Grand Finale-- Ewa's 1963 Sugar Story

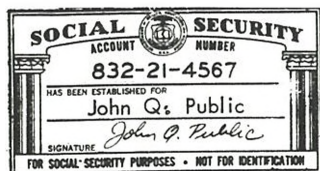
When the season ended on October 22nd, the sugar bins at the factory still held over a thousand tons of sugar and the total production figure for the 1963 crop year was only an educated guess--"about 56,600 tons."

The huge bins now stand empty and hollow, for the last of Ewa's sugar was shipped last Tuesday. And the final truckload swelled the total production figure to 56,778 tons! Of course, this is a far cry from the 60,000 tons or better that Ewa had consistently produced prior to 1958, but it is good nevertheless. However, as a saying goes "Good, Better, Best; never let it rest, til your Good is Better and your Better Best," let us all pitch in to make Ewa's best -- better.

Personnel Changes

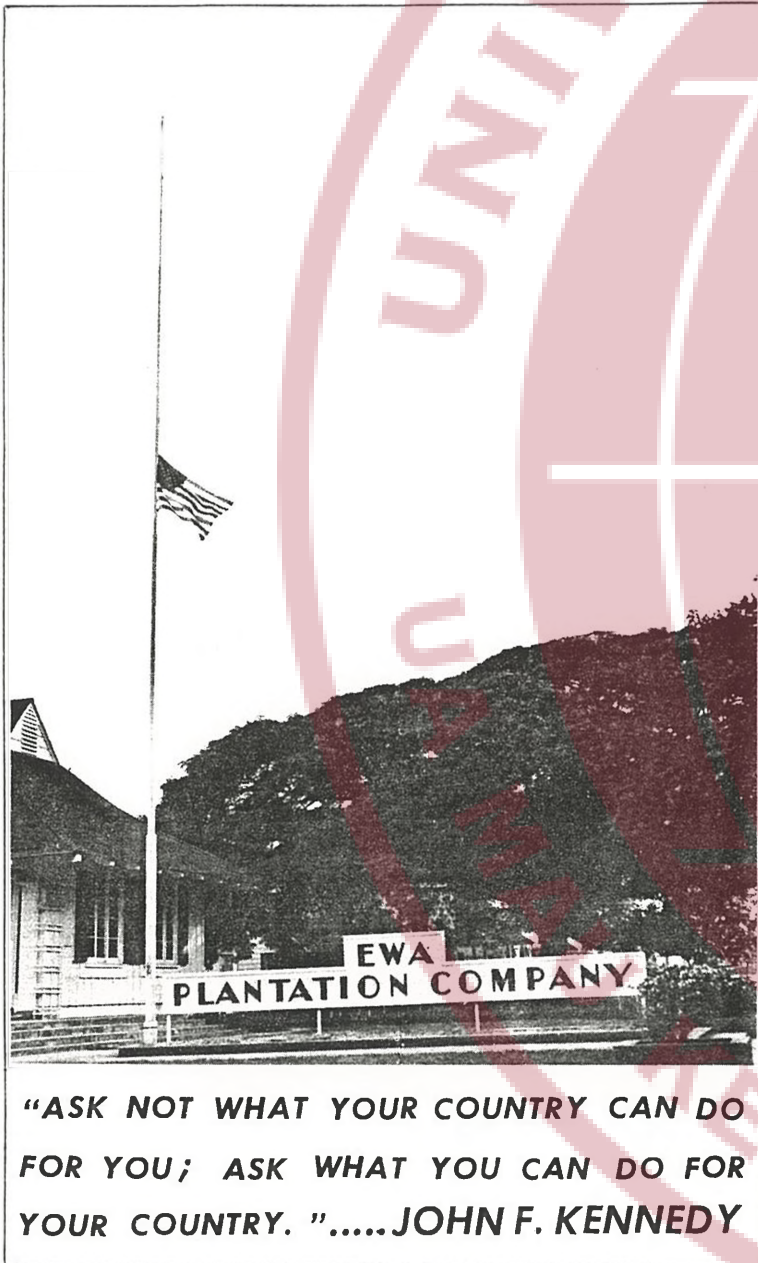
The following personnel changes were announced jointly by Joseph Budge, I.R. Director and W.A. Mair, Office Manager:
