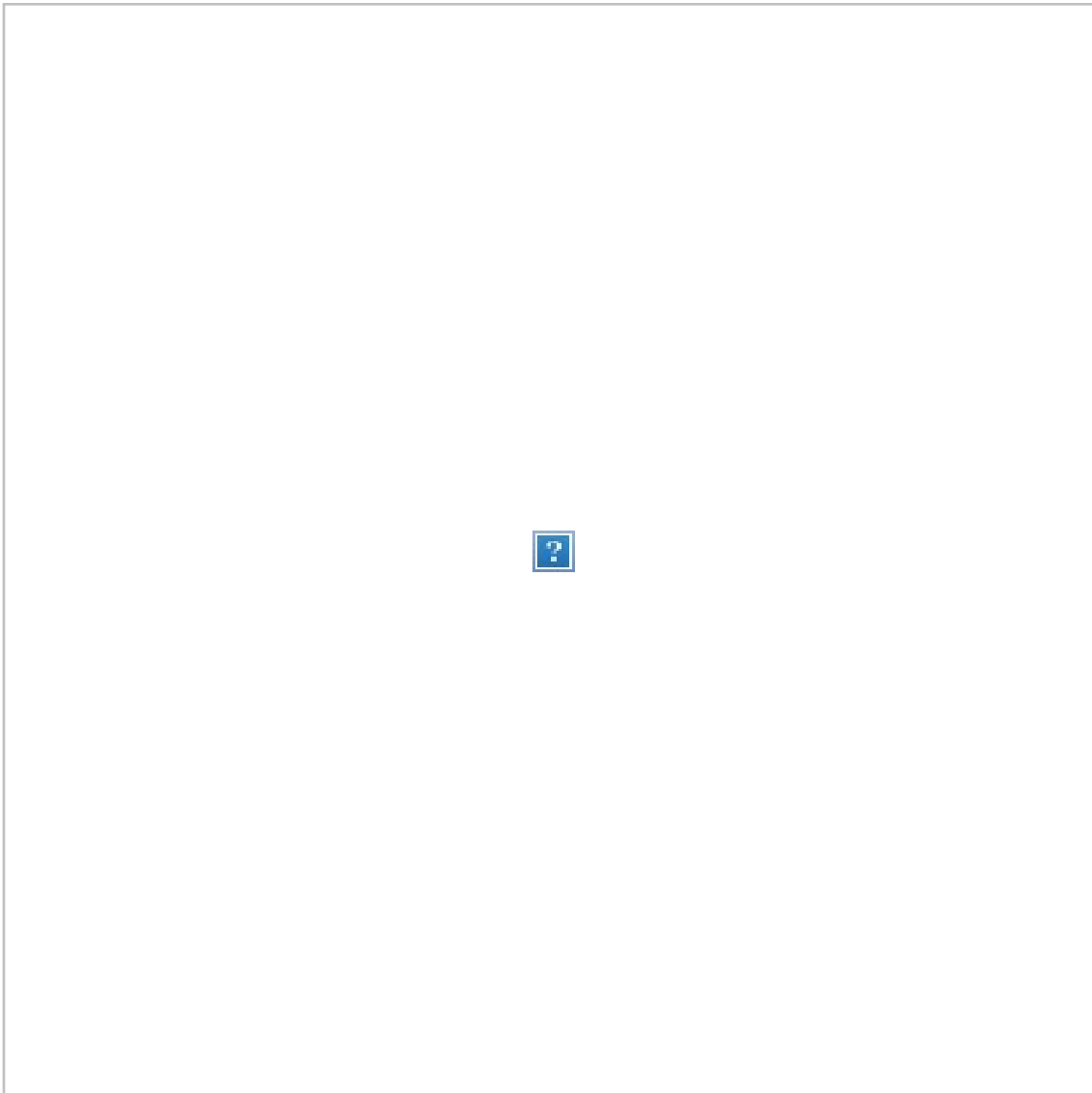

**Sidewalk Construction on Campus Loop Road**

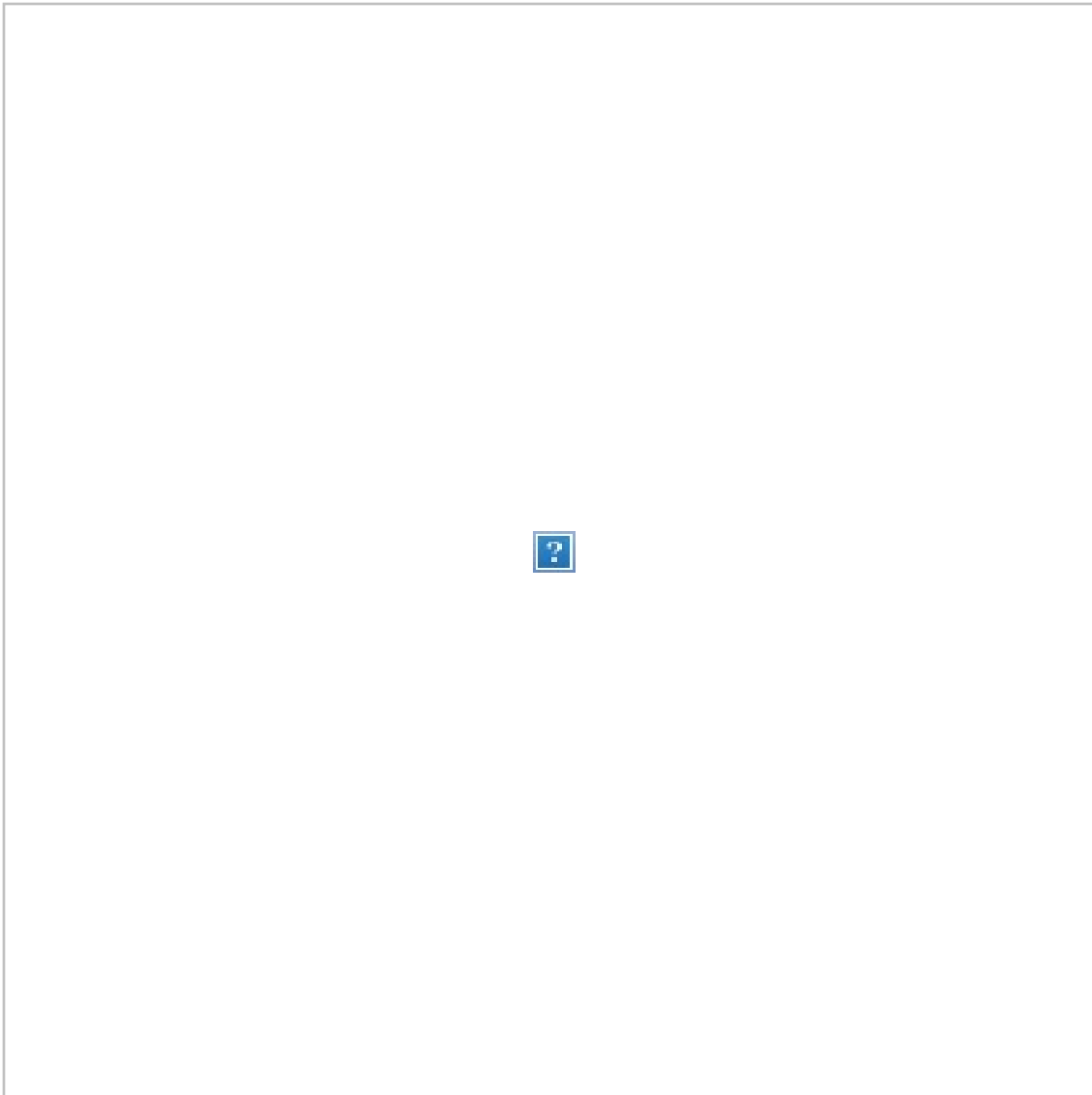

Dr. Karen Kelsky, a former tenured professor who uncovered a surprising amount of sexual harassment in higher education and coined the #MeTooPhD hashtag, will give a talk titled "Sexual Harassment in the

Academy” today from 11 a.m. to 12:20 p.m. in the James & Abigail Campbell Library’s second floor exhibition area.

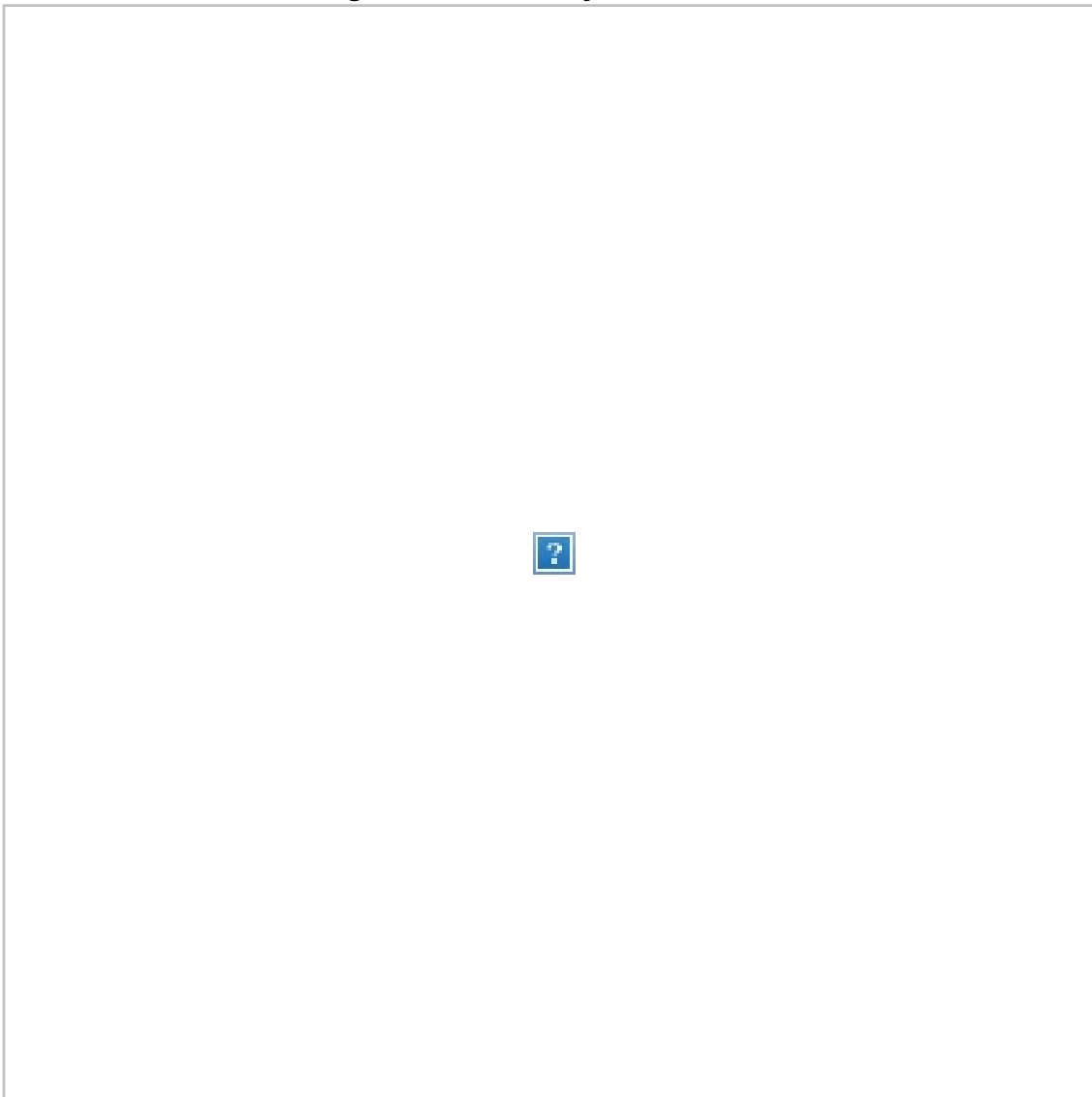
UH West O’ahu's Distinguished Visiting Scholars Committee is inviting students, faculty and staff to the talk. Kelsky received her Ph.D. in cultural anthropology from the University of Hawai’i and is nationally known for her work on several higher education issues and is the creator of the [Sexual Harassment in the Academy Crowdsourcing Survey](#). The survey, launched in December 2017, provided an anonymous platform for Ph.D. candidates and others describe their experience and quickly attracted more than a thousand reports of unwanted advances in academic settings.

### **UH West O’ahu Extramural grants growing in number and total amount**

The amount of extramural grants received by the UH West O’ahu campus grew by 227 percent between 2014 and 2018, according to [UH System testimony](#) submitted to the Board of Regents earlier this month. UH West O’ahu’s extramural awards grew from \$1.8 million in 2014 to \$6 million in 2018.

The report shows UH West O’ahu award total remained small compared to other UH four-year campuses. In FY 2018 it received 24 grants, or 11 more than the year prior.

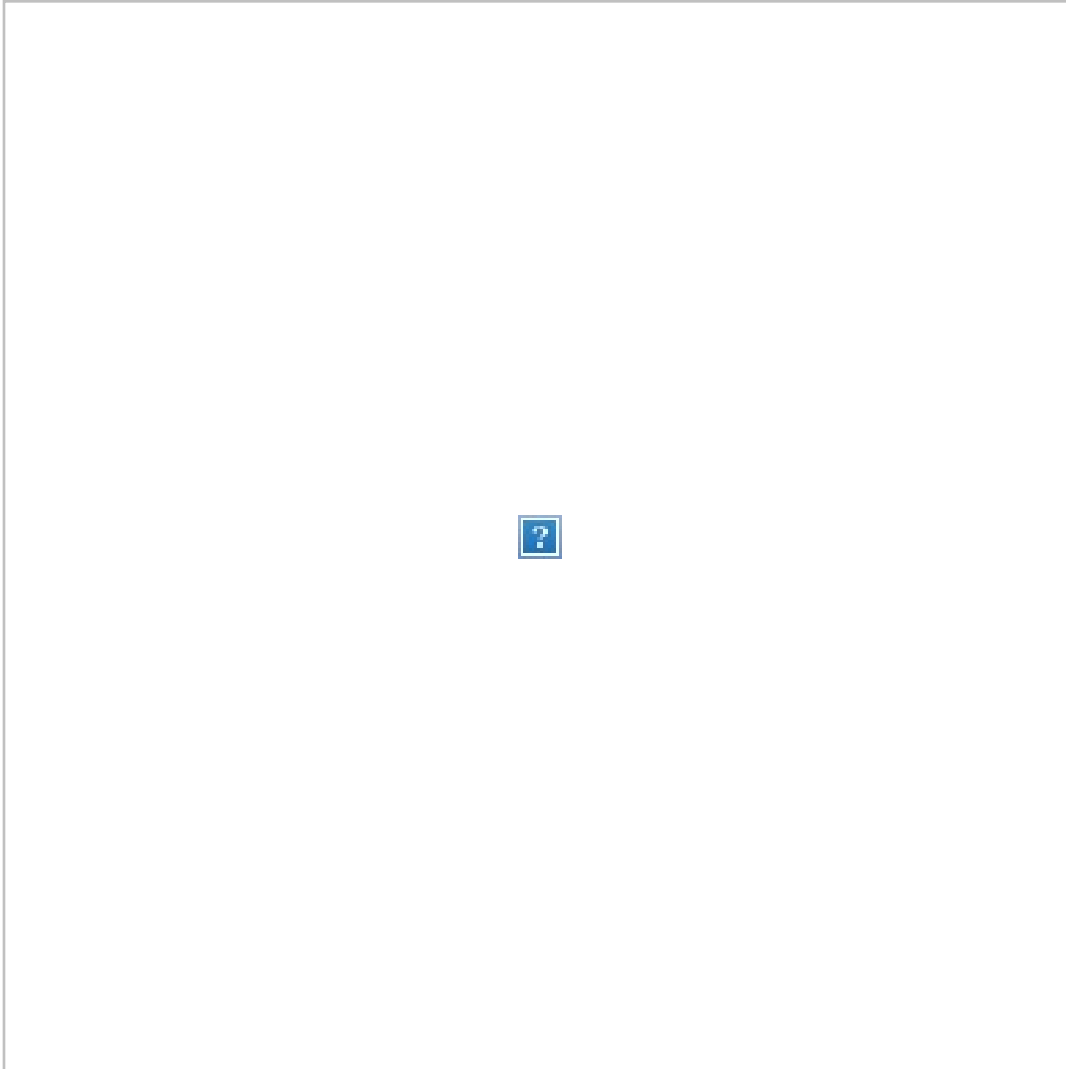
### **Samoan lecture series begins this Thursday**



A new lecture series focusing on Samoan language, culture, history and contemporary issues will debut on

Thursday. Three women who live and work in our own Samoan and Pacific communities in Hawai'i will be giving the talks. The series was organized by Dr. Sā'iliemanu Lilomaiaava-Doktor, an Associate Professor of Hawaiian-Pacific Studies, and John Patu Jr., a UH West O'ahu lecturer in Samoan and Pacific Islands Studies. The speakers were selected to highlight indigenous Samoan voices in academia and to help make the research they produce more accessible to Samoan communities, especially in the Samoan diaspora. This Thursday's lecture is by Dr. Line-Noue Memea Kruse is titled "Land Rights and Law in American Sāmoa." It is scheduled from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in the No'eau Center.

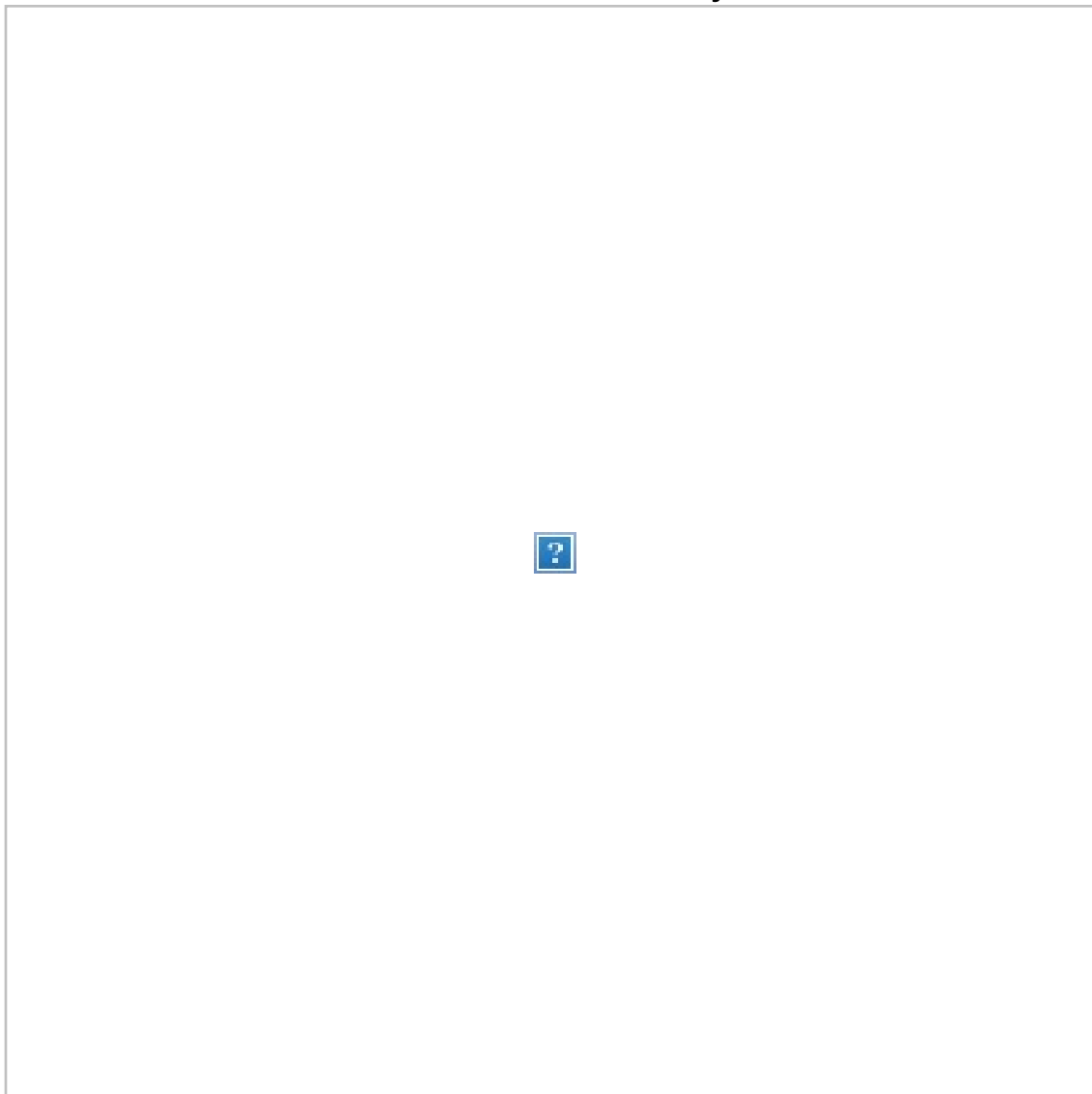

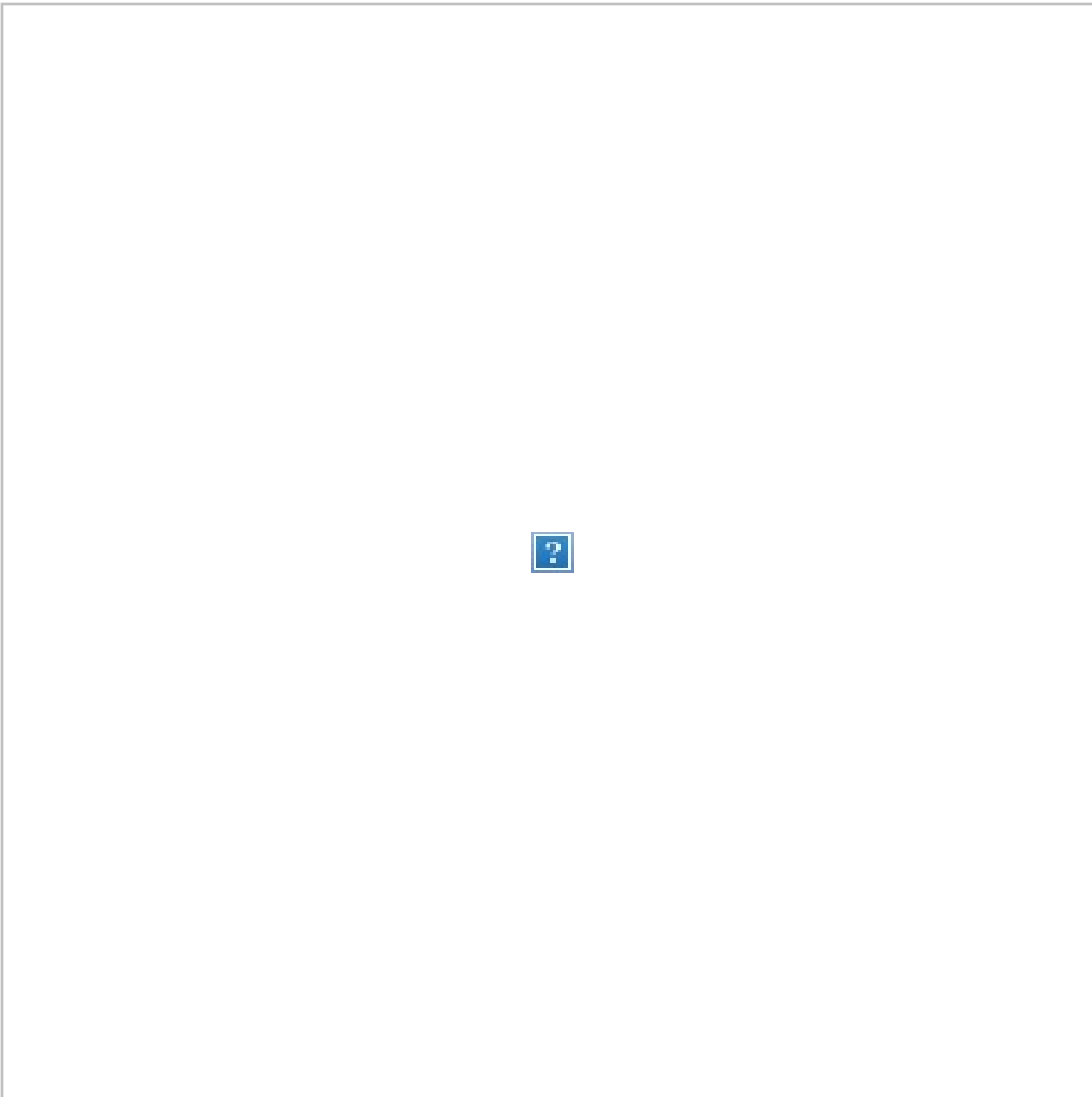
