## TB Survey Next Month

The 1964 TB Survey in Ewa will be held on April 13, 14 and 15.

Health authorities urge everyone 20 years of age and over to have a TB check-up every year. If you have never had a tuberculin (skin) test, or if your previous test was negative (no reaction) get your skin test along with your Chest X-Ray. If you have had a positive reaction to the test, then you need only a Chest X-Ray.

The mobile X-Ray unit will be at the Ewa Beach Shopping Center on April 9 and 10. The crew moves to Ewa the following week.

A movie that points out the importance of proper diet and good health habits to combat tuberculosis, will be shown at the Varona Village Clubhouse next Friday, April 3, at 7:00 P.M.

Mrs. Harriet Dela Pena of the Oahu Tuberculosis and Health Association will also lecture in Iloiloa with a question and answer period to follow.
