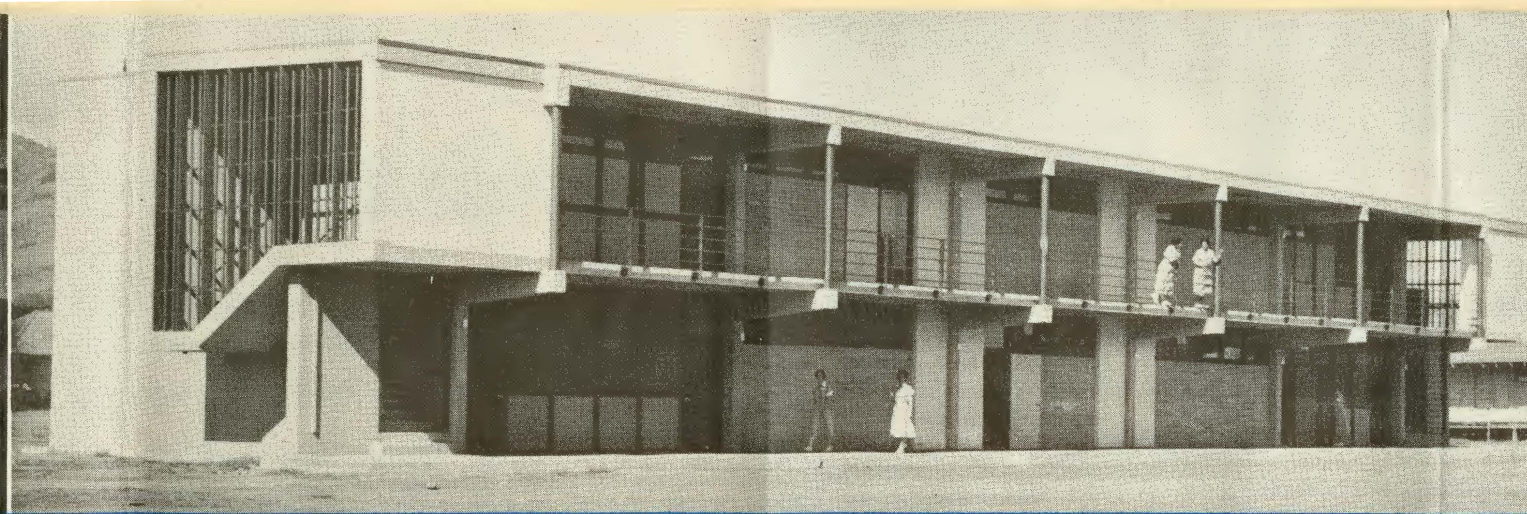

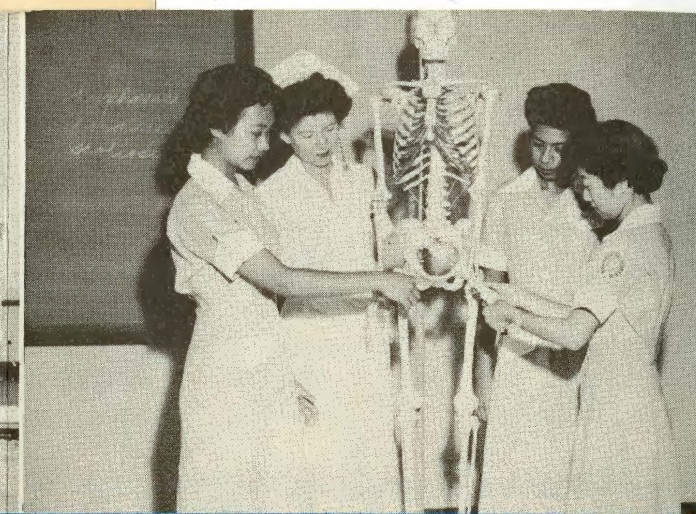

**What will a career in nursing mean?**

A lifetime vocation with enriching experience.  
Employment available with good pay.  
A career that is varied and interesting.  
Personal satisfaction in giving service.

**Who cooperates in providing training?**

The Department of Education operates the program in cooperation with local hospitals.  
The course is fully accredited by the Hawaii Board of Nurses.  
Upon satisfactory completion of the course, graduates will be eligible to take the examination for license as a practical nurse.

**What are the entrance requirements?**

Age: 18 to 50  
Education: High school graduation  
(Exception may be made for applicants over 25 years of age)  
Good Health: Mental and Physical  
(Pre-entrance physical examination required)  
Suitability: For the work as shown by personal interviews, references and aptitude tests.

**What does the one-year course include?**

16 WEEKS OF INSTRUCTION IN THE SCHOOL:  
Nursing Principles and Skills; First Aid and Civil Defense; Personal and Vocational Relations; Body Structure and Functions; Nutrition and Diet Therapy; Normal growth and development; Obstetrics and the Newborn; Geriatrics, Rehabilitation, and Home Nursing.  
School hours: 7:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.  
32 WEEKS OF EXPERIENCE IN HOSPITALS AND PRESCHOOLS WITH:  
Medical, surgical and psychiatric patients; mothers and new babies; well and sick children.  
37½ hours per week (Usually 7:00 a.m.—3:00 p.m.)  
4 WEEKS VACATION (terminal).

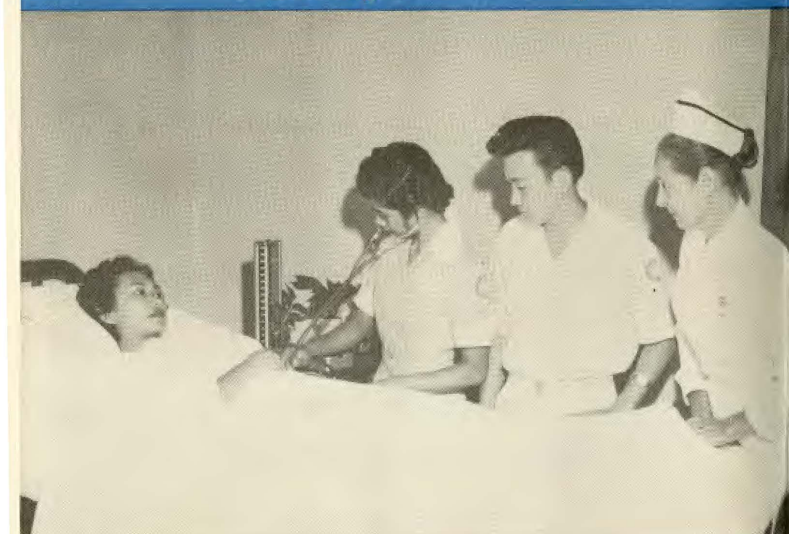
**What does it cost?**

Instruction is free; however, students will need approximately \$100 to pay for books, laboratory fees, uniforms, and graduation expenses. No dormitory facilities. Employment in homes available in exchange for board and room.

**What are the employment opportunities?**

There is a great demand for good practical nurses for employment in hospitals, doctors' offices, homes, and public health agencies. The need for well-trained practical nurses, both men and women, continues to increase.

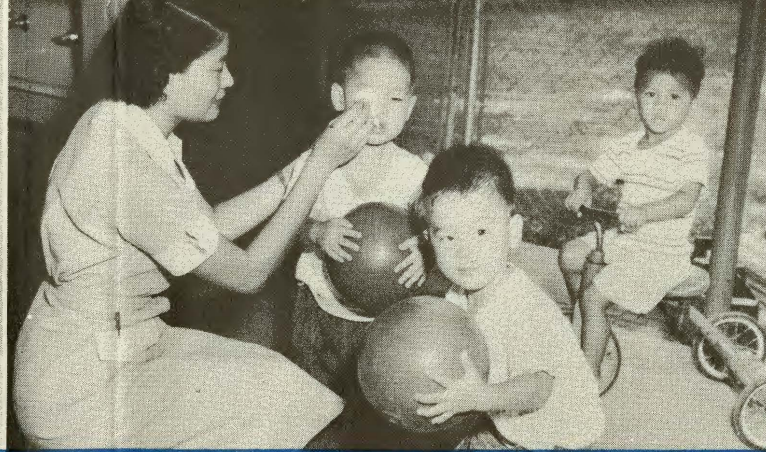
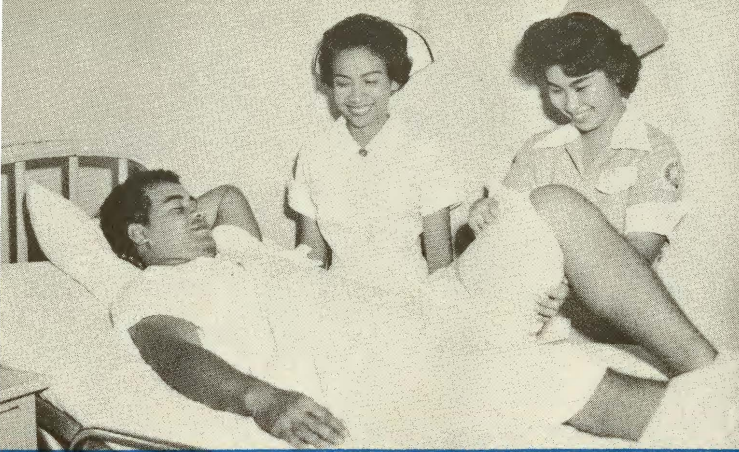
