## Welcome to Ewa

## Million Tons Passed

Hawaii's sugar industry has now passed the million-ton mark for its 1964 crop.

The mark was passed somewhere in the week ending September 26. Unofficial production totals as of the end of the week was 1,017,179 tons.

Meanwhile, Ewa was the first recorded plantation to complete 1964 grind.

Total production for all of Hawaii's 26 plantation companies this year is expected to be about 1,150,000 tons.

## Sugar Legislation

The U. S. Congress has adjourned without enacting new sugar legislation.

One of the basic reasons why there was no new sugar legislation was that the various U. S. sugar interests could not get together on a compromise bill. Hitherto the domestic sugar producers and refiners have been able to compromise and jointly push legislation agreeable to all.

The Sugar Act was up for reconsideration of the foreign provisions only.

However, this year the beet people and the mainland cane people tried to have the marketing quota increased and a deadlock ensued as a result of opposition, chiefly from mainland refiners and also Hawaii.

The domestic provision of the current Sugar Act thus continue the same as before. Just how the foreign quotas will be handled has not been fully disclosed as yet.

## Tax Advantages

A tax advantage is realized when Series E bonds bought for a college education are handled a certain way.

Parents can buy E Bonds registered in the child's name--either alone or with one of the parents as a beneficiary. At the end of the first year of bond purchase, a Federal income tax return is filed in the child's name, listing the increase in bond value as income to the child. When this totals less than \$600, no tax will be due. Thereafter, it will be necessary to file a tax return for the child ONLY in years in which accrued interest plus other income exceeds the \$600 exemption.
