- Kapoʻoloku Program for Native Hawaiian Student Success exists to ensure that
 Kapiʻolani Community College programs and services are equitable for students of
 Hawaiian ancestry.
- Kūlia ma Kapi'olani is a Native Hawaiian Career & Technical Education project sponsored by ALU LIKE, INC. and funded through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education.

- <u>Lunalilo Scholars</u> provides opportunities for students who have not considered higher education as a viable alternative because of financial or other barriers limiting college access.
- <u>Māla Māunuunu</u> provides a variety of learning opportunities for KCC students, faculty/staff, and the neighboring community.
- AA Hawaiian Studies provides curricula that focus on Hawaiian culture and knowledge.



Counselors & Advising
