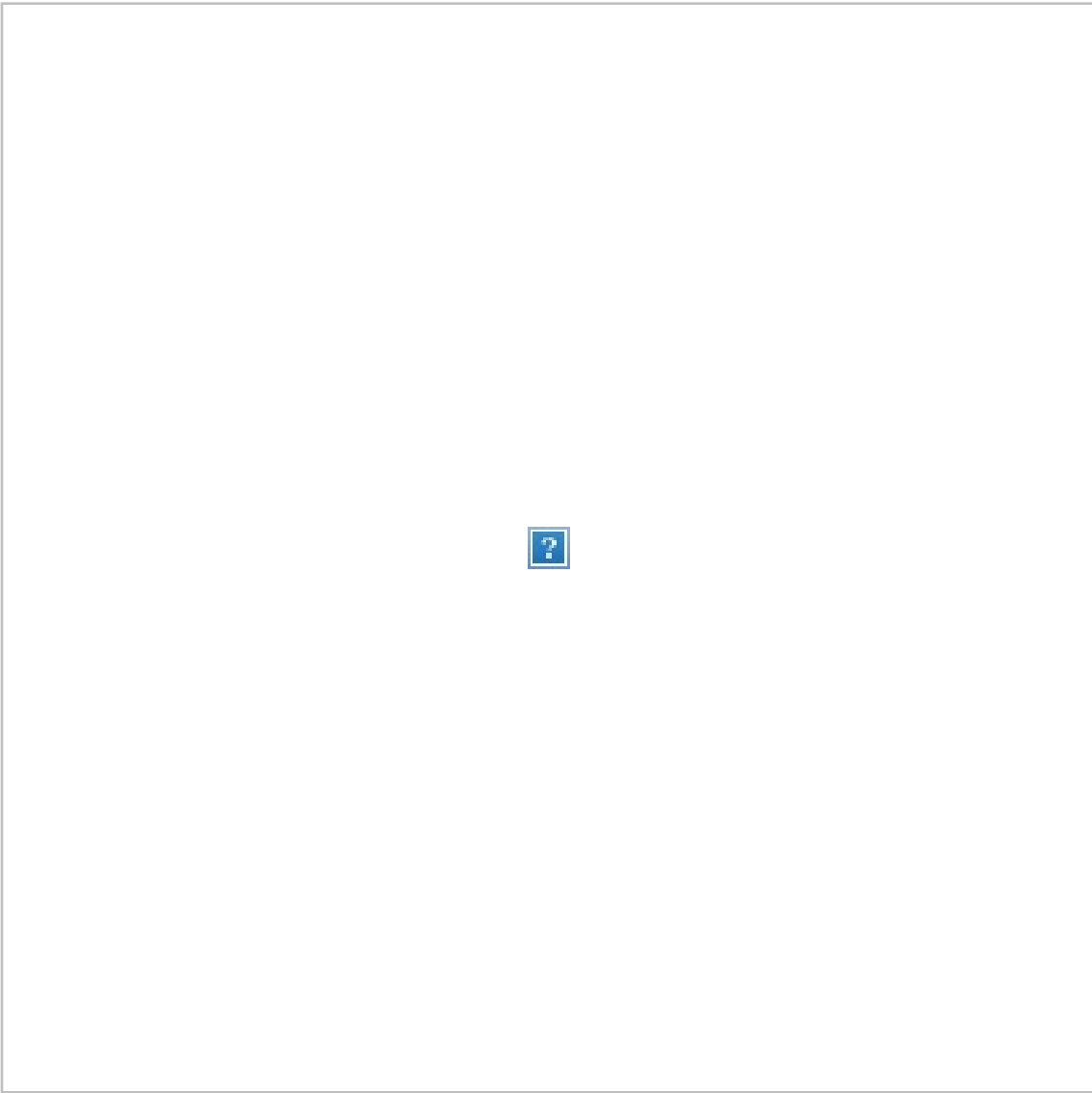

Survey of college graduates finds alumni have favorable opinion

A Gallup Inc. survey of 334 UH West O'ahu alumni finds they generally have a favorable opinion of the school. The survey found:

- 65 percent strongly agreed they are proud to be UH West O'ahu alumni;
- 59 percent were extremely likely to recommend UHWO to family, friends or colleagues;
- 56 percent strongly agreed UH West O'ahu was the perfect school for people like them;
- 63 percent of dual degree holders (associate and bachelor's degrees) strongly agreed UHWO was the perfect school for people like them
- 74 percent of dual degree holders (associate and bachelor's degrees) strongly agreed UHWO was worth the cost; and,

- 78 percent said they strongly agreed that they had at least one professor at UHWO who made them excited about learning. That compared to the national average of 65 percent.

The survey was fielded on the web from Feb. 5 to March 6, 2018. The mean age of respondents was 43.

UH President Lassner highlights UHWO Jones' grant for veterans and STEM, talks about solar project

UH West O'ahu Associate Professor of Science Education Richard Jones' \$638,100 STEM-related grant to help military veterans was highlighted during a presentation by [University of Hawai'i System President David Lassner](#) in his monthly report to the UH Board of Regents last week. "This one is particularly exciting, it's from the U.S. Office of Naval Research and it's to create a program called Veterans Empowered Through STEM," Lassner said. "The idea is to take veterans who have served, who have learned how to function in the community and to supplement what they have learned with STEM education to position them to contribute to Hawai'i's economy and to their families and communities."

Lassner also reported on an effort to lease part of UH West O'ahu's mauka lands to a developer who would build a solar farm feeding energy into the Hawaiian Electric grid. Lassner said the first effort ended without a developer selection and that a second leasing effort may begin in six to eight months.

'One Job Should Be Enough' teach-in scheduled for Tuesday noon in courtyard

The "One Job Should Be Enough" campaign will be discussed by representatives from Unite HERE! Local 5 during a teach-in on the UH West O'ahu campus next week. One Job Should Be Enough is the theme for a hotel worker strike here and in several Mainland cities by the union, which among other issues, contends too many workers are being offered part-time work with few or no benefits as employers abandon full-time positions.

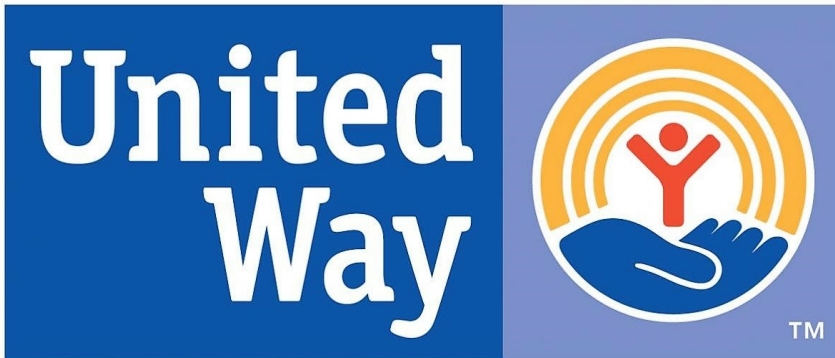
