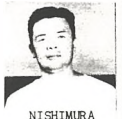

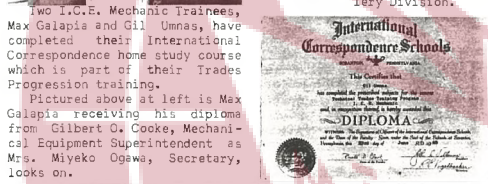

Regular Employees

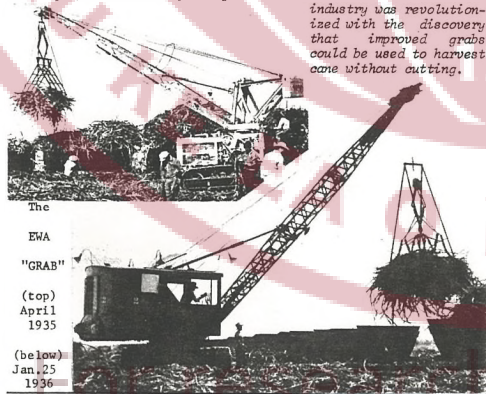

1890 ECHOES FROM EWA'S PAST 1965

The mid-thirties saw great strides in mechanical harvesting. The cane "grab" - built after the general idea of a multipointed pair of "ice tongs" - was developed during the last six months of 1935. It was thus possible to so modify the previous method of piling cane preparatory to the loading operation as to utilize labor more efficiently. Less than a year later the hand loading of cane was completely eliminated and in 1937 the whole industry was revolutionized with the discovery that improved grabs could be used to harvest cane without cutting.

Ewa's Oldtimer

PASTOR RILLANOS, Ratoon Tractor Operator, is spotlighted as the plantation's "old-timer" of the week with a service record of 29 years and 7 months.

Pastor was born in Argao, Cebu, Philippine Islands and came to Hawaii in January, 1925. He worked for McBryde and Paauhau Sugar Companies prior to his employment at Ewa in 1935.
