vehicles violating this requirement are subject to a campus parking citation, a Honolulu Police Department citation, and towing at the owner's expense. These rules are in effect 24 hrs a day, 7 days a week. Kapi'olani CC parking permits do not authorize parking in these stalls. If no handicapped parking is available, call Campus Security at 734-9900 for assistance. Illegally parked vehicles with handicapped permits will be ticketed or towed.

Towed Vehicles

Vehicles violating any of the parking regulations are subject to towing. After five (5) violations (paid or unpaid), a vehicle will be towed for each subsequent violation. Towed vehicles

(including motorcycles, mopeds, etc.) may be claimed at Stone's Towing, located at 611 Middle Street, phone 847.1136. All towed vehicles are removed from campus at the owner's expense.

Parking Permits Not Required During Designated Hours
 During weekdays, parking without a permit is allowed in unmarked stalls in Lot A after 4 PM. Parking without a permit is allowed in staff stalls anywhere on campus after 4 PM. Permits are not required anytime during the weekend and on holidays.
