Lee Carrau, producer of the show and KGMB staff member, visited Ewa last week and set up his camera in the Harvesting field, at the mill and at the coral flats.

The program is on the air this Saturday evening at 9:30 p.m. on channel 9, KGMB-TV.

As of the middle of July, Hawaiian sugar plantations produced over two-thirds of their annual production.

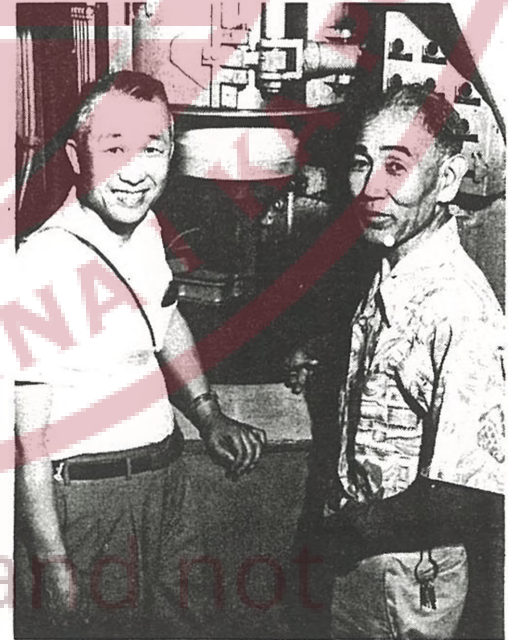

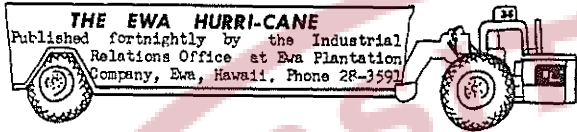

Ewa's Oldtimers

A look into the garden of JUJIRO NUMASAKI reveals the persistent care of an artist with growing things. In 1915, over forty years ago, Mr. Numasaki came to Ewa to stay with relatives and to earn his livelihood.

Shortly after debarking from the ship S.S. Paris in Honolulu, Mr. Numasaki was busy applying fertilizer in Ewa's fields. Following a period when he worked in the factory, Mr. Numasaki became an irrigator and then went to work with the experiment crew. In 1950, he became an Irrigation Assistant.

Mr. and Mrs. Numasaki have a daughter, Mrs. Tatsumi Azuma, whose husband is employed by the plantation. The Numasaki home with the lovely garden pictured above is in Mill Village.

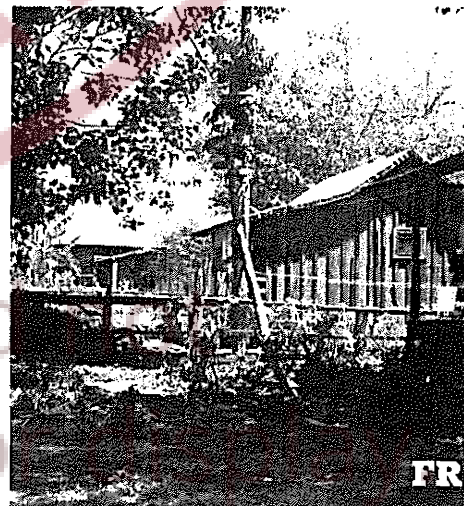
Sugar News

The 38-day strike at C&H in California caused a lot of sugar to be backlogged in Hawaiian storage areas. Officials say that the emergency should be over by the end of this month. It is estimated that 183,000 tons of raws will leave Hawaii between July 14 and August 13.

New improvements in the process for making detergents from sugar have paved the way for commercial production. Pilot plant work has started in Toledo, Ohio, according to Dr. H. B. Hass, president of the sugar Research Foundation.

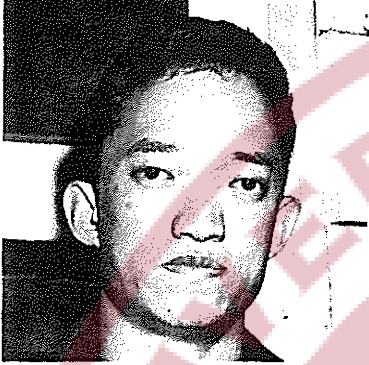

Mr. Julian is an Irrigator assigned to Division III at Ewa and is residing at Lower Village. He started his employment on June 12, 1946.

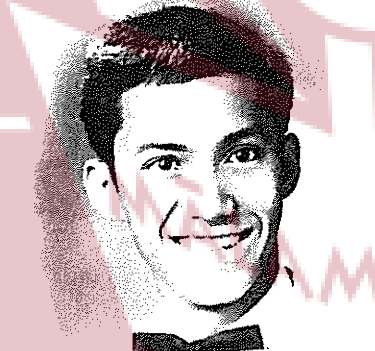
Mr. Julian's family is residing in the Philippines.

About 150 delegates from all over the territory and from the West Coast are expected to attend the convention.

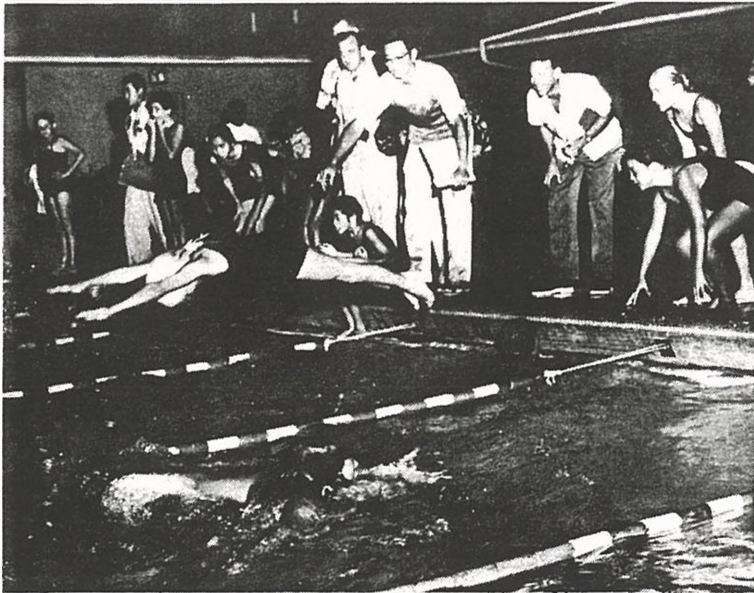
The principal speaker at the opening ceremonies will be Governor Samuel P. King.
