



From September, 1961 to May, 1962, he attended the post graduate school of medicine, University of Pennsylvania.

The employment of Dr. Wong is part of the plantation's previously announced plan to provide increased service including a wider variety of medical skills at the hospital for medical plan members.

Ilocos Norte Governor To Visit Ewa

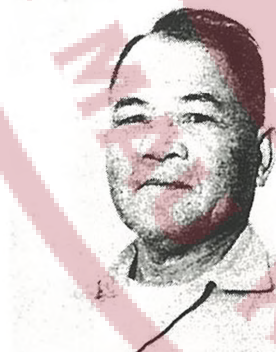
Jose Evangelista, governor of Ilocos Norte, Philippines, will call at Ewa on Wednesday, June 6, to visit with local residents who came from that province.

Yesterday marked the end of Maximo Cambia's active service at Ewa Plantation Company

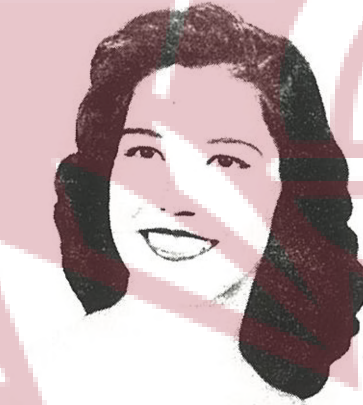

Common Poisonous Plants of Hawaii Apple of Sodom, Thorny Popolo



DESCRIPTION: A common weed often found in dry upland pastures or along roadsides. A low, straggling shrub with thorny leaves and small five petaled blue flowers. The fruits are round, hard, pale yellow, somewhat resembling tomatoes. They are bitter and full of seeds.

POISONOUS PARTS: All parts are poisonous and HIGHLY TOXIC.

SYMPTOMS: Excitement, tremors, paralysis, collapse, and death in deep coma. A drastic fall in temperature.

WHAT TO DO: CALL YOUR DOCTOR or POISON CONTROL CENTER.
