Bowman to Head New Division

Manager Ed Bryan has announced the consolidation of all housing matters, including their maintenance and repair, into the Construction Department. A new division of that department is being formed under L. V. Bowman, presently Transportation Superintendent. Mr. Bowman will supervise all housing office matters and also the carpenters, painters, plumbers and concrete yard crew through their respective foremen Edwin Kazunaga, Walter Takiguchi, Mike Endo, and Sam Inouye.

Mr. Bowman, who will be known as Director of Housing and Maintenance, started work at Ewa in 1936 in the Field Department and became Transportation Superintendent in 1952 but returned to his former job for health reasons three years later. Prior to coming to Ewa he was with the Department of Public Instruction for some eight years during which time he taught various subjects, including carpentry and shop-work. He and his wife, Winifred, live in Renton Village. Mrs. Bowman is also well known in the community as a teacher at Waipahu High School.

Safe Riding is a Must

STAY ALIVE! Here are 10 important rules for all bicycle riders to follow. Make these rules yours and your children's safe riding code.

One of the most dangerous practices observed among our youngsters riding bicycles is the speeding at intersections and completely ignoring stop signs. We all know what the outcome would be if a car happened to be passing by. They are our children and we love them dearly. For their continued well being let's make sure that they know the rules well.

1. Obey all stop signs and traffic signals.
2. Ride only on the right hand side of the street, as near to the curb as possible, but not on sidewalks.
3. Ride single file on busy or narrow streets. Never ride more than two abreast.
4. Don't carry another person on your bicycle - it obstructs vision, makes steering and balancing difficult.
5. Don't "hitch on" to trucks or cars. Never "stunt" or race in traffic.
6. Always dismount and walk your bicycle across busy streets.
7. Don't "weave" in and out of traffic. Avoid sudden turns or stops.
8. Be alert for suddenly opened doors when passing parked cars.
9. Stop and make sure sidewalks and streets are clear when coming out of alleys and driveways.
10. Be sure your bicycle has good brakes and a rear reflector.
