## "Project Head Start" in Ewa

Ewa will again have a Child Development Center this summer under the government-financed "Project Head Start."

With funds made available through the Hawaii Office of Economic Opportunity this service will be made available to pre-school children who meet certain eligibility rules. This program will be administered by the Ewa Community And School Joint Working Committee in cooperation with the Department of Education.

The program will consist of a normal full-day school schedule with fully qualified teachers assisted by teacher's aides. The objective is to help the eligible children get a good start during the summer toward their enrollment in the kindergarten in September.

Eligibility of a child will be determined by: The family's income, Number of children in family, Child's health needs, Education level of parents, Scholastic achievement record of other children in the family.

The number of classes at Ewa will be determined by how many children are considered to be eligible.
